TEXAS U TO PLAY OKLA. A. & M. AT FAIR

AUSTIN, Dec. 20 .- It was stated today by Captain Bellmont. director of athletics of the University of Texas, that the action of the University of Oklahoma in joining the Missouri Valley Conference that institution automatically cancelled its annual contest with the University of Texas at the Dallas State Fair. The rules of the Missouri Valley Conference forbid any conference team from playing on any college gridiron other than that of the two institu tions involved in the contest.

It was understod that the Oklahoma and Texas teams were to play for five years in Dallas, beginning with the 1919 game. The Oklahoma A. & M. will be scheduled by the University of Texas to take the place of the University of Oklahoma, Captain Beilmont said today. This game will be played under the auspices of the State Fair at Dallas, Oct. 16






