## COLLECTIVE BARGAINING DEFEATED

Washington, Oct. 20.—The National Industrial conference was due to meet at two-thirty this afternoon at which time the vote on collective bargaining resolution would come up. The public labor groups are expected to vote for the resolution but the vote of the employers group against the resolution will, under the rules, prevent the adoption of the resolution, and collective bargaining will be defeated.

## SANTA FE WRECK CANCELS TRAINS

The Santa Fe west bound train, known as No. 77, and due here at 12:26 Sunday at noon, arrived about two o'clock Monday morning. The train due here about midnight Saturday night, did not come, the mail, passengers and express being transferred to the delayed train and the midnight train was cancelled.

This was the third lengthy delay the Santa Fe experienced with in three days, all due to derailments between Lometa and Coleman. The train Friday was eight or nine hours late, and again Saturday the west bound train arrived six hours late.

These delays were of course unavoidable, but constant delays from one to three hours every day could be avoided if the Santa Fe would increase its train service. The passenger, mail and express service is very unsatisfactory and the poor service is responsible for general complaint.

## MAY PROSECUTE FOR PEONAGE

That parties in East Texas who have restrained laborers from coming to this country to help gather the crops, and who have made threats against parties who have gone to that country to get help are in bad as is shown in a letter to Judge Jennings at Miles from the Department of Labor.

According to the Miles Messenger, farmers who went to East Texas after help were threatened and the matter was reported to the authorities at Austin. In giving an account of the trouble the Messenger says:

Certain of our cotton farmers who went to Eastern counties to secure cotton pickers experienced some difficulty in securing them and in some instances were refused the right to leave with the laborers, especially negroes, for the reason that the negroes were indebted to parties back there.

One of the farmers was denied the right and even threatened with arrest should he take any pickers from a certain county in East Texas, and some of the officers in that county may have some difficulty in justifying their actions to the Department of Labor.

A statement of the facts in the case was submitted to the Department of Labor at Austin by W. D. Jennings and the following excerpt from a letter from T. C. Jennings, Commissioner of the Department is given to show the gravity of the situation:

"This is a very grave matter, virtually affecting the constitutional rights of thousands of our citizens, and should have a very thorough investigation. I will therefore ask you to secure an affidavit from your party and the negro in question, and forward to this office at once."

"The facts as stated in your letter constitutes such a grave infraction of the laws, that I am constrained to believe that, perhaps you have been misinformed especially as to the action of the county attorney, who could not possibly be ignorant of the gravity of taking such a position."

The position taken by the county attorney was that the man employing labor must be responsible for the debts incurred by said labor before they were hired. He even threatened to send the sheriff to Miles to arrest the negro if the farmer that hired him did not put up the negro's debts.

It is our opinion that this county attorney "has got his feet wet" by meddling in other people's business.

## WILL MANAGE NEW WHOLESALE HOUSE

Oscar Williams will manage the Walker-Smith Grocery Co. house at Ranger. This company, with headquarters at Brownwood and with branch houses in many cities in Texas, has purchased the Ranger Wholesale Grocery Co. and will invest \$300,000 in that city.

The company will employ eight salesmen in the oil fields territory not yet touched by other wholesale grocery houses, and Oscar Williams who has been with the Abilene house will have charge of the Ranger house.

The friends of the Ballinger boy will be glad to note that he has been promoted. Williams was with Walker-Smith before going to war and help to clean up the Germans and after his return home was restored to duty.

## KICKS ABOUT A GOOD THING

"Where are the farmers going to get cotton seed to plant next year?" is a question I. O. Wooden put to The Ledger.

"The parties who sold the seed that were planted this year should be prosecuted," said Mr. Wooden, "because the seed were a mixed variety." And continuing, Mr. Wooden said, "there are at least a half dozen different kinds of cotton in every patch that I have examined."

Ike's business is buying and selling hides, but he has been picking cotton for past time, and according to a letter he recently addressed to his brother, he picked some for his negro renter. He may not be accepted as an authority on cotton or cotton seed, but he was raised on a farm down in good old Ellis county, where they raised some cotton some times.

Whether his kick is a well founded one or not, we do not feel that the farmers of this county have any grounds for complaint this year. They have raised more cotton than they can get picked and baled, and if they did this on a mixed variety of seed there is no telling what they would have done had the seed peddlers made good and sold only the one variety of pure bred seed as they represented.

Farm experts say the better the seed the better the yield, etc. and it is the high grade pure seed that Mr. Wooden wants to see planted here. He says that the seed grown here and which are now being ginned will heat and not be suitable for planting next year.

Seed peddlers are already in the market booking orders for next year, and the farmers have ample time to investigate, get the best seed and not wait until the last minute to do it.

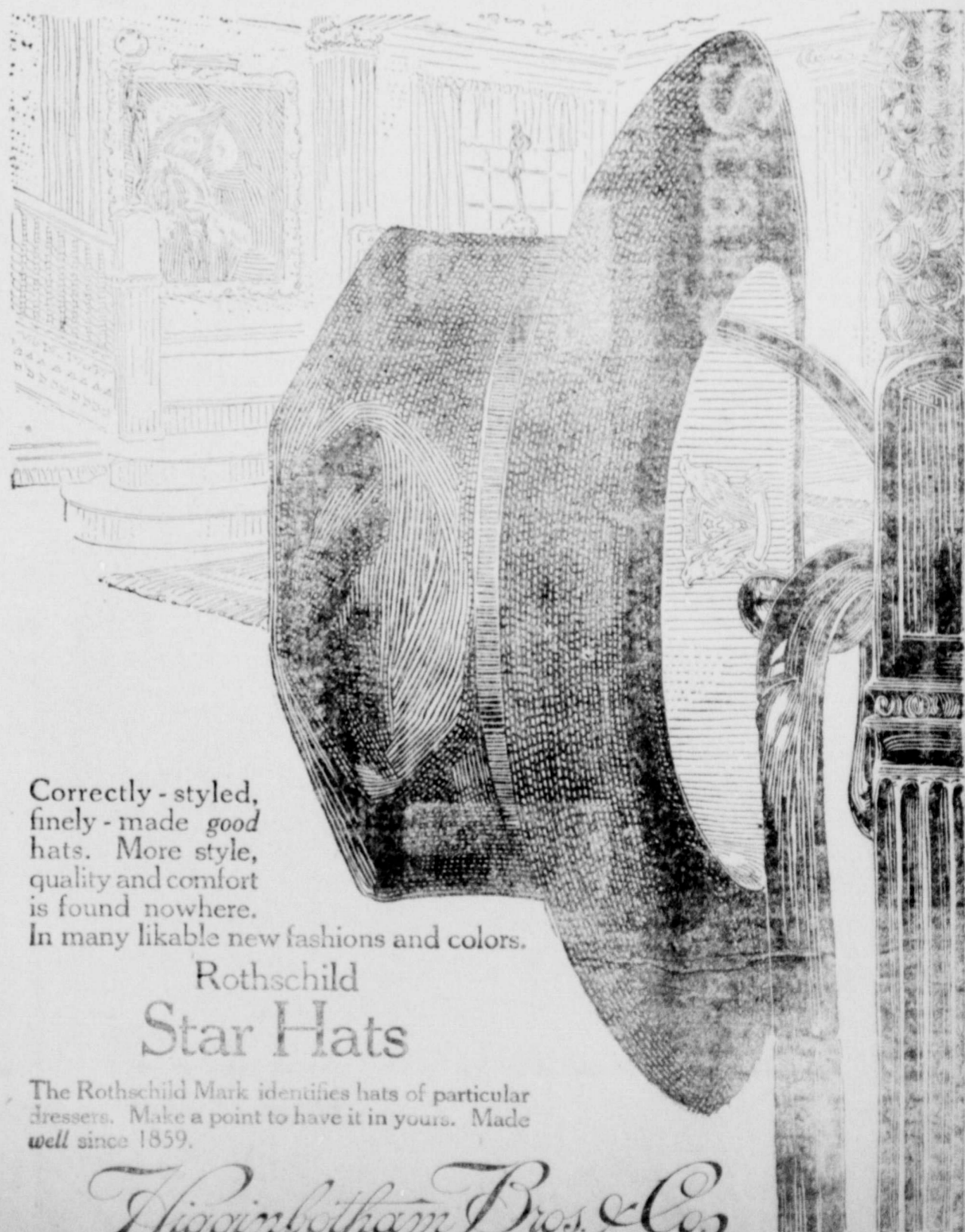

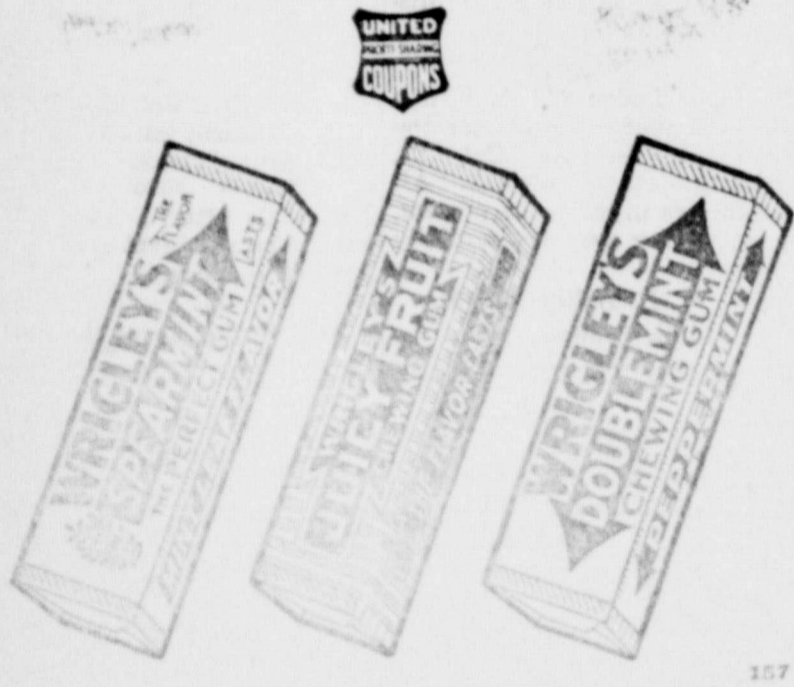

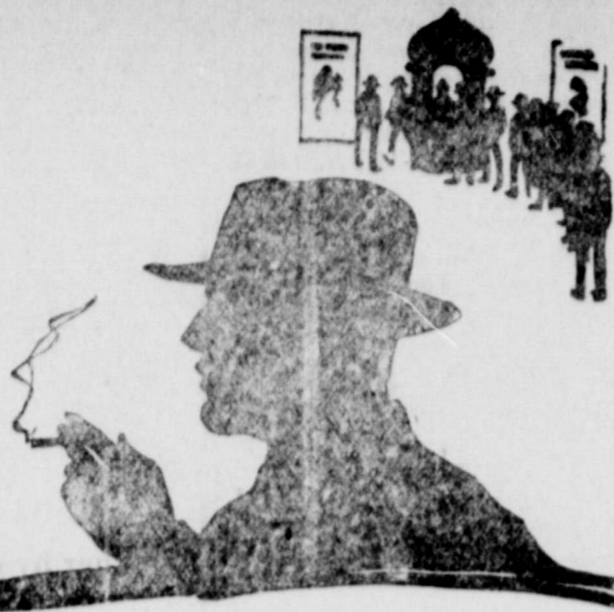

**\$15,000 AID GIVEN  
RUNNELS SCHOOLS**

County Supt. Bagg is in receipt of a letter from the Department of Education which says in part: "This is to advise that state aid under the two million dollar rural aid law, has been conditionally approved by the department of education for schools in your county, as per statement herewith:

By "conditionally" is meant that the final approval of these amounts of aid will depend upon how well the schools separately have met the requirements as stated in the rural school law, when the supervisor makes his visit to your schools. Please impress upon your trustees, the necessity of complete compliance with the legal requirements if they are to secure all or any of this conditional aid."

The list of schools to receive aid from the two million dollar rural school fund, and the amounts to be received by each school, as set by Mr. Bagg, is as follows:

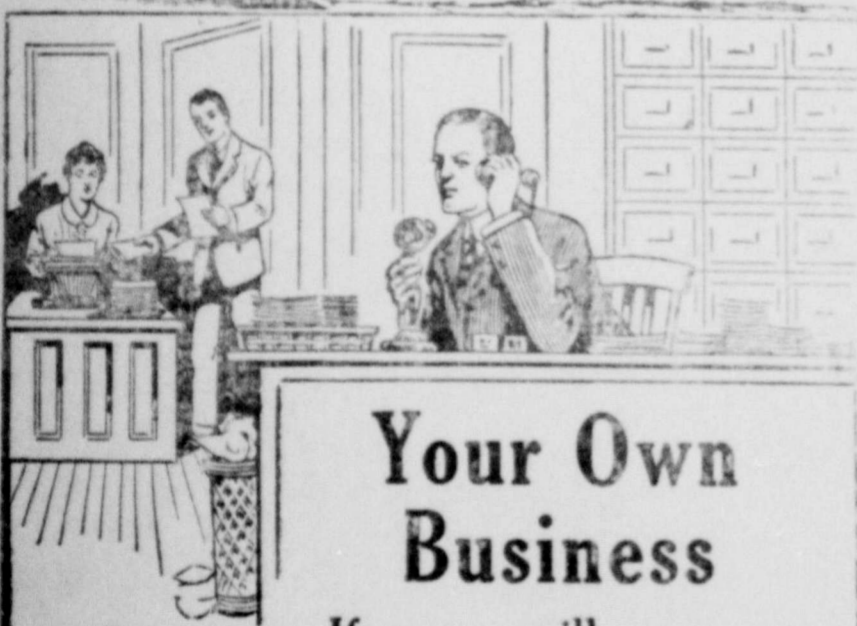

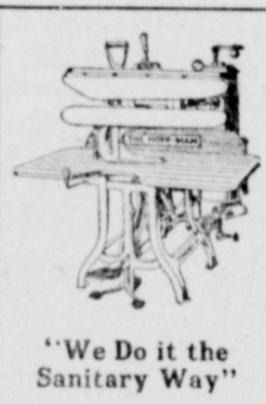
