BOND ISSUE FAVORED FOR IRRIGATION DAM

The issuance of eight million dollars worth of bonds, the construction of a dam which will impound flood water sufficient to irrigate two hundred thousand acres of land is a proposition too large for the average man to comprehend, and the magnitude of the gigantic project may cause many, to look on more or less from a doubting Thomas standpoint.

There is an organization, however, known as the Colorado Valley Irrigation Association. which is less than two months old, which is determined to test the feasibility of the proposition, and if it is practical they are just as determined to put it over and make land which is now producing only a few dollars worth of products produce millions of dollars worth of crops.


