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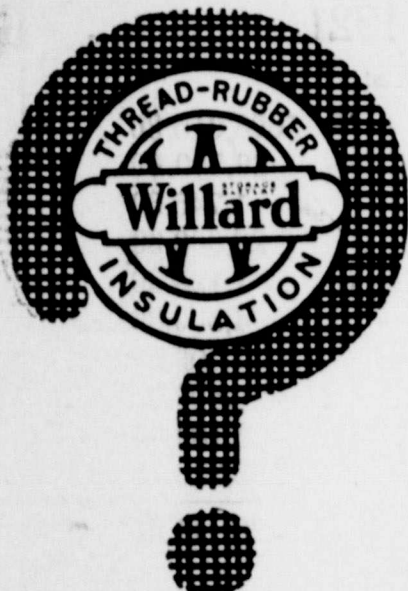

SIMPLE CEREMONY MARKS INAUGURATION; SYMPATHY EXPRESSED AS WILSON RETIRES

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Warren G. Harding and Calvin Coolidge were inaugurated today as President and Vice President, respectively, of the United States.

Mr. Harding took the oath of office at 1:18 o'clock, following Mr. Coolidge who took the oath at 12:21 o'clock. Pressing his lips to the historic Bible used in the inauguration of George Washington, the new president took the oath, which was administered by Chief Justice White.

In the inauguration ceremony, Justice White used the historic Bible, reading from the sixth chapter of Micah, the eighth verse, "what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

The inaugural was not put under way according to schedule promptly at ten o'clock. There was some delay when the Congressional committee in charge of the affairs arrived at the New Willard Hotel to escort the presidential party to the White House.

Bright weather, with cold blustering March wind marked the opening of the inauguration. Hours before the moment set for the inauguration the capitol plaza was well filled with the crowd, who were eager to witness the inauguration.

President-elect Harding and Mrs. Harding and Vice President-elect Coolidge and Mrs. Coolidge left the hotel for the White House at 10:20 and accompanied by the congressional committee and four troops of cavalry riding in columns along by the side of the presidential party with drawn sabres.

Soon after eleven o'clock President Wilson and Mr. Harding arrived at the capitol for the ceremonies. When President Wilson descended the steps of the portico of the White House, secret service men placed his feet in each succeeding step.

A great demonstration from the crowd in the plaza greeted the presidential party. Numerous expressions of sympathy were heard from the crowd regarding the president's condition.

As President Wilson entered the presidential room a brisk hand shaking followed which was joined in by the new president.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Warren Gamaliel Harding was inaugurated President of the United States today with ceremonies as simple as those the historians have described in chronicling the induction into office of George Washington more than a century ago.

Had Mr. Harding's personal wishes been adhered to strictly, the ceremonies would have been even more simple, but the Congressional Inaugural Committee made some arrangements on its own account. These included a cavalry escort of four troops for the President in his ride from his hotel to the capitol and thence to the White House.

WARREN G. HARDING



Warren Gamaliel Harding (29th President of the United States.)

Born in Blooming Grove, Morrow county, Ohio, November 2nd, 1865.

Student Ohio Central College, 1879-1882.

Entered newspaper business, Marion, Ohio, 1884, and publisher of Marion Star since that time.

Married Florence Kling, Marion, 1891.

Member Ohio State Senate, 1899 to 1903.

Lieutenant-Governor Ohio, 1904 to 1906.

Republican candidate for Governor of Ohio, 1910. (defeated.)

Elected to United States Senate, Nov. 3, 1914.

Elected President, November 2, 1920.

Religion: Baptist.
Home: Marion, Ohio.

This little cavalcade contrasted strangely with the great military and civil processions which have attended inaugurations for half a century or more.

Besides the cavalry escort, the Congressional Committee also had arranged to have several companies of Marines in full dress uniform at the capitol as a guard of honor and for the presence of the Marine Band—the President's Own—which played "The Star Spangled Banner" immediately after Mr. Harding had taken the oath of office.

The very simplicity of the ceremonies on the East portico of the capitol added to their impressiveness. Simple and impressive also were those in the Senate chamber, where Calvin Coolidge was sworn in by Vice-President Marshall and where Mr. Coolidge in turn swore into office the new Senators elected last November.

The day's ceremonies began with formal calls on the President-elect and Vice President-elect at the New Willard Hotel by the Congressional Committee, headed by Senator Knox, of Pennsylvania. The Presidential party and the Congressional Committee then left the hotel for the capitol.

Pennsylvania avenue from the White House to the capitol was crowded with home folks and visitors, anxious for a glimpse of the new and retiring Presidents. There were no reviewing stands and most of the spectators were forced to stand along the sidewalks. The more fortunate had seats in windows facing the avenues.

At the capitol the East plaza with its standing room for thousands was packed and the crowd overflowed out over the park spaces and avenues which converge there. Most of these thousands were able to hear the inaugural address as Mr. Harding's voice was carried far out by means of sound-amplifying devices installed over the platform.

When the official party arrived at the capitol it was escorted into a room off the Senate chamber and the Vice-President and Mrs. Coolidge went to the vice-president's room to await the beginning of the ceremonies in the Senate chamber. President Wilson was in his room at the capitol signing bills which had been passed in the closing hours of the Sixty-sixth Congress.

Senate galleries had been filling long before this hour. Invited guests of the new President, Vice-President, Speaker and Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States supplied with covered cards of admission, were assigned to the East side. Guests of Senators were assigned to the Northeast gallery and guests of the Representatives to seats in the three West ones.

The party in the galleries was little less distinguished than that on the floor. It was composed of American women scarcely less known than their husbands taking part in the ceremony

OATH OF OFFICE IS GIVEN NEW PRESIDENT

WASHINGTON, March 4.—The oath of office of President as administered today by the Chief Justice of the United States, Edward Douglass White, follows:

"I, Warren Gamaliel Harding, do solemnly swear that I will faithfully execute the office of President of the United States, and will, to the best of my ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States."

A Little History of Presidents

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Warren G. Harding is the first newspaper publisher to serve as President of the United States. He is the 29th chief executive, reckoning Cleveland's two terms as separate ones because he was the only president serving twice who was not re-elected.

Nineteen presidents were lawyers at the time they were elected. Three are classified as statesmen; two as soldiers; two as farmers; one as a public official. Mr. Harding might fall within the class of statesman as he served six years in the Senate when elected and was the first senator to be elected President.

Virginia leads in the nativity of Presidents. Eight of her sons: Washington, Jefferson, Madison, Monroe, William Henry Harrison, Tyler, Taylor and Wilson—have held the highest office in the gift of the nation.

Ohio has given seven native sons to the Presidency: Grant, Hayes, Garfield, Benjamin Harrison, McKinley, Taft and Harding.

Eighteen Presidents have been college men; one was graduated from West Point; nine had no college education.

CALVIN COOLIDGE



Vice-President's Inaugural Address.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Vice President Calvin C. Coolidge confined his inaugural address today to his connection with the Senate. In part, Mr. Coolidge said:

"To the Senate; renewing its membership by degrees, representing in part the sovereign states, has been granted, not only the full measure of power in legislation, but if possible, a far more important function. To it is entrusted the duty of review, and that to negotiations there may be added ratification and to appointment approval. But its greatest function is too little mentioned and too little understood. Whether exercised in legislating or in reviewing, it is the preservation of liberty. Not merely the preservation of the rights of the majority; they little need protection, but in the preservation of the rights of the minority from whatever source they may be assailed."

WASHINGTON, March 4.—One of the last official acts of President Wilson was to give a "pocket veto" to the army appropriation bill, and the immigration restriction bill.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Woodrow Wilson leaves the White House today to resume the role of private citizen and again take up the practice of law which he quit forty years ago. With Bainbridge Colby, retiring Secretary of State, Mr. Wilson formed a partnership to practice law in New York and Washington.

The president's announcement a few days ago that he would enter the practice of law caused a surprise as it had been believed that he would pursue the work of perfecting plans for a world peace.

66th Congress is Past History

WASHINGTON, March 4.—The Sixty-sixth Congress adjourned sine die today at 12:30 o'clock.

MEXICO BITTER AGAINST WILSON

MEXICO CITY, March 4.—Today's newspaper editorial here, in commenting on the change in the administration in the United States, express bitterness against President Wilson, and express the hope that the Harding administration will see and end the antagonism between the United States and Mexico.

TOTAL COST OF U. S. GOVERNMENT

WASHINGTON, March 4.—Chairman Warren, of the Senate appropriations committee, announced today that total appropriations of the present session of Congress for the fiscal year of 1922 amounted to \$3,806,029,647.

MAN WANTED IN ABILENE IS IN LOCAL JAIL

Travis Hopkins is in the Ballinger jail charged with "sandbagging" W. P. Ford, a traveling man at Abilene last Sunday night. Sheriff Flynt and his deputy arrested Hopkins at Miles Thursday afternoon. Abilene officers will come here after the man and he will be carried to Abilene for trial.

The man was located at the home of his brother-in-law at Miles, and the arrest immediately followed. While it has not been disclosed what evidence the officers have to connect Hopkins with the crime, it was stated that the right man was in jail and the court would lose no time in giving him a trial.

Hopkins is not a stranger in these parts. It is alleged that he has been operating in Miles, Ballinger, Winters, Abilene and other towns for several months, and was known to be in Abilene on the night of the hold-up at that place.

Ford arrived in Abilene from Munday about ten o'clock and was en route to a hotel when some one "biffed" him on the head as he was walking along the street, and when he came to life his grip, watch, overcoat, and about \$50 in cash was missing. He made his way to a residence nearby and was hurried to the hospital, where it is said that he remains in a critical condition.

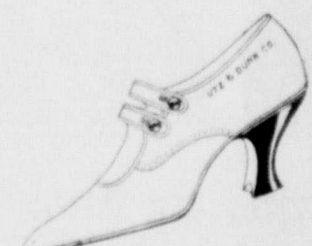
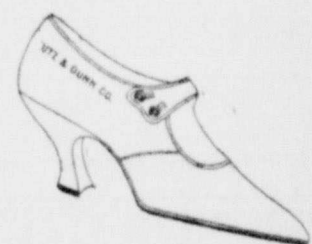

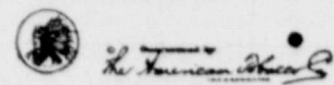

OUR NEW PRESIDENT AND HIS RELIGION

(Contributed by "C. W. H.")

Mr. Harding who becomes our new President today, was converted at the age of fourteen in a Methodist meeting conducted by Rev. G. L. Hahnawalt, at Caladonia, Ohio. He had the great advantage of birth and training in a Christian home. His father, Dr. G. L. Harding, is a Baptist, and his mother is a Methodist. From the first the good mother desired her son to be a preacher.

After the family moved to Marion, Ohio, young Warren joined the Freewill Baptist Church and was an active member until the congregation merged with the Trinity Baptist Church, of which he is at present a trustee. His wife is a member of the Epworth Methodist Church of Marion. Mrs. Harding recently said to a former pastor: "We are praying more since the responsibilities of life are getting heavier."

Speaking recently before a laymen's convention in Marion, Mr. Harding said: "I want you to believe that there is an individual who believes in the reconsecration of a religious republic. I have for my inheritance a Christian belief, and I have in my veins the blood of Christian parentage. I have been preaching to my countrymen the gospel of reverence. I do not believe that we can have the highest type of civilization without its religious strain. We need its influence, and we need its discipline."

"Sometimes I think that the world is adrift from its moorings of religion, and I know it will help if there come a renewal of faith. I have no higher concept in the world than just government, and I do not see how a government can exist in the world without coming in contact with God. I could not hope for a happy relationship among nations if there is not the same current of recognition of the Supreme Being. "I do not intend to come as the finest example of what a man

ought to be; but I rejoice in the inheritance of a religious belief, and I do not mind saying that I gladly go to God Almighty for guidance and strength in the responsibilities that are coming to me."

And thus it is; as one great Christian gentleman lays down the heavy burdens and responsibilities of this great office another great Christian gentleman takes them up. "Whosoever will be great among you, let him be your servant."

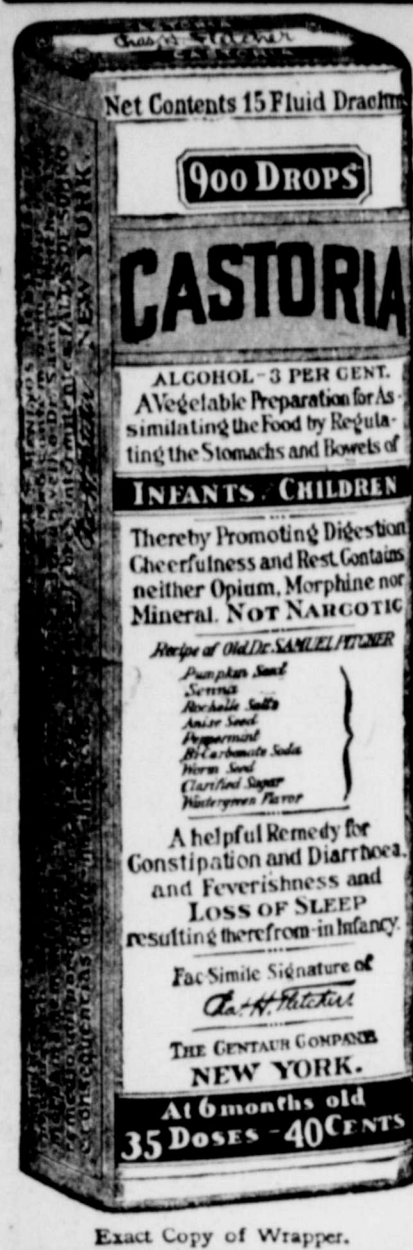

**SANITARY MAN
TO INSPECT CITY**

A state-wide clean-up campaign is to be conducted, according to Dr. Manton M. Carriek, State Health Officer, upon the conclusion of this campaign, the cities and towns of the state will be inspected and rated according to their sanitary condition. This rating will be filed with the State Board of Health.

"Texas must be the cleanest state in the Union," declared Dr. Carriek, in an interview today. "We shall be content with no halfway measures of sanitation in this campaign, but expect to give Texas a thorough Spring house-cleaning."

By special proclamation, Gov. Neff has set aside the week beginning March 13th as Health Week, and telegrams from towns over the state, promising cooperation, are already being received by Dr. Carriek. The campaign for better sanitary conditions will be conducted on a larger scale but along the same lines as the "Clean-up Campaign" of several years ago. "Each town and city of the state will realize the importance of such a campaign I am sure," said Dr. Carriek, "for it will give them a definite status with the State Board of Health. We are constantly receiving inquiries from persons interested in locating in a new community, as to the sanitary and health conditions of the place. After the sanitary inspection has been made, we shall be able to answer them by quoting the sanitary rating of the particular town or city in question. It is easily seen what effect a low rating will have upon the increase of population of a community."

below, families of foreign diplomats and men and other women in the foreground of the social life of the nation.

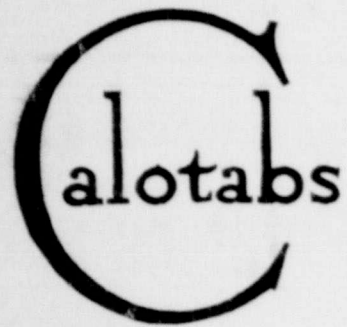
President-elect Harding, escorted by the committee on arrangements, entered the Senate chamber at the main door and was escorted to the seat on the floor on the right hand side of the main aisle and facing the rostrum. Vice-President Coolidge was escorted to a seat on the platform.

The Senate chaplain, the Rev. J. J. Muir, offered prayer and the Senate of the 67th Congress was called to order by Vice-President Marshall. As silence settled over the chamber, Vice-President Coolidge stood beside Mr. Marshall. Both men raised their right hands. Mr. Marshall slowly spoke the Vice-President's oath, the new Vice-President repeated the words, and then delivered his address.

Then before a great sea of humanity, official and unofficial, invited and uninvited, Mr. Harding took his place at the left of the Chief Justice and at the right of the arrangements committee. The assembling of the Presidential party, its departure and the demonstrations of the crowd were the only spectacular features of the outdoor ceremony. Simplicity and solemnity marked the actual ceremony itself.

When the President takes the inaugural oath, the Chief Justice, bible in hand, steps forward; the man who is about to take oath stands beside him with raised hand. Slowly and solemnly the Chief Justice repeats the oath prescribed by the constitution, the Pres-

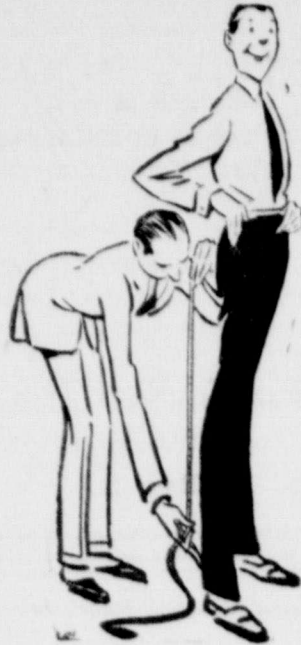
