LITTLE TOWN OF **MERCURY** DESTROYED

(Brownwood Bulletin)

Fire Saturday night in the business part of the town of Mer cury, twenty-five miles south of Brownwood, almost completely wiped out the business of the town causing a loss of at least \$100.000, which is covered by not more than \$32,000 insurance. Due to a lack of fire fighting equipment, the fire could not be controlled and helpless citizens were compelled to stand by and watch the flames destroy the thousand, of dollars' worth of merchandise in the stores and other mercantile establish-

The blaze was caused by a defective flue in the State Bank building. The citizens of the town quickly gathered and made an effort to fight the flames, and succeeded in preventing the destruction of the postoffice building. This, with a blacksmith shop, barber shop, and garage were the only buildings left standing after the fire had burned itself out.
