## BIG BOOST FOR HIGH COST LIVING

Austin, Oct. 23.—Texas railroad officials, under federal administration, have received considerable salary increases, according to records in the office of the Texas railroad commission.

F. G. Pettibone of the Santa Fe had his salary raised from \$15,000 to \$30,000 a year. J. S. Pyatt of the Frisco went from \$4,600 to \$25,000. The M. K. and T. paid J. L. West \$7,500; he now receives \$10,000. J. T. Payne of the Texas and Pacific was raised from \$3,000 to \$7,500. W. A. Webb of the Katy went from \$5,200 to \$12,000. A number of other salary increases are listed.

The only reduction noted is that of W. S. Scott of the Southern Pacific, which was made \$25,000 instead of \$30,000.

They came here to pick cotton, or were at least claiming that as their mission here, when taken into custody and placed in jail. Both of the men deny their guilt and claim they will be able to prove their innocence.

## TO OFFER AIRSHIP SERVICE TO CITY

The Ledger is in receipt of a letter from the Aviation Transportation Co., Okmulgee, Oklahoma, seeking information with a view of sending one or more planes to Ballinger in November for the purpose of taking up passengers for short aerial flights.

The aviation company wants to know what the chances for securing a desirable landing field here are, and whether any other aviation company is operating planes for passengers in this city.

The company proposes to come here with several planes and remain as long as business is good, taking people for joy rides thru the air at so much per ride.

The opening of an air jitney station here will no doubt meet with considerable encouragement. Joy riders can leave their autos in the garage and spend the afternoon joy riding in an airship.

The aviation transportation company has been supplied with the information, and furnished with advertising rates for advertising the new line. Trips to nearby towns will be made at small cost, according to the letter from the aviation company, and physicians will be offered the services of an aviator in making hurried calls to rural districts or nearby towns.

## CHECK FORGERS GET PRISON TERMS

District court disposed of two forgery cases in short order Wednesday, when the men charged with passing bad checks plead guilty and begged the mercy of the court.

Clarence Kriedal, a young man about twenty years old, was arraigned for passing a forged check for a small amount. He plead guilty and was given a two year suspended sentence. If he lives a straight life for five years he will not have to go to the pen, but if charged with other violations during the five year period he will be taken into custody and sent to the pen.

T. B. Jones, who purchased clothing from a local dry goods store, and paid for same with a bad check, was given two years. Jones plead guilty and received a two year sentence, which he will have to serve. He might have received a suspended sentence, but he had a bad record, having just been sentenced for four years at Sweetwater, and must go from Ballinger to El Dorado, where he will also face trial for forgery.

The criminal docket was completed Wednesday afternoon when the court sentenced two men charged with stealing an auto to the pen for two and three years, respectively. Judge J. O. Woodward and District Attorney Early returned home Thursday morning.

## LEASES BUSINESS HOUSES HERE FOR FIVE YEAR PERIOD

Mr. Allen came here several days ago and secured an option on a number of houses, and Wednesday of this week the money changed hands and the leases were closed.

## AUTO THIEVES WILL GO TO PEN

When Dave Henry, one of the defendants in the auto burglary case, went on the stand and swore that he and Tom Robertson stole J. L. Stroble's auto, the state broke down the defense of Robertson, who was on trial, and after a brief caucus between Robertson and his attorneys, the defendant entered a plea of guilty and was given three years in the penitentiary.

Robertson was on trial as an accomplice in the auto theft case, he and Henry being jointly indicted by the grand jury. After introducing a number of witnesses, the state placed Henry on the stand and he detailed how he and Robertson visited the garage and drove the car away, and made Robertson a party to the theft from start to finish.

While the jury was out fixing the punishment for Robertson, another jury was selected and Henry arraigned for trial. He plead guilty and was given two years, drawing a year lighter sentence than his pal for furnishing testimony which convicted his pal.

## WILL VOTE ON TREATY TOMORROW

WASHINGTON, Oct. 23.—The debate on the Johnson amendment to the peace treaty equalizing the voting power of the United States and Great Britain in the league of nations, continued today, while the Democratic and Republican leaders worked hard to line up their followers for the vote on the reservations.

The vote on the Johnson amendment, which is expected to be defeated, will probably come up tomorrow. The senate will then take up the reservations, some of which will probably be adopted.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 23.— President Wilson today formed a new National Industrial Conference from the wreckage of the first one.

At the suggestion of Mr. Wilson, which was transmitted through Chairman Lane, the public delegates remained in session, seeking to frame an industrial code for relations between capital and labor.

The employes delegates were excused from further attendance upon the conference, and the labor delegates walked out yesterday, after having failed to agree upon the resolution for collective bargaining.

The representatives of the public have been instructed to make an exhaustive investigation into the industrial situation, and to submit its findings to the president for his approval.

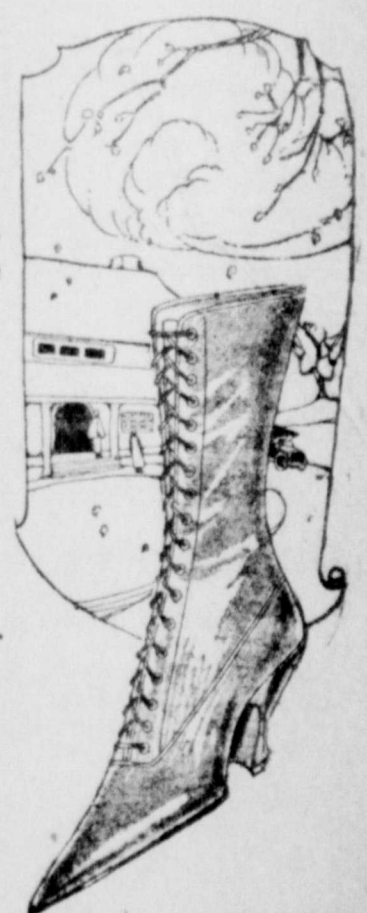

**IMPROPER INDICTMENTS**

It has been noted frequently during the past year or two that criminal cases have been taken off the docket, of the courts and dismissed upon the motion of the state's attorney, as soon as the cases come to trial, even though the persons against whom indictments had been returned had, in many cases, been held in jail for months. Due to a lack of knowledge of the facts, in such cases, the public too often is disposed to ensure the county and district attorneys for such dismissals, when a matter of actual fact the onus pro et contra belongs upon the shoulders of grand juries which return indictments without sufficient evidence to show the guilt of the indicted parties.

In this judicial district a man was indicted for burglary, with no evidence against him. He had broken out of the county jail after being arrested as a suspect, and the grand jury came to the conclusion that he surely was guilty, else he would not have tried to escape. There was no evidence on which the state could secure a conviction, and the case was promptly dismissed when district court met. In the meantime the suspected man had been held in jail for months, branded as a jailbird and deprived of several months income as a laborer. The state had been compelled to pay out a considerable sum for his board in jail, and for handling the case thru all the necessary channels from the grand jury room to the bench of the district court.

A better understanding of the duties of a grand juror would prevent many such cases occurring in Texas every year, and would save the state money, while preventing grave injustice to innocent men against whom no criminal charge could be sustained.—Brownwood Bulletin.

Circumstances some times alter cases even in court matters criminal. It is better that guilty go free than to punish the innocent, but in the case referred to by the Bulletin no innocent has been made to suffer. In truth and in fact the man set free had no kick coming.

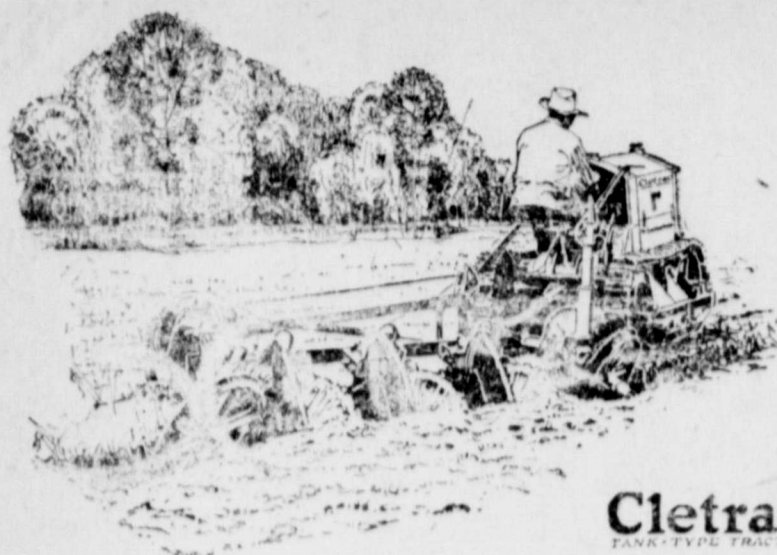

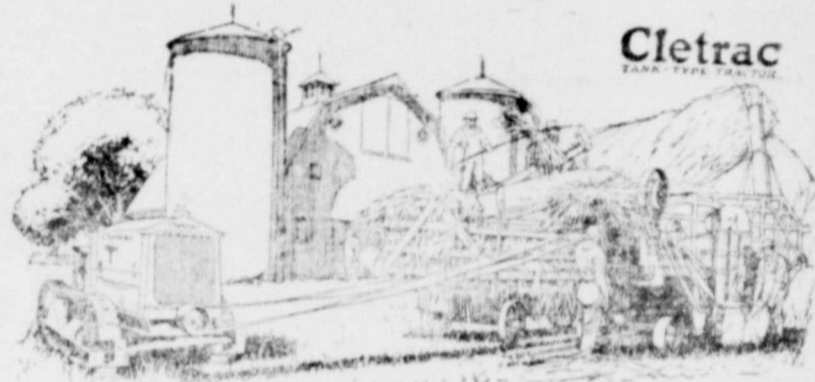

### INFLUENZA REPORT FROM DALLAS.

The Dallas News, of Sunday published the following casualty report: Two deaths were reported in Dallas last week from influenza, the third for this season in Dallas. Capt. Leslie C. Frank, director of Public Health, said the number of new cases reported is not alarming. Only thirty-three new cases were reported last week.

Capt. Frank recommended the use of anti-toxin to prevent diphtheria in the schools. He said this is a powerful preventive and is administered by physicians without serious results to persons of any age.

Other deaths reported during the week were as follows: From tuberculosis five, cancer two, malaria one, typhoid one, and syphilis one.

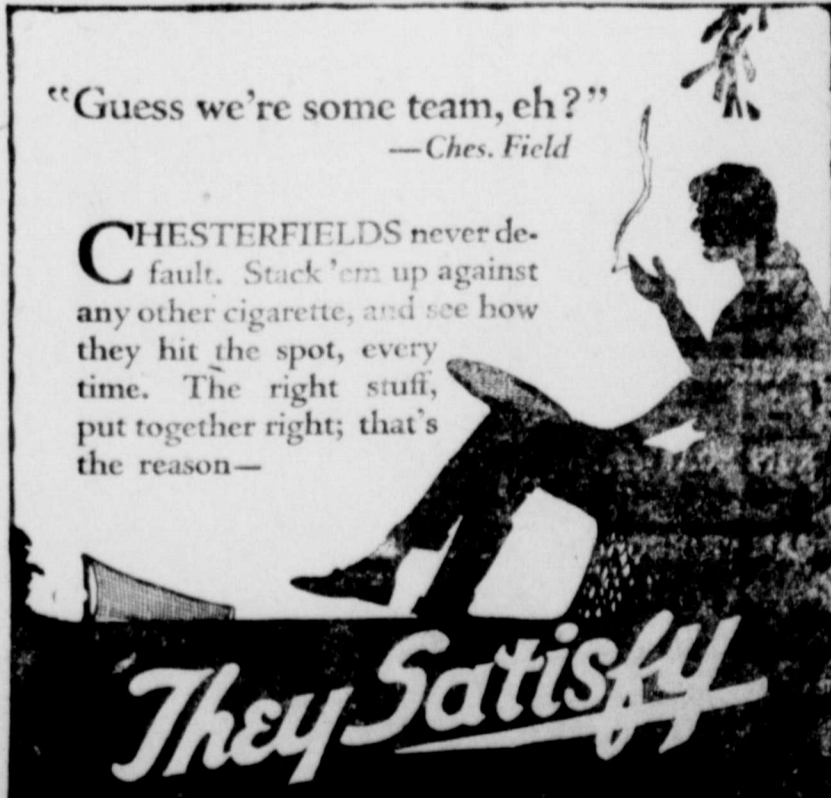

Waco. — Several speedway drivers are negotiating with Secretary S. N. Mayfield of the Texas Cotton Palace, Oct. 26 to Nov. 9, regarding purses, and entries are expected shortly. At present Fred Horey, holder of 12 world's records; Sigurd Hugdahl, Scandinavian speed star; Bob Cline of Ohio, and Floyd Willard, king of the light car division, are on the books. The field is expected to be the largest and classiest ever started on a half-mile oval in the southwest.

Sig. Hugdahl, the plucky little Scandinavian racer who upset all speed standards in 1918, and who smashed six dirt track records that have stood for years, is one of the entrants in the championship automobile races at the Texas Cotton Palace.

Hugdahl created a sensation during the 1918 campaign by his reckless and daring method of handling a high-powered racing creation. Last winter when Burney Oldfield, announced his retirement from the racing world, he declared that Hugdahl was the greatest race driver of all time, and that he was proud to pass on his honors to Hugdahl.

At present Hugdahl is the holder of six official world's records, including a mile on a half-mile track, which he established last September on the Lincoln, Neb., course. On that treacherous oval Hugdahl negotiated a mile in 1:01.60, and he covered two miles in 2:02.60. The old records for the mile and the two-mile marks were beaten by exactly four and six seconds, which demonstrated that Hugdahl has found a new method of covering space on a dirt track.

In the early race meets throughout the east and the south the little Scandinavian has established a record on practically every track on which he has appeared. He will drive his special, 300 horsepower creation in the auto contests at the Texas Cotton Palace and is of the opinion he will hang up maries here that will remain on the official slate for some time.

Waco.—Here is what the special War Exhibit for the 1919 Texas Cotton Palace exposition will include:

1 tank, 35 tons; 1 artillery tractor, ten tons with one of millimeter field gun.

1 Anti-aircraft gun on automobile truck mounted.

1 Artillery repair truck.

This equipment, as from information received from the Cotton Palace, will take four cars to transfer. This equipment will enable visitors to the Cotton Palace to see some of the Mobile field artillery which played such a prominent part in the winning of the war.

One officer and fifteen men will go with the equipment to demonstrate it.

Chicago, Oct. 23.—The Chicago Old Clothes society was organized by clerks in the city hall here today with "chapters" in each of the principal departments of the municipal government. The object is to glorify the wearing of patched, frayed or shiny suits, soft collars, resoled shoes and revived neck ties as a means of combatting the high cost of living.

The society is said to have had its inception in a news dispatch from London relating the perturbation of fashionable English tailors over the growth of "old clothes leagues" in the British metropolis.

## BELIEVE OIL YIELD FAILING

Oklahoma City, Oct. 23.—Oklahoma's oil fields are failing operators think.

Since 1917 production has shown a steady decline ranging from 5,000 to 7,000 barrels a day, and now, with the continuing decreases operators are confidently expecting price increases for the raw produce. A discovery of new fields is the only alternative, they say.

Thirty-one out of Oklahoma's seventy-seven counties, yield either oil or gas and comprise the richest deposits in America. Their contribution now is about 218,000 barrels daily, according to figures offered by the state auditor, who collects a 3 percent tax on gross production.

More than \$3,500,000 had been collected by the state this year at the beginning of the present quarterly period, and this did not include about one-third of the production which is from Indian lands.

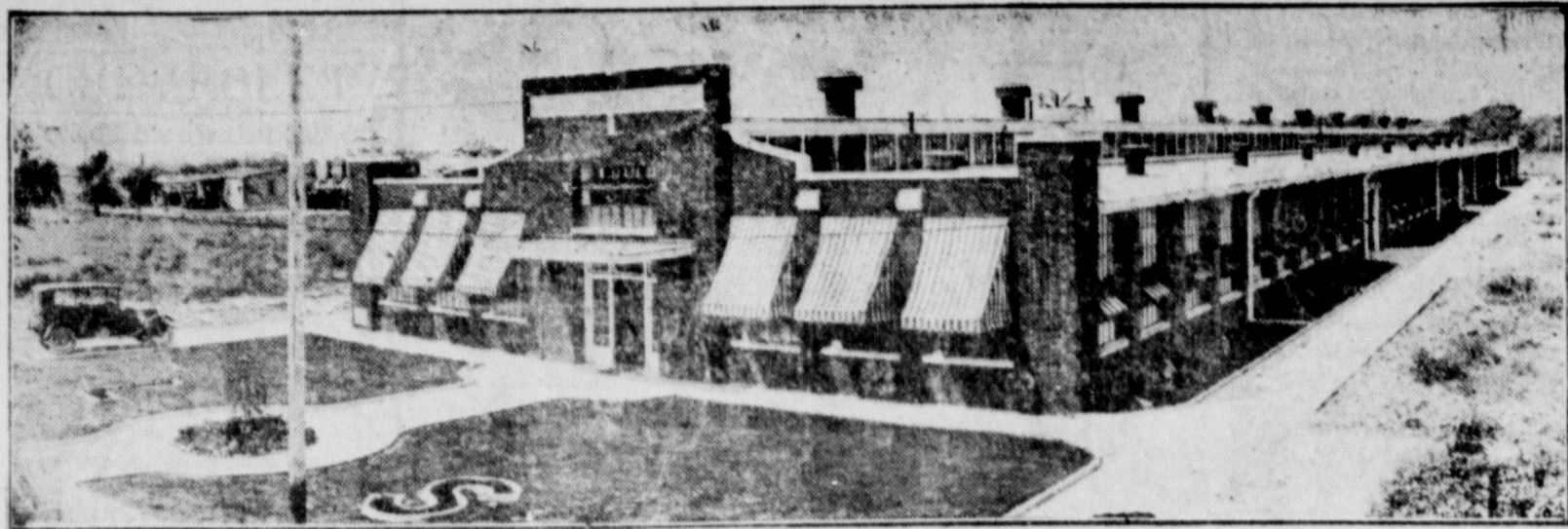

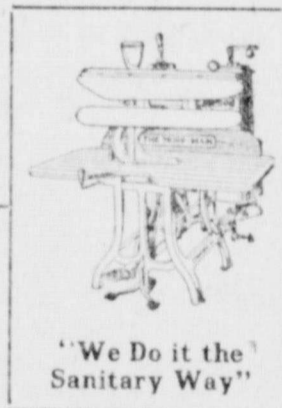
