the stand of grass. But even with a high per cent of clover the in-

rious tests studied, 37 farmers who applied an average of 133 pounds of
ammonium nitrate ammonium nitrate on meadows got
an averaga increase of 1,700 pounds of hay per acre. The fall applications made a difference of 1,500 pounds of hay per
acre, and spring applications inacre, and spring applications in-
creased yields on an average of 1,790 pounds of hay per acre.
