SIX QUARTS TEQUILA GETS MAN IN JAIL

C. A. Bailey, of San Angelo, was arrested at a local hotel Tuesday afternoon and placed in jail on a charge filed in the justice court alleging that Bailey "then and there unlawfully, directly and indirectly did sell, barter, transport, exchange, receive and deliver, take orders for, furnish and possess spiritous vinous and malt liquors capable of producing intoxication."

Bailey's arrest came following a raid on a room at the local hotel which the man was occupying, and the confiscating of six quarts of tequila. The investigation which led to the man's arrest resulted from a few drunks which developed here Monday evening. The officers got a whiff of the booze and went out with a determination to find it.

It is alleged that Bailey arrived here from San Angelo in an auto with two women. The trio put up at the local hotel, where they remained until Bailey was placed in jail. The women were man on the early train Wednesday morning.



It may not be generally known that this place is the third in sanctity of all the sanctu aries of Islam, and indeed for a short period it actually formed the Kibla toward which all Moslems prostrated themselves in prayer.

Among the more important religious associations of this rock we may mention it was here that David and Solomon were called to repentance, and on account of a vision David chose this site for his temple. From this same spot Mohammed ascended to the seventh heaven after his night journey from Mecca, and lastly it is to be the scene of the Great Judgment. The historical associations are not less striking and such famous names as Omar Abdel-Malek, Saladin and Suleiman are all connected with the rock.

Self-Luminous Animals.

Not less than 36 different orders of animals are self-luminous, we are told by the new work of E. Newton Harvey on "The Nature of Animal Light." These include many forms of protozoa, hydroids, jellyfish, bryozoa, polychaete and oligochaete worms, brittle stars, crustacea, myriopods, insects, mollusks, primitive chordates and fishes. None of the luminous species inhabit fresh water, all being terrestrial or marine. On an average 20,000 bales of cotton are destroyed by fire before the crop is marketed. and most of this loss can be traced to flash or spark fire. Cotton stored in suitable warehouses would be evidence of a progressive step, for there is probably no crop of so great value that is treated with so little thoughtful consideration.
