WASHINGTON .- How Nazi experimenters froze concentration camp immates to death seeking methods to save their airmen from the same fate were revealed in German docu-ments just released by the war de-partment.



Material Available For New Grain Bins

Inexpensive Materials **Proving Satisfactory**

Despite material shortages, con-struction difficulties are minimized in a new type grain storage bin de-veloped by the Commodity Credit corporation, USDA. The bin uses

inexpensive materials which are not crucially scarce and can be erected by unskilled workers in about 30 man-hours.

The bin is demountable and portable and may be stored when not in use. The capacity of the bin is 1,300 bushels.

This bin is constructed almost entrely of asphalt roll roofing. For the floor, asphalt roll roofing, For the floor, asphalt roll roofing is alid directly on the ground. For the sidewalls, it is reinforced with woven wire. For the roof, it is supported by the bulk of grain inside. 


