OCCUPATION OF ZONE CONTINUES

ALLIED MILITARY HEAD-
QUARTERS. Neuss, Germany,
March 10.—The Allied forces
have virtually completed the oc-
cupation of the Rhine and other
points in the Ruhr region. The
seizure of only a few villages and
cross roads remain to be accom-
plished.

Commanders have not yet ar-
ranged the division of the new
occupation zone for the British,
French and Belgians.

BOOSTING BIG SUMMER NORMAL FOR THE CITY

Superintendent Bugg expresses
himself as being confident that
Ballinger will have a Summer
Normal this year, and the Young
Men's Business League is back-
ing him up in his efforts by send-
ing out letters to three or four
hundred school teachers in this
section of the state.

It is hoped to secure the at-
tendance of at least one hundred
teachers, an addition to the city's
population for two months dur-
ing the quiet summer period
which will undoubtedly be felt
by local business men.

DEFER ACTION ON COLUMBIAN TREATY

WASHINGTON, March 10.—
The Senate today reached an ag-
reement to defer action on the
Columbian treaty until the April
session of Congress, and to vote
on the treaty on the eighth day
after Congress convenes.

PLAN MEMORIAL FOR R. P. KIRK

The friends of R. P. Kirk are
busy talking and forming plans
to put a bronze plate on the
new bridge crossing the Colorado
river and making that a mem-
orial to the life of Bob Kirk.

We cannot think of anything
more fitting as a memorial to this
good man than the dedication of
this bridge to him and his life's
work. He spent practically all
his life doing some kind of work
for his town and county, and in
the last years of his life most of
this work was on the public high-
ways. He built many of the best
roads that we have in the county
and for many years he had work-
ed on the bridge proposition and
with both State and Federal
highway commissions he had
more influence and got more
concessions from them than any
man who ever represented Run-
nels county, and it is unfortunate
that he did not live to see this
work so wonderfully accom-
plished, but for starting the work
and for so many years putting
his whole soul into it, his friends
feel that this tablet should stand
forever as a memorial to his life.

There has been no definite ac-
tion in regard to this as yet, but
everyone is strong in their op-
inion that no opposition will be
met and feel that the good work
done by Mr. Kirk should not go
unremembered.

Contributions will be received
for the purchasing of a plate and
arrangements made with the
county commissioners to place
this plate on the bridge, it is
stated. Should this move meet
with opposition the plate can be
placed by the side of the bridge
inside the city limits, but we feel
sure that every citizen of Run-
nels county will be interested in
seeing the original move carried
out as no man has ever lived here
that did more for his county and
had more friends.

The Ledger is strong for the
move to be carried out and if
anyone has a suggestion to make
we will be glad to carry it, but
let's pull together and reward
the faithfulness and untiring ef-
fort that this man put into his
work.

Legion Members Try to Stop Villard's Address

COURT ROOM CROWDED TO HEAR MURDER TRIAL OF CLARA SMITH

RUSSELL IMPORTS BRAHMA CATTLE

Max Russell of this county, who
operates one of the Russell
ranches just North of Ballinger,
has recently brought to this sec-
tion for the first time in its his-
tory, a number of Brahma cat-
tle, the sacred cow of India. Mr.
Russell has twenty-three of these
animals in the Shultz feeding
pens in the North part of this
city.

Brahma cattle have been ex-
hibited at the State Fair for a
number of years. They were in-
troduced into Texas by Ed C.
Lassiter of Falfurrias, who made
a special trip to India for that
purpose, and secured them only
after cutting thru a large amount
of red tape, as the people of that
country regard the cow as sac-
red and ordinarily do not allow
them to be taken away.

These cattle run largely to beef
and are sleek, well set-up and
fine appearing animals.

These are the first cattle of this
kind to be shipped into this coun-
ty. The lot consists of two heif-
ers and twenty-one males, and
part of them will be placed on
the Russell Grape Creek ranch,
and part on the Wylie ranch on
the Colorado river. They were
carried to the ranches Thursday
morning.

Mr. Russell stated that the cat-
tle would be crossed with Here-
fords and Durhams, this cross
breeding having proved very
profitable. The cross between
the Brahma and the American
strains makes a larger animal
and one that develops quickly.
The cross breed calves are said to
be larger and grow much faster
than the pure breeds.

Ohio, to be comptroller of cur-
rency.

6,933,867 tons of unfilled orders
on hand on Feb. 28th. This is a
decrease from unfilled orders on
hand January 31st.

ARDMORE, Okla., March 10.

At nine-thirteen today Judge
Thomas W. Champion dropped
the gavel, calling court to order
and opening the trial of Clara
Smith Hamon, the alleged mur-
derer of Jake L. Hamon, Okla-
homa's greatest murder trial in
her fourteen years of statehood.
All principal figures in the trial
were present and ready for trial.
182 veniremen had been sum-
moned from which to select the
jury, and both sides are said to
be content to handle the case on
its merits as a murder case, and
it was declared by one attorney
that there would be "no resorting
to grandstandings" in the
trial of the case. The court room
became jammed with people
shortly before the trial began.

During the course of examina-
tion of veniremen by the State,
counsel and spectators evinced
much interest in this phase of
the trial, indicating that much
depends on the character of the
jury to pass on the case.
A partial list of witnesses was
read by B. F. Laughridge, and
the list of veniremen under ex-
amination include the names of
Ardmore bankers.

ARDMORE, Okla., March 10.—
A few minutes before the open-
ing of the trial of Clara Smith
Hamon, charged with the mur-
der of Jake L. Hamon, only a few
people were in the court room
and the interest on the street was
secondary to an oil gusher which
was brought in near the city.

LEAGUE SEEKS U. S. SUPPORT

PARIS, March 10.—The French
foreign office today stated that
negotiations and proceedings be-
tween the French embassy at
Washington and the United States
state department were going
on, in an effort to induce Presi-
dent Harding to favor the accept-
ance of a modified league of
nations.

WASHINGTON, March 10.—
Administration officials today
withheld comment on the state-
ment made by the French foreign
office that negotiations were pro-
gressing between the French em-
bassy here and the state depart-
ment regarding the acceptance
by the United States of a modi-
fied league of nations.

The impression is given out,
however, that the initiative for
such a movement rested entirely
with the French government.

HOUSE REFUSES UNIVERSITY BILL

AUSTIN, March 10.—The Sen-
ate today refused to concur with
the House amendments on the
University of Texas expansion
bill and Senator A. E. Wood, of
Williamson county, request ed
that a free conference committee
be named to adjust the differ-
ences between the two houses.
The request was granted and the
committee named.

As this bill passed the Senate a
few days ago it provided an ap-
propriation of \$1,500,000 to buy
175 acres of land adjacent to the
University campus. The House
amended the bill by reducing the
appropriation to \$1,000,000, and
authorizing the purchase of only
one hundred acres.

AUSTIN, March 10.—The
House today killed the Senate
bill proposing to allow convicts
to testify in state case, refusing
to consider it before noon.

The three million dollar sup-
plemental school fund measure
finally passed the House and is
now pending in the Senate.

AUSTIN, March 10.—The
House killed the American Leg-
ion boxing bill today, which had
passed the Senate by refusing to
take it up for consideration.

The time for engrossing the
bill in the Senate expired at noon
today, and the clock was moved
back half an hour to save the life
of a number of important Senate
bills.

RETURN FROM TRIP INTO OLD MEXICO

W. B. Page, Feb. McWilliams,
and son Eldred, and Shannon Mc-
Williams, returned home Wed-
nesday afternoon from a trip to
old Mexico. They made the trip
in an auto and spent several
days across the border, going in-
to Mexico for a distance of 250
miles. Ballinger parties are be-
coming interested in Mexican
lands as an investment, and these
parties were prospecting. They
report finding things quiet and
peaceable in Mexico, with the
country gradually getting back
to a seemingly sound peace basis.
Opportunities are said to be good
for investors in the southern re-
public.

FOOD IS SCARCE WITH RUSSIANS

RIGA, Russia, March 10.—
Three brigades of bolshevik sol-
diers at Moscow have deserted
and joined the revolutionaries,
according to advice here. The
action of the soldiers was prompt-
ed by the very acute food situa-
tion at the soviet capital.

WASHINGTON, March 10.—
The Senate today confirmed the
nomination of Dr. C. E. Sawyer
as President Harding's personal
physician and to be Brigadier
General in the Medical Reserve
Corps.

CHARITY BOARD IS BUSY BODY

T. S. Lankford, a member of the Charity Board says there is plenty for the board to look after now and that charity cases are on the increase. A few nights ago Mr. Lankford found three little children down by the creek bridge with nothing for a bed nor anything to eat. He took the children in his car and started to town and met the father and a boy about ten years old coming to the children with some few groceries which they had purchased in town with money earned that day.

Mr. Lankford took the father and larger boy back to town to a rooming house where he made arrangements for them for the night and carried the three little children to his home, where he gave them some clothes and a good supper. Yesterday he found a house for the family near the cotton yard on the river, and furnished them with quilts and other bedding. Mrs. Edwin Day donated them a stove and other necessities and gave the father and older boy work for several days. People who have anything in the way of clothes, bedding or anything for a house should notify the Charity Board as there will be other cases needing attention.

Another family in the Western part of the city is in very destitute circumstances, according to Mr. Lankford, and the Charity Board has extended them all the help it could, but the family is not making the proper effort to get means of support. There is sickness in the family and some are suffering, without help, due to the negligence of the head of the family, it was stated. Work is being asked for this man, and citizens will see that he does it.

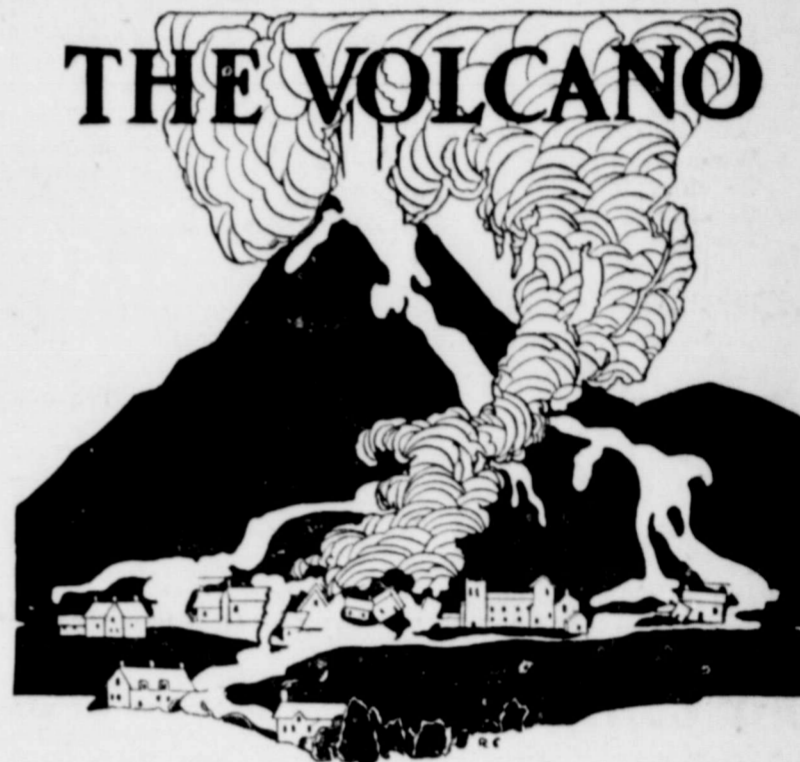

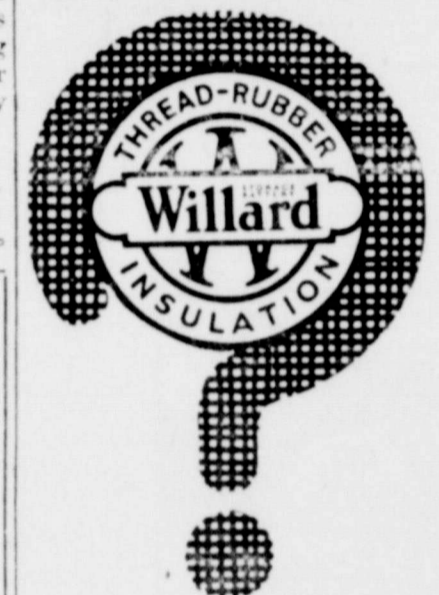
