Draft May Hit Army Overseas

Department Is Uneasy About Its Ability to Meet Future Commitments.

WASHINGTON. — Uncertainty over the final fate of selective service is stirring uneasy speculation in the war department over its ability to meet future commitments overseas, says the Associated

Exemptions of teen-agers in the current stop-gap six weeks extension may cost the army more than 100,000 replacements, responsible officials estimate, at a time when release of veterans is proceeding at an undiminished rate.
