## BROTHERHOODS DENY SECRET STRIKE PLANS

CLEVELAND, Nov. 26.—Railroad brotherhood officials here today, denied emphatically that they were holding secret sessions for the purpose of considering a nation-wide strike. It has been reported that the brotherhoods were secretly planning to tie up all railroads in the United States.

## CAPT. D'ANNUNZIO PLANS NEW COUP

ROME, Nov. 26.—D'Annunzio is planning another coup, and this time it will be against Triest, according to a warning sent to the Italian government by the newspaper *Aventi*. The Italian poet sent emissaries to Triest to ascertain the feeling of the populace.

## ANGELES IS SHOT BEFORE SUNRISE

EL PASO, Nov. 26.—General Angeles, intellectual head of the Villista movement, was executed by a Federal firing squad in Chihuahua City this morning, according to unconfirmed telegraphic reports received here today.

General Angeles was tried and found guilty of treason by a Mexican court martial and sentenced to death. An appeal to the Mexican supreme court had been planned, but according to the report the revolutionary general was put to death before any action in the appeal could be had.

Angeles was known to be friendly to the United States, and this probably prompted speedy carrying out of the court martial's verdict.

## GARFIELD WARNS MINERS AND OPERATORS TO AGREE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—Fuel Administrator Garfield will deliver an ultimatum warning the coal miners and coal mine operators that their differences must be settled without further delay.

Mr. Garfield will speak for the government in the ultimatum and the officials hope that the statement will end the strike. The text of the ultimatum had not been made public and will not be until it is delivered to the miners and operators, but it comes following a cabinet meeting.

Mr. Garfield stated as he came from the cabinet meeting that the statement prepared and to be delivered to the strikers and operators was "final."


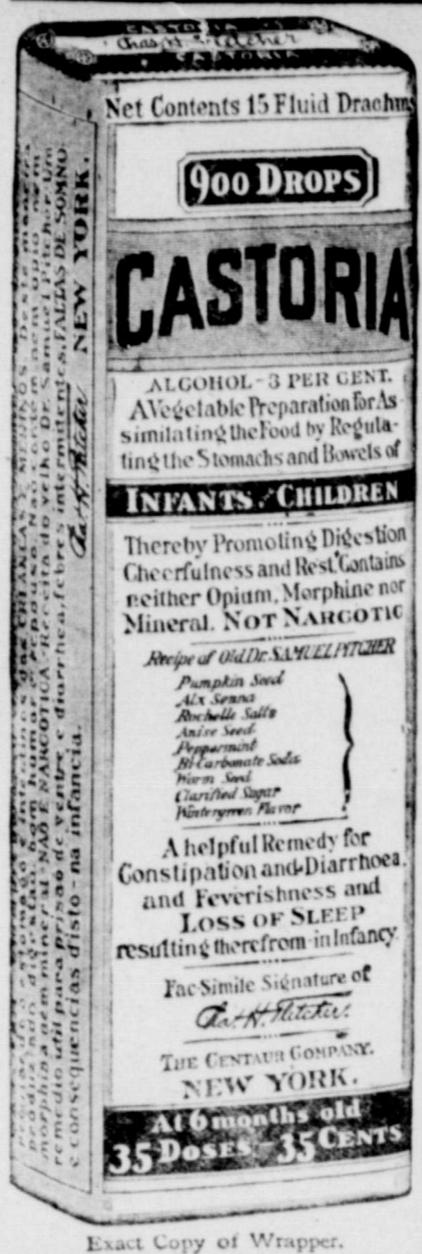
