The school is free. It is open to all—Protestants, Catholics, Jews, regardless of color or academic background. Each class meets once a week for six or eight weeks and courses are scheduled five nights a week.

Courses are scheduled five nights a courses are scheduled five nights. The sessions are informal. No text books are required, but reference volumes are recommended and mimeographed material is furnished. The students range in age from 18 to 75 years. Attendance is better than 5,000 a year.

The school is one of the newest branches of the ever-spreading CYO. It was opened last year in the busy CYO center at Congress street and Wabsha wenue. It offers "free social education to any one interested in helping to build a better society."
