

# SIMPLE CEREMONY MARKS INAUGURATION; SYMPATHY EXPRESSED AS WILSON RETIRES

WASHINGTON, March 4. Warren G. Harding and Calvin Coolidge were inaugurated today as President and Vice President,

respectively, of the United States. Mr. Harding took the oath of office at 1.18 o'clock, following Mr. Coolidge who took the oath at 12:21 o'clock. Pressing his lips to the historic Bible used in the inauguration of George Washington, the new president took the oath, which was administered by Chief Justice White.

In the inauguration ceremony, Justice White used the historic Bible, reading from the sixth chapter of Micha, the eighth verse, "what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk
