#### BIG FIRE ON SANTA FE

(Brownwood Bulletin.)

A fire that cost several thousands of dollars and delayed train service west of Brownwood for several hours at about midnight Saturday, a mile west of the town of Bangs and ten miles west of Brownwood, when a derailment occurred on westbound extra frieght train No. 1951. Friction created from the derailed cars struck fire to gasoline from a tank car which was damaged in the derailment and in a flash there was a great fire in progress that for a time threatened destruction of the entire train.

Two gasoline cars in the train exploded with terrific force, and two others which were damaged in the derailment spilled their contents in the middle of the wreck, and the entire mass made a flame that could be seen for miles. One refrigerator ear, a car of lumber and a car of lignite were also burned. Had the wreck occurred in the town of Bangs, the explosion of the burning gasoline cars would probably have wreeked the town. No one was inured and the wreckage was cleared at 7:00 o'clock Sunday even-
