## PLANT IS BLOCKED

In view of the fact that the same company which supplies San Angelo with light and water also supplies Ballinger with light and power, the following from the San Angelo Standard will be of interest to the citizens of this city:

The attorney general's depart ment at Austin has failed to ap prove San Angelo's \$500,000 bond issue, which was voted on March 29, 1919, for the purpose of purchasing the local plant of the San Angelo, Water, Light & Power Co., or building a municipal system. This important announcement was made Thursday morning by city

Commenting on the attorney general's action, Mayor R. H. Henderson stated that in all probabi ity the city commission will wait short time for developments at the test well which is being sunk north of San Angelo to determine whether or not a subterranean flow existed sufficient to suppl the city water; then, within thre or four weeks, some definite pro osition will likely be submitted

City Attorney Ames W. Love land issued the following state ment upon the legal phase of the action taken upon the bonds:

"After having had the record of the water and light bonds for almost three months the attorne; general's department acting thru Assistant Attorney General W. P Dumas, notified the city on February 9. that the department would not approve the bonds.

"The grounds of disapproval be ing that the proposition of build ng or buying a water works was combined with the one for buyin or building an electric light plant The supposition being that some voters might have favored the one and not the other, and were not given an opportunity to express

The records of the attorney gen eral's department show that in several instances bonds like the present have been approved. The appellate courts of Texas have never passed upon this proposit on, but in one case similar bond that were attacked upon several grounds were held good though this exact point does not seem

The new company paid a 2 per cent dividend when five months old, a 10 per cent divident a month later and a 68 per cent dividend when nine months old. Last year Couzens got \$5,000,000 in

cash dividends and \$5,200,000 in stock dividend.

Couzens did not simply pay back to his sister the \$100 she loaned him, but he paid her dividends of \$97,000 on that \$100,

and his employer has made \$175,000 on his investment.

Some will say that good luck made Couzens rich. But good luck had little to do with it. Good judgment energy, character and courage enabled him to take advantage of an opportunity which a man with these qualities in lesser degree would have overlooked. 




