NEW RULING ON DRY LAW GIVEN OUT

WASHINGTON, March 9.—The gvernment is without authority to prohibit the manufacture and sale of liquors, wines and beer for non-beverage purposes, according to a ruling of the Attorney General, which was published here today by the Internal Revenue department.

WASHINGTON, March 9 .-The prohibition lid was removed today on "beer with a kick" for medicinal purposes.

The Department of Justice ruled that physicians are authorfized under the Volstead act to prescribe beer when in their judgment it will prove beneficial. The beer ruling was drafted before the new administration came into office and bears the signature of A. Mitchell Palmer. retiring Attorney General.

Beer now takes a status equal to that of wine as a curative agent, legally listed by the Government and physicians will be allowed wide latitude in directing its use by patients when such use will aid recovery in cases of illness or convalescence.






