BROWNWOOD ENLARGES HER PRISON HOUSE.

Four new cells are being built in the Brown county jail and when completed the jail will be just about as near safe and tight against "saw-outs" as it is possible to make it. Of course, it is a matter of some difficulty to make a jail that is absolutely escape-proof. The building of the new cells brings to mind the fact that more than a year ago a notorious prisoner was confined in the jail and effected his escape overnight, the saws with which he sawed his way to liberty being concealed under a plaster which the man wore between his shoulders, as if suffering from some kind of ailment. The prisoner left the plaster and some writing to show how he had foiled the officials, which showed that he was not shrewd else his secret would have remained with him.

The matter of concealing saws and other instruments of escape is now very difficult as the rule is to furnish the prisoner with new clothes out and out, taking no chances that there might be saws or other contrivances in his old clothes.—Brownwood Bulletin.

NIGHTWATCHMAN SHOT IN BANDIT BATTLE

PLANO, Tex., Feb. 28.—G. W. Rye, night watchman, was killed at five o'clock this morning in a pistol battle with bandits who robbed the Plano National Bank. Rye lived only fifteen minutes after being shot by the escaping robbers. He fired a volley of shot, at the robbers, but it is not known whether any of them were wounded or not, and they all made their escape.

The bandits are believed to have fled in a Dallas automobile. The bank's loss has not been determined.

When Nightwatchman Rye discovered the highwaymen leaving the bank he attacked them single handed, firing at close range, but the bandits returned the fire, and shot him down.

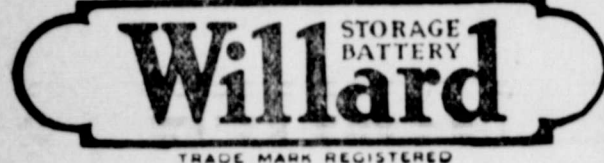

RECOVERS \$472 IN STOLEN GOODS

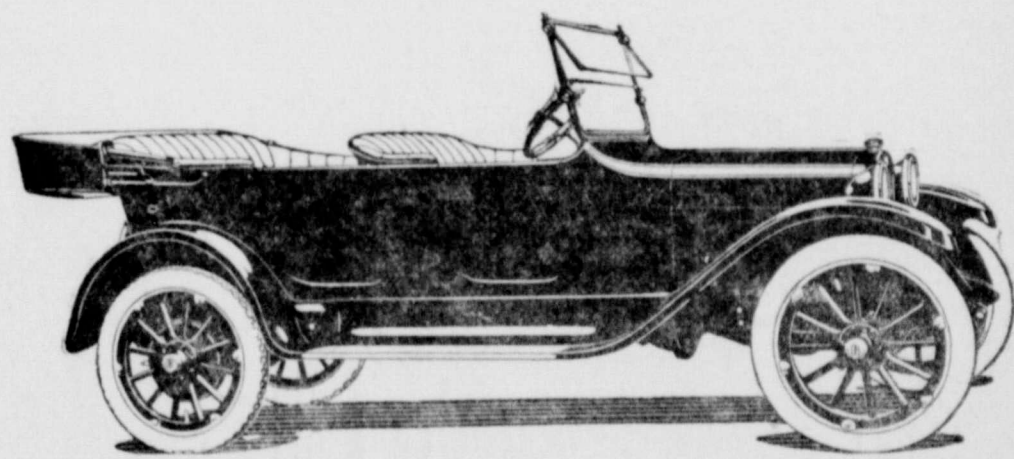

DIPHTHERIA KILLS THIS ONE YEAR OLD CHILD

Rex Alexander Langford, age two years, five months and twenty-one days, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Langford, died at the home of the family on Seventh street, at one o'clock Friday morning from diphtheria. The child was sick only a few days.

Friday afternoon at four o'clock the funeral was conducted from the residence by Dr. Alvin Swindell, and the remains were laid to rest in Evergreen cemetery.

Mr. and Mrs. Langford moved here from Stephens county a few months ago and purchased a home on Seventh street. Since coming here they have made friends who will sympathize with them in the loss of their baby.

The State of Texas,

You are hereby commanded to summon W. T. Sanders by making publication of this citation once each week for four successive weeks previous to the return day hereof, in some newspaper published in your county, if there be a newspaper published therein, but if not then in the nearest county where a newspaper is published, to appear at the next regular term of District Court of Rannels County, to be holden at the Court House thereof in Ballinger, Texas, on the second Monday in March, 1920, same being the 8th day of March, 1920, then and there to answer a petition filed in said court on the 20th day of Sept. 1919, in a suit numbered on the docket of said Court No. 1960, wherein C. R. Stephens is plaintiff and W. T. Sanders is defendant, the nature of the plaintiffs demands being as follows, to-wit:—

Plaintiff asks judgment on eight certain promissory notes dated November 1st, 1915, each for the sum of \$150.00, one of which bears a credit of \$25.00 paid, together with all interest thereon since November 1st, 1917, said notes each bearing interest from date thereof at the rate of 8 percent per annum, interest payable annually as it accrues, both principal and interest payable at Winters, Texas, each of said notes containing the provision that if same be not paid at maturity, or if suit be brought thereon, that 10 percent of the amount then due should be added thereto as attorney's fees, said notes maturing on November 1st, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922, and 1923, respectively, and each providing that failure to pay same when due, would, at the option of the holder of same, mature all of said notes, and amongst other things plaintiff alleges that said notes were all originally executed and delivered by W. T. Sanders and T. W. Sanders to A. B. Nichols in part payment for, and their payment secured by a vendor's lien retained upon, the following described land in Taylor County, Texas, viz.: The S. E. one-eighth of Survey No. 120, Block 64, Abstract No. 701, containing 80 acres of land, more or less, described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at the S. E. corner of

survey No. 120, being the N. E. corner of survey No. 119, in said block 64—Thence west 950 varas, Thence north 475 varas, Thence south 950 varas, Thence east 475 varas to the place of beginning, and being more fully described in a deed recorded in Vol. 71, at page 210 of the Deed Records of Taylor County, Texas.

Plaintiff further alleges that on August 21st 1916, by deed of that date recorded in the Deed Records of Taylor County, in Vol. 73 at page 560, the defendant purchased said land from T. W. Sanders and assumed the payment of said notes; that thereafter the said A. B. Nichols sold, transferred and delivered said notes, together with the lien securing their payment to the Ballinger Loan Company, a corporation; and that said Ballinger Loan Company sold, transferred and delivered said notes, together with said lien securing their payment to the plaintiff herein, the present legal and equitable owner and holder thereof; that the first four of said notes are long since past due and unpaid, and all interest on all of said notes from and since November 1st, 1917, is past due and unpaid; that the defendant has failed and refused and still fails and refuses, to pay same or any part thereof and that plaintiff has elected to declare all of said notes due and payable according to their terms, including 10 percent attorney's fees. Wherefore, plaintiff asks judgment for his debts foreclosure of his lien on said property, for its sale under order of sale as provided by law, for his writ of possession thereto, for costs of suit and for general relief.

Herein fail not, but have before said court on the first day of the next term thereof, this writ, with your return thereon, showing how you have executed the same.
