## CHARGES COX SOLICITED LIQUOR MONEY FOR RACE

CHICAGO, Aug. 30.—As soon as the Senate Investigating Committee opened its hearing here today to investigate the expenditure of the Republican and Democratic presidential campaign committees, Chairman Hays of the Republican committee, submitted a letter from George Carroll, president of the New Jersey Associated Liquor interests, soliciting funds to carry on Cox propoganda with the ultimate object of obtaining an amendment to the Volstead act and permit the manufacture and sale of light wines and beers.

It had been disclosed who the letter was from, but it referred to Gov. Cox as being "pronounced wet."

CHICAGO, Aug. 30.—The senate committee investigating Republican and Democratic presidential campaign expenditures, began a hearing here this morning. The inquiry was reopened here with an examination of the National campaign chests of the two parties to learn what sums of money have already been raised and amounts the party leaders seek to raise.

The inquiry and probe into the campaign expenses of the parties has become one of paramount issues in the present presidential campaign, as a result of the recent charges made by Governor Cox against the Republican committee.

Subpoenas have been issued for Chairman Will Hays of the Republican National Committee;

George White, Chairman of the Democratic Committee, Fred Upham, Republican treasurer, Wilburn Marsh, treasurer of the Democratic committee for the purpose of investigating the charges made by Gov. Cox.

Mr. Cox has charged that the Republican committee is raising a fund of fifteen million dollars with which to buy the presidency if possible. Mr. Cox has been invited to attend the hearing or send a representative, and it is expected that he will do so as he recently stated that he was willing and ready to appear when the committee wanted him. One member of the investigating committee stated that Gov. Cox would probably be subpoenaed, if he did not voluntarily appear. It was later stated that Gov. Cox would either come himself or send information to support all charges he had made. If necessary the committee may visit Gov. Cox and not require him to break his campaign itinerary by appearing before the committee. It is evident that the committee intends to get the evidence at first hand on which Mr. Cox made his charges.

### HARDING PREPARING SPEAKING TOUR

MARION Ohio, Aug. 30.—Plans for some of the speaking trips to be made by Senator Harding are nearing completion. It was announced that speeches would probably be made soon at three or four places outside of Ohio. New York and Chicago it is understood are certain to be on the list. A number of cities in the middle west are under consideration.

### Cox Preparing Western Tour

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 30.—Gov. Cox is traveling home where he will prepare for a swing around the circle in the West during September. His itinerary will be announced within a few days.

## CROWD COMES IN TO GET RETURNS

The largest crowd ever assembled here on election night, crowded the street in front of The Ledger office Saturday night, where they lingered until the last bulletin was received and flashed on the Ledger's bulletin board.

The Neff supporters were enthusiastic from the start, and had cause to be. Only once or twice during the night were the Bailey supporters given an opportunity to cheer, and that was with the announcement of the returns from Fredericksburg, Comal County, and San Antonio.

As the midnight hour drew near and Neff's majority increased, the political complexion of the crowd showed only a few Bailey men. The Neff "rooters" lingered long and celebrated the success of their candidate.

Many people were here from the country and many of the country people were the last to leave the bulletin board. The returns from Runnels county were in at an early hour, with the exception of two or three small boxes.

No election in recent years attracted so much attention. The people were tuned to a high pitch and with an eagerness to learn who was who, they came to the nearest source of information and showed their appreciation of The Ledger's efforts to get the returns at the quickest moment possible.

The polls closed at seven o'clock and at two minutes after seven the first bulletin was posted on the bulletin board, and every few minutes bulletins were announced until it was announced that Neff's majority would be one hundred thousand.

The Texas Election Bureau did good work, and showed the result of co-operation between the papers in Texas in compiling the election returns.

## MINERS GET BIG PAY INCREASE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—The anthracite mine workers will receive about eighteen million dollars back pay under the retroactive feature of the wage award which makes the increase in miners pay effective April 1, 1920. The total increases awarded to the 175,000 miners will average at least eighty-five million dollars annually.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—President Wilson has approved the majority report of the anthracite coal commission in increasing wages of miners twenty per cent over present rates. The officials of the anthracite commission said that a joint wage scale committee of the miners and operators had already been called to meet next Wednesday or Thursday to consider the application of the award. Their report said that the findings will fix the minimum rate at fifty-two and a half cents per hour for the lower paid men in the anthracite industry.

## RIOTING WORSE IN IRISH ISLAND

BELFAST, Aug. 30.—Today's rioting brought the death list still higher, and is said to be the worst Belfast has yet seen. Up to two o'clock it was definitely known that five deaths had resulted from police rioting. The death list includes one woman and a small boy. Troops opened fire to clear the streets and break up the unionist quarters.

## BIG STAMPEDE HERE SEPT 15-18

Under the direction of H. A. Johnson, a three day's stampede and rodeo will be staged at Ballinger. The dates have been fixed for Sept. 16th, 17th and 18, and Mr. Johnson is here advertising the big event.

The big show will be in the nature of an old time roundup and cow punchers reunion. The best riders, both men and women, from the range will be here to participate in the three days riding roping, etc.

Mr. Johnson is booking entrances and says that he has assurance that many will enter the various events, and contests for the prizes which are being offered.

This will be three days, in which the people will witness "stunts" as thrilling as war and as dangerous as death itself. The wildest outlaw horses in the country will be put up for the broncho busters, and a pen of the wildest goats in the country will be turned loose for the trick and champion ropers to go after.

Every event will offer cash prizes ranging from \$100 down, and the carnival attractions brought here will furnish amusement for all ages.

Further advertising will explain more in detail the character of amusement, and the country will be invited to come to Ballinger on the above three days. A three days base ball game will be staged, and the best team available will be induced to come here for a scolding at the hands of the locals.

H. A. Johnson has charge of the plans for the coming rodeo and stampede. It was stated in the first advertisement that he was assisted by Mr. Gilstrap. Mr. Gilstrap was associated with Mr. Johnson in the Winters Rodeo, but Mr. Johnson is in full charge of the plans for the Ballinger stampede. Mr. Johnson is one of the round up men in Texas. He lives at Baird, Texas and has participated in the various rodeos held in Texas this year.

## ITALY AND U.S. IN HARMONY

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—Italy has informed the United States that the two governments were practically in accord in sentiments concerning Russia and Poland. This was contained in a recent note Secretary Colby announced today. The communication was made through consular embassy in a formal visit to the state department. A reply to the note will be made as soon as the Italian premier returns from Lucerne.

Similar assurances of accord between the government's had been received from Poland Mr. Colby said.

## AMERICAN PARTY NAMES ITS TICKET

The senatorial convention of twenty-six Senatorial District and the representative convention of the One hundred and eleventh representative District were held Saturday August 28, at Ballinger. Hon. T. I. Fitzgerald of DeLeon, was nominated for State Senator and Hon. Feb McWilliams of Ballinger for representative. The following resolution was adopted vis: As organized labor is necessary to protect the individual laborer from the aggression of organized capital, and has been instrumental in procuring for the laborer shorter hours, better pay, housing, living and education for himself and family. It has elevated him from a serf to a respectable American citizen. We indorse union labor and believe that organized labor should be protected in its rights.

## NEFF'S MAJORITY 77,383 226 COUNTIES REPORTED

Reports from 226 counties up to noon Monday places Pat Neff's majority over Bailey at 77,383. Davidson was leading Johnson for Lieutenant Governor by a majority of 23,775.

Pierson was leading Hawkins by a majority of 48,739.

It is believed that these majorities will increase as the returns from the missing boxes come in.

The total vote up to noon was as follows:

Neff 244,445.  
Bailey 167,062.  
Davidson 177,996.  
Johnson 154,221.  
Pierson 185,674.  
Hawkins 135,935.

Out of the 226 counties reported Bailey carried less than forty, while Neff's majority in the larger counties, with the exception of Bexar, was sweeping. El Paso went for Bailey. Neff carried every county of importance in the black land belt, and through east and north Texas.

## SEEK MISSING MEN IN MEXICO

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 30.—The Mexican war department has ordered that a search be made at once for the American and British subjects who were kidnapped by Pedro Zamora, the Mexican bandit leader, on August 20th. A Mexican report says that the bandits have become demoralized and are in flight and it is not known what the fate of the men they were holding is.

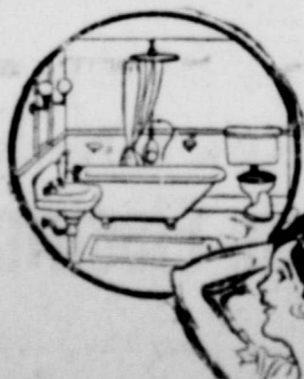

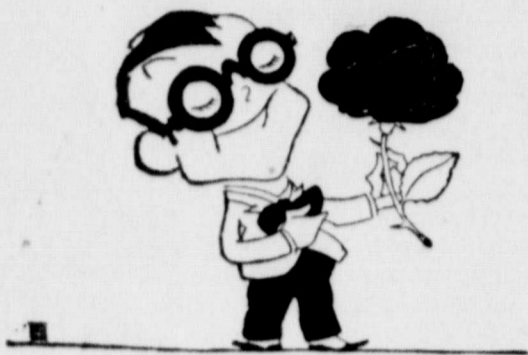

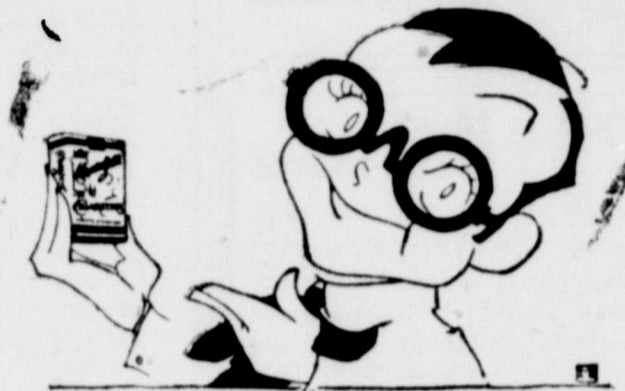

To the Patrons of Public Schools of Ballinger:

I desire to state that arrangements are being rapidly completed for the opening of the city schools on September 6th. I have delayed making this announcement until the Board had secured a full faculty. Great difficulty has been experienced in securing a competent faculty on account of salaries the Board was able to offer. We confidently believe that an unusually strong corps of teachers has at last been secured, some teachers preferring to teach in Ballinger than to work in eastern Texas. The school buildings have all been cleaned and renovated from top to basement, repairs made where needed and everything made presentable for school. Parents are especially urged to send their children the first day of opening of school so that they may be classified promptly and begin work with out any unnecessary delay. The following assignments have been made, subject to change if found necessary on the opening of school:

All children classified below 6th living south of the Colorado river are assigned to the South Ward school, all above the 5th to Central Ward school. The other assignments are:

Mrs. W. A. Bridwell low 1st and beginners; teacher to be supplied. High 1st and High 2nd; Mrs. James Hargrett, low 2nd; Miss May Bridwell, low 3rd; Miss Minnie Lane, High 3rd; Miss Ethel Bair, section of low 4th; Miss Addie Lee Smith, part of low 4th and High 4th; Mrs. Eunice Lilly, low 5th; Miss Pearl Evans High 5th and part of low 6th; Miss Myrtle Bridwell part of low 6th and High 6th; Mr. J. O. Harris low 7th and High 7th.

As far as possible all children residing in east part of town and not included in High school will be assigned to Central Ward school, those not classified in High school and who reside in the western part of the town and who are classified in 4th, 5th and 6th grades will be assigned to West Ward school. The city authorities have promised to fix the side walk on Eighth street leading to West Ward so that the school children will not be inconvenienced in wet weather. Of course some few will be inconvenienced by these arrangements, and it is our desire to deal as fairly as possible with all concerned. Your cordial support is solicited so that we have the best school possible in Ballinger.
