## BRITISH SOLDIERS IN MEXICO

CALGARY, Alberta, Canada, July 28.—General Critchley, well known in Canadian military circles, has recruited and taken into Mexico three battalions of British and Canadian war veterans and settled them on a million acre estate organized on a British military basis.

The battalions include four fully equipped air squadrons. Gen. Critchley was assisted in commanding the expedition by his brother. The expense of carrying out the project was provided by the British government which advanced three hundred thousand pounds sterling.

### TAKE "T. B." SURVEY IN EL PASO LATELY

AUSTIN, July 28.—A survey of the indigent migratory consumptives in El Paso is being conducted by George F. Granger, field secretary of the Texas Public Health Association, as an aid in solving the problem of penniless wanderers in Texas. He is making an extensive study of the records of the deaths, reported cases of tuberculosis, medical cases at the tubercular clinics and at the county hospital. He is also personally interviewing a large number of tubercular people in the city in order to obtain records of the wanderings of these indigents, their financial condition, and other data which will help in solving the problem of how to care for the thousands of penniless health seekers over the state.

## SEARCH FOR LEROY CONTINUES

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., July 28.—Two men by the name of Fernandez here have been questioned by Lieut. J. P. Smith, of the Detroit police force, in connection with the "trunk mystery," and released after proving they knew nothing about the murder. The police lieutenant also talked to Allan Tatum, whose statements gave the first clue to the mystery. Tatum expressed a willingness to accompany the officers to New York or Detroit for a further investigation.

LAWRENCE, Kansas, July 28.—A telegram was received here today by Sheriff Woodward from the Detroit police ordering the sheriff to hold for further investigation the man arrested yesterday answering the description of Eugene Leroy, wanted in connection with the murder and shipping of a female victim's remains in a trunk from Detroit to New York.

NEW YORK, July 23.—Mrs. Leo Trumbull, wife of the Detroit patrolman who failed to identify Roy Millen of Chicago, as Eugene Leroy of Detroit, author of the mysterious trunk murder, has identified the body of the young woman being held in the Bellevue morgue here, and which was found in a trunk in an express company warehouse, as Mrs. Eugene Leroy.

DETROIT, Mich., July 28.—Little progress toward running down the slayer of Mrs. Eugene Leroy, whose mutilated body was shipped in a trunk from Detroit to New York was made today, police officials admitted.

Search for Leroy, husband of the slain woman and a second trunk believed to contain the vital organs taken from the body, was continued in every part of the county.

The hunt for Leroy extended to the Mexican border today on strength of information obtained in New York by a Detroit police detective. Departments in cities along the Rio Grande were asked to be especially vigilant.

A New York expressman who expressed a trunk to Leroy at the Detroit Y. M. C. A. informed the Detroit detective that Leroy had been a friend of a Mexican named Jose Yenez, who came from Galveston, Texas. The authorities have learned Yenez left Detroit for Texas June 10, the day the body of Mrs. Leroy was shipped to New York. The expressman is quoted as saying he learned from Yenez that Leroy had virtually good family connections in Mexico and that either his father or brother was in the Mexican consular service. According to the expressman, Leroy also went by the name of "O. J. Woods," and "O. J. Fernandez." Leroy is said to speak Spanish and Yiddish fluently.

## RURAL SCHOOLS GET NEW HOME MINERS STRIKE CAUSE FAMINE

County Superintendent Bugg is about the busiest man in Rannels county, and he is jubilant over the splendid progress being made in the educational development of this county, and the interest being manifested by the patrons of the schools.

Mr. Bugg stopped long enough Wednesday when a Ledger reporter "ran into" him, to give us a little inside information as to just what was going on in rural school work in this county.

We first asked the county superintendent how many school children there are in the county, as we wanted to know how much money the schools of this county would get from the state. "All told we have about 4850," said Mr. Bugg. The state will pay into the school fund of the county \$14.50 for each child within the scholastic age, which will bring to the county \$70,325.00 for our schools. In addition to this every school in the county will share in the four million dollar appropriation.

Prof. Bugg reports that the teachers will receive living salaries for the coming term. Most of the principals will receive \$150 per month, and other teachers in proportion.

Many schools in the county are adding important improvements to their buildings. The new Blanton school which was recently created by the consolidation of the New Home and Jamison schools, seven miles North of Ballinger on the Crews road, has let the contract for a \$5,000 building. Carter & Guin are the contractors.

The Dietz school further up the Crews road has let the contract also for a \$5,000 school building, the building being practically on the same plan as the Blanton school.

The Franklin school five miles Northwest of Hatchel is adding a new room and making other improvements.

The Puckett school recently voted bonds and levied a special tax for building a new school building, which will be modern in all respects.

The Benoit and Norwood schools have unanimously consolidated and will issue bonds for the building of a consolidated school at Benoit.

Spring Hill will have a new two room school house near the Dean farm, and only about four miles from Ballinger.

At the present rate of progress Rannels county will soon stand at the top of the column and people will be attracted here by the good rural schools. The rural schools will also be made the community centers, where the people can hold their meetings of public interest.

FORT SMITH, Ark., July 28.—More than eleven hundred coal miners are idle as the result of a strike in the Fort Smith district.

ST. LOUIS, July 28.—The industries of St. Louis today face a coal famine as the result of the miners' strike in the Fort Smith district, from which St. Louis gets the bulk of her coal.

## MAKING FIGHT ON N. Y. GOV.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., July 28.—Colonel William Hayward, permanent chairman of an unofficial Republican state convention, today denounced the Democratic administration of Governor Smith, and called upon his party colleagues to emulate the example of the national Republican convention at Chicago, and adopt a platform which "will command the confidence of the voters and insure a Republican victory at the polls this fall."

## ANTI-SUFF FIGHT ON IN N. CAROLINA

RALEIGH, N. C., July 28.—The first gun in the anti-suffrage campaign in North Carolina will be fired here next Tuesday by speakers under the auspices of the Southern Rejection League.

A special session of the state legislature is scheduled to be held within the next two weeks, when the question of ratification of the Federal suffrage amendment will come up. The pro-suffrage organization has been active for some time here.

## BRITISH RECEIVE LINCOLN STATUE

LONDON, July 28.—Elihu Root, former American secretary of state, formally presented to the British people today the St. Gaudens statue of Lincoln in Channing Square, as a gift from the United States.

David Lloyd George made the speech of acceptance. The event was widely heralded by the British press as further cementing the Anglo-American friendship.

## VILLA WILL SURRENDER; AMERICAN IS RELEASED

### PRIMARY VOTE FALLING SHORT

DALLAS, July 28.—As scattering returns continue to drift into the offices of the Texas Election Bureau, it becomes more evident that the primary vote is going to fall short of the vote first predicted. It will crowd the total vote to exceed the 450,000 mark.

Bailey maintains his lead of about 5,000 votes over Neff, with the vote varying slightly as returns come in. At midnight last night Bailey's lead amounted to 5,119, while at noon today he had a lead of 5,505.

Returns have been received from 245 counties, and of this number seventy-nine counties are complete. Bailey has to his credit 137,782; Neff 132,277; Thomas 91,568.

EAGLE PASS, Texas, July 28.

Francisco Villa, for many years the terror of Mexico, and Texas border towns, has surrendered unconditionally after an all night conference with General Martinez, according to advices received at the Mexican consulate here. The message said that the bandit leader will return to private life. There is much rejoicing throughout Mexico.

The message giving the account of the surrender of Villa also said that Carl Haeglen, the American whom Villa was holding for a ransom had been released and returned to safety.

MEXICO CITY, July 28.—It was announced at President de la Huerta's office that Pancho Villa will probably arrive in Mexico City within three days to place himself at the disposal of the provisional Mexican president, and accept such punishment as the president might see fit to mete out to him.

WASHINGTON, July 28.—

Representations described at the state department today as being of an "urgent nature" have been made to the Mexican government as the result of the kidnapping of Carl Haeglen, an American citizen by Pancho Villa, several days ago.

The Mexican authorities have been asked to take all steps possible to effect the release of the American who Villa is holding for a ransom.

H. F. Demmer and family are at home from a month's stay at Christoval, where they enjoyed camp life, and where Mr. Demmer recuperated and regained his health which had become somewhat impaired on account of hard work.

## RAT KILLERS AT WORK IN S. C.

CHARLESTON, S. C., July 28.—Five expert rat catchers from New Orleans are busy here in an effort to drive to the trap five thousand rodents in a survey being made along the water front by the United States Public Health Service. This step is being taken to prevent the spread of bubonic plague. Many rats have been killed but no infected rodents have been found among those killed.

Charleston hopes to send representatives to the Five States Conference at Galveston in August to discuss the plague prevention work.

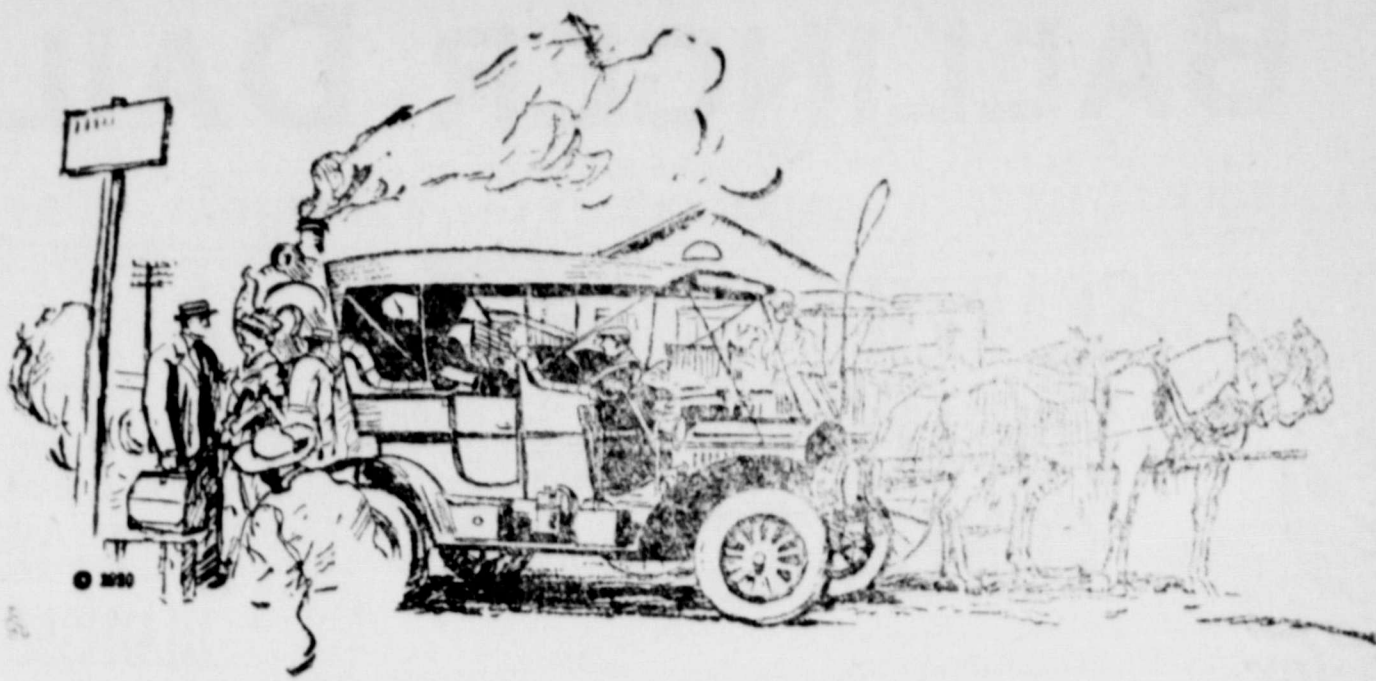

**NEWS FROM COKE COUNTY CAPITOL**

ROBERT LEE, Tex., July 28.—Robert Lee is very quiet since the election Saturday. The usual bronc riding took place Saturday, and every rider was thrown except Rial Denman, who is among the best West Texas riders.

The protracted meeting at the Methodist church will continue to go on through next week. Rev. J. W. Holt is doing the preaching.

The Democratic nominees for Coke county office, who were elected last Saturday are: B. J. Stockton, County Jailor; W. B. Hamilton, Sheriff and Tax Collector; Mrs. J. T. Daniels, County Treasurer; W. J. Varadero, W. R. Pruitt, F. M. Fritchard, commissioners. A second primary will be necessary to determine who is the Assessor, and for Commissioner of Precinct No. 4. E. T. Sparks was elected County Weigher of Precinct No. 1. G. S. Arnold was elected County Attorney. A. J. Taylor, will be Justice of the Peace, Precinct No. 1; and E. W. Egan, Constable of this precinct. Geo. Cowan, publisher of the Robert Lee Observer, was unanimously elected Chairman of the Democratic Executive Committee. W. H. Maxwell was elected County Clerk.

Mr. and Mrs. Gus Boykin was buried Friday morning in the Paint Creek cemetery. The little baby lived only one day.

Two burials in the Robert Lee cemetery took place Wednesday of last week. Foy Burrough's body, which was sent from France was buried Wednesday morning, and the body of B. F. Tubb, a pioneer Coke county citizen, was buried in the afternoon. The body of Foy Burroughs was buried with military honors—the American Legion of San Angelo and all of the ex-soldiers of Coke county assisted.

Several good rains fell around Robert Lee last week, and crops here are in a splendid condition. However, it will require showers every few days to counteract the effect of the hot winds, which are drying out the ground fast.

**TEXAS CAVALRYMEN NOW CITY'S FINEST**

GALVESTON, July 28.—Galveston's new police force of suburbanized Texas cavalrymen is rapidly developing the esprit de corps of a metropolitan organization. Shuttled over on a moment's notice into the job of policing a city of 50,000 population—a port where ships and sailors from the four corners of the earth foregather—the troopers methodically went to work to create an efficient, snappy, training, law enforcement machine.

Colonel A. W. Bloor, provost marshal, an A. E. F.'er who commanded the 142 regiment of the Thirty-sixth division is the new "chief."

Immediately upon receipt of orders from Brigadier General J. C. Walters, commanding the Texas forces here, Col. Bloor set out making a canvass of the material in his command. Before nightfall the "city's finest" was functioning in a decidedly business-like manner.

Sergeant Robert E. Abbott, a machine gunner, who had served as an officer on the Dallas police force, was promoted to a second lieutenant and assigned to train his comrades in their new duties. One of the men who formerly worked with a national detective agency heads the "detective department," while half a dozen A. E. F. dispatch riders are fitting in as motorcycle "speed cops."

Mounted cavalrymen, in two-paired the residential sections of the city. The day's work has been divided into three shifts, instead of two as was formerly under the civilian force, thus giving the men only eight hours on duty.

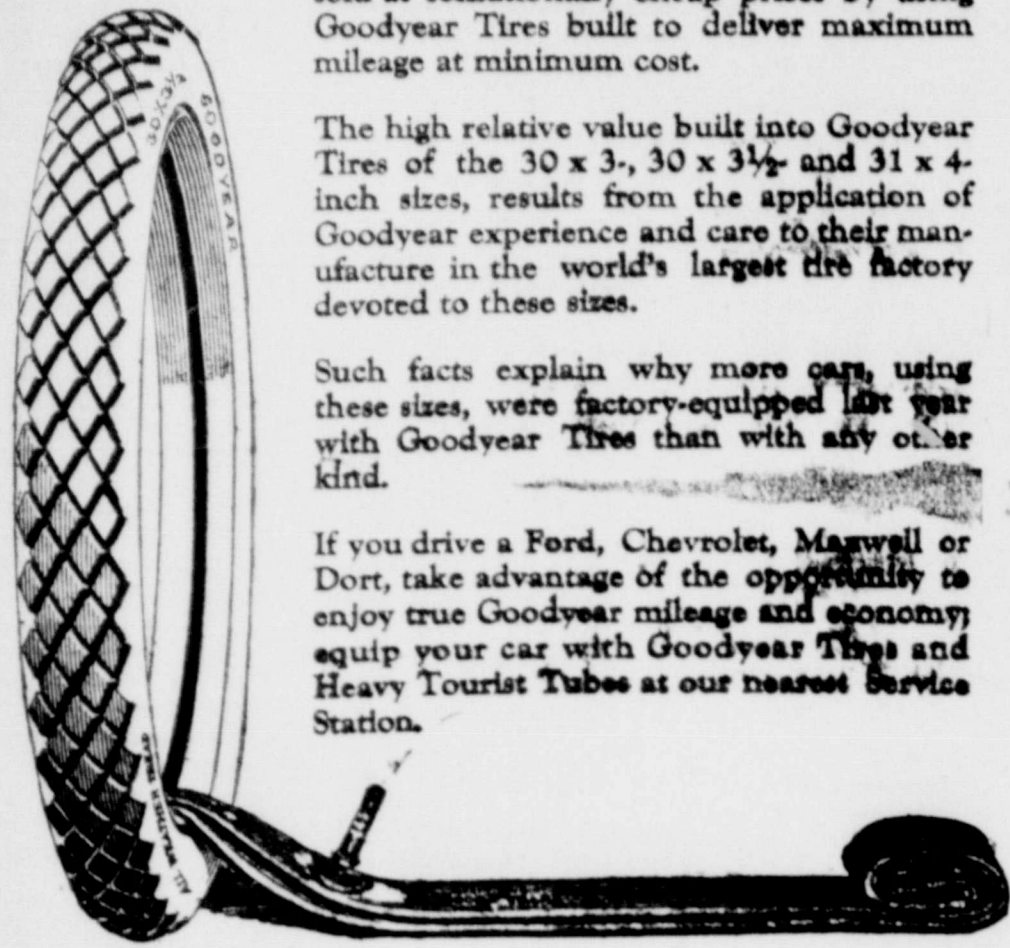

### UNDER WHICH CODE? The Old Code

It is conceded that Moses was the wisest man of the age in which he lived and the author of many wholesome laws, among which we have the following: "And if any mischief follow, then thou shalt give life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot."—Ex. 21, 23, 24.

### The New Code

In subsequent legislation on the same subject, we have the following:

"Ye have heard that it hath been said, an eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth, but I say unto you, that ye resist not evil, but whosoever shall smite thee on the right cheek, to turn to him the other also."—Matt. 5:38, 39.

Dr. Cranfill, an able Baptist minister, a real estate man, and somewhat of a modern politician, who is an ardent supporter of Pat Neff for Governor, in his recent chronicle in the Dallas News, commenting on the primary election, and of the defeat of R. E. Thomason, seems to take the position that the new code repeals the old and that, in the second primary, Neff should not be subjected to the penalty of a repealed law, but that Thomason and his friends should "TURN THE OTHER CHEEK."

On the other hand, State Senator R. M. Dudley, of El Paso, Thomason's campaign manager for that county, contends that both codes are in full force and effect and should be applied according to the facts and circumstances of the case, and further contends that the "preachments" of Neff during the campaign fully justify the application of the old code under which he should be tried in the second primary.
