Cod Is Honored

WASHINGTON.-The cod that is so common and cheap in America is so esteemed in Portugal that the peasants commonly refer to it as only dry and hard since Portugal has no cold storage refrigerators in
which to preserve or ship it. Before the war Portugal had the lowest per capita consumption of meat in all Europe. In some of the
inland provinces where meat is especially scarce, peasants eat it only once
This accounts for the "Kingdom of Bacalhau" in Portugal and its importance in the national economy
and in politics.
The first historical contact of the Portuguese with the British stems
trom the scaly cod back in the 12 th from the scaly cod back in the 12 th
century. Portuguese fishermen who sailed to the North sea for their catches began to trade their wines
from Oporto for the fish the Britons caught.
This helped make port wine a Brit-
