DISTRICT COURT TERM TO BE SHORT

As no jury cases were ready for trial at the fall term of the District court, the petit jury was dismissed. The grand jury has been greatly handicapped on account of the bad condition of the roads, as many witnesses were unable to obey the summons.

On Wednesday afternoon, two felony bills were turned in to the district judge, and turned over to the district clerk. About thirty witnesses have been called before the grand jury. From all indications, the work of the grand jury will be ended by Friday noon.

Judge Woodward went to Coleman Tuesday afternoon, and returned here Wednesday. He left Thursday for Abilene, where he will hold court in the place of Judge Harry Tom King, who is disqualified for presiding over some cases in his court. Judge King will hear several cases here in Judge Woodward's stead.

FORD IS STOLEN FROM J. L. STROBLE

Some time Wednesday night, some one broke open J. L. Stroble's garage at his home on Ninth Street, and left with his Ford car. Officers believe that the thief went toward Crews, as fresh tracks in the mud that tallied with the tires on Mr. Stroble's car were found and followed for about seven miles. No tracks that look suspicious have been found in any other direction, and it is not thought that it would be possible to go very far in any direction because of the mud.

It is reported that a car was heard near Mr. Stroble's home about four o'clock Thursday morning, and it is presumed that this was about the time that the car was taken. This was the first car that had gone in that direction since the rain, and the tracks were easily distinguished.

The stolen car is practically new. It is not thought that much difficulty will be experienced in locating the Ford, due to the impassability of the roads. On several roads leading out from town no car has attempted a passage yet, and there are only one or two roads that the car could have taken.

SLIGHT CHANGES IN SANTA FE SCHEDULE

A change in the schedule on the Santa Fe railway is announced this week to become effective on Sunday, October 12, at 12:01 a. m. The trains at Ballinger will be changed slightly.

The morning train which reaches Ballinger from San Angelo at 9:42 at the present will be changed so as to reach here at 9:25. The noon train, which is supposed to arrive here at 11:55 at present, has been moved up a half hour, and beginning Sunday will arrive here at 12:25. The night train, westbound will come in at 11:51. The afternoon train going east will be the only one unaffected by the change, and will arrive here as now, at 4:13.

Train No. 77, which is the noon train here, will make main line connections at Temple, and will take up a sleeper at Brownwood

A. & S. TRAIN IS ONLY TWO DAYS LATE

The Abilene and Southern train reached Ballinger about six o'clock Wednesday evening. This was the first train on this road since Sunday.

Mail for the first part of the week had been held up, and such an amount reached here Wednesday that the postal clerks were forced to work until some time in the night in putting it up. The train made the run back as soon as they could exchange freight and passengers. Thursday's train was several hours late.

The Santa Fe train Thursday at last reports received here was three hours and thirty minutes late, and was said to be running in two sections. This was necessitated on account of the increased business on this branch of the road.

FORMER BAPTIST PREACHER LEADING IN AERIAL FLIGHT

OMAHA, Neb., Oct. 9.—Lient. Maynard, who was a Baptist minister before the war, and who is one of the contestants in the transcontinental aerial flight, lengthened his lead in the fifty-four hundred mile race today. He reached Omaha at twelve forty-seven.

Nine out of the sixty two who entered the race have been eliminated up to noon today. Three of the fliers were killed in crashes, and one was injured. Two dropped into Lake Erie, off Ashtabula Harbor, Ohio but were rescued by steamers.

COTTON AND GOOD ROADS

A plan to remedy these evils and also get the county out of the mud to aid transportation of our products will be decided upon. The subject of the state bond election involving bonds to the extent of seventy-five million dollars will be thoroughly gone over and explained.

It is necessary that every person interested in his home, his neighbor, his children and his civilization, must attend this meeting as the future of this community is at stake. If you sell anything or if you buy anything, or if you are a business man of any description, you can not afford to miss this meeting. 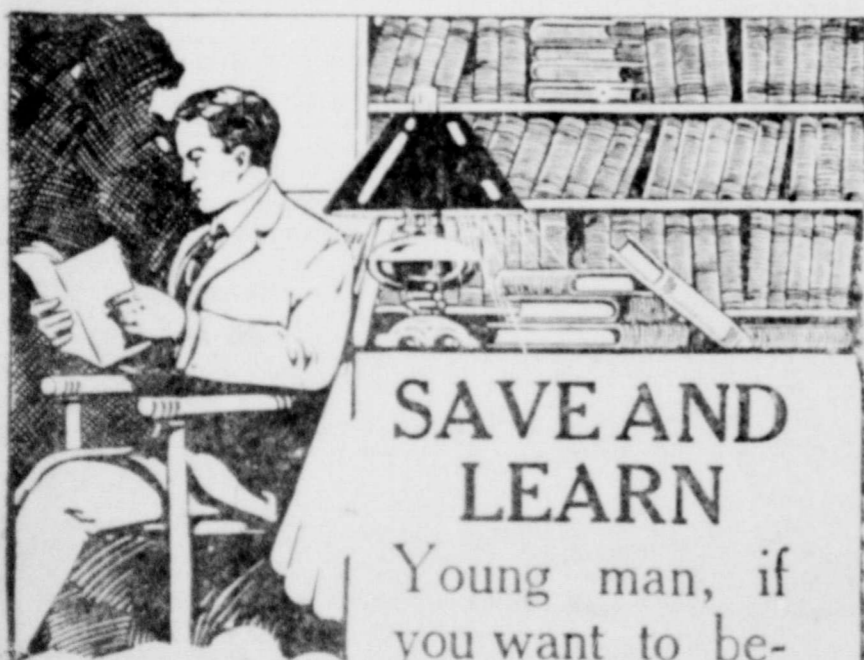

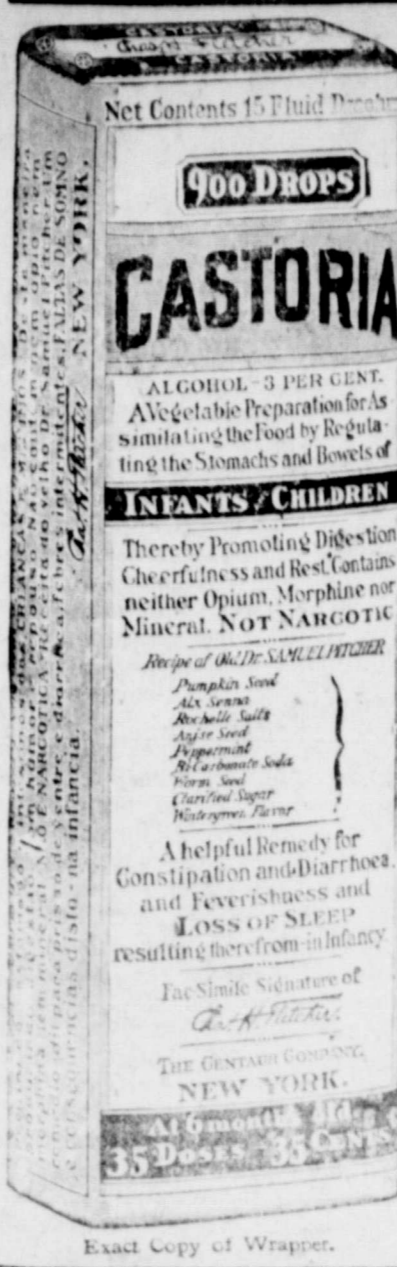

They complain of smoky rooms, hot rooms, stuffiness, and attribute the results to the heat and stuffiness and not to the real cause, as time goes on! The sufferers tend to avoid the occasions that cause them trouble and if they suffer much are likely to drift into the life of a recluse. Two of Dr. DesVaux' patients were only really well when living in the deserts of Africa. They are always improved by life in the country.

And, according to Dr. De Vaux, all this is due to very slight defects in the eyes. In some cases the orbits are not perfectly aligned, in others there is slight myopia (short sight), in more there is hypermetropia (long sight). Any of these defects can be remedied by proper glasses and in many cases if treated early enough can be cured.

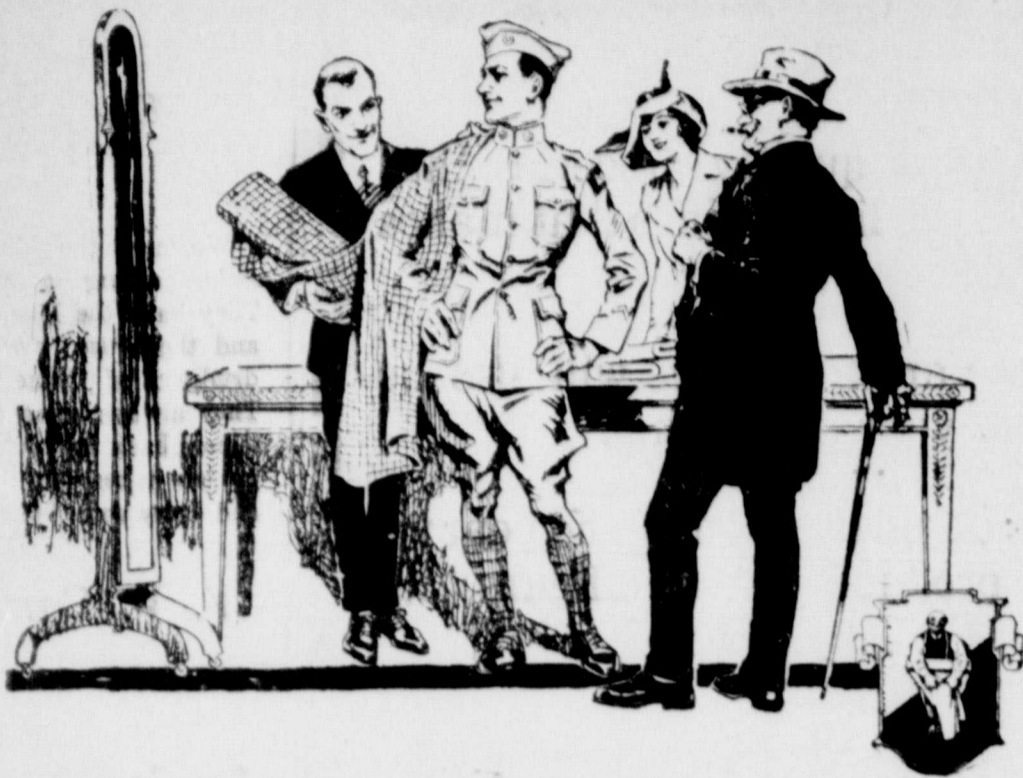
