HEAVY RAINS IN NORTH

TEXARKANA, April 26.—Torrential rains last night and early today flooded three thousand acres of land around Texarkana and the damage to property is estimated at more than one hundred thousand dollars.

The flood put the city pumping station out of commission and the city is without fire protection or water for commercial and domestic uses.

MARSHALL, Tex., April 26.—Ten and four-tenths inches of torrential rain here throughout last night and continuing today caused a tremendous loss to railroads, highways, bridges, and other property. The city is without water as a result of flooding the engine rooms of the water works plant.

TEMPLE, April 26.—This section of the state was hit hard by hail and hard rains late yesterday and last night. Waco reports a heavy rain and hail. Fruit and crops suffered at many points in this section, and high water was responsible for a suspension of traffic for several hours.

SHERIFF GETS ROWENA STILL

Sheriff Flynn captured the best equipped liquor still at Rowena Monday that has been brought in here since prohibition went into effect. For some time the local sheriff has been doing a little detective work on this case, and he made a raid Monday which netted the capture of the pots, coils, mash, and some of the finished produce. The negro in charge was arrested and placed in jail.

The officer found the home made booze making machine located in the back room of a negro barber shop at Rowena. The negro was operating the barber shop as a side line while booze making was his chief stock in trade.

For some time the sheriff had been suspicious of a white man, and was making an effort to get the white man, but the case reached such stage that he would not delay the game further with the hope of getting the white man, for fear that the negro would also get away, and the officer was forced to act then or lose the game, so he acted with the above results.

Buckets filled with prunes formed one of the sources from which the fermented juice was coming, while a sample of corn juice was also caught in the raid. A gallon bottle of "stuff" was part of the material captured in the raid, and the sheriff is retaining this as evidence against the negro, who will be either arraigned in the State or Federal court on charge of violating the prohibition law.

ESCAPES DANGER FROM CAT BITE

Mr. and Mrs. Ed Pape are at home from Austin, where they went to consult the Pasteur Institute authorities, following the biting of their little son by a cat. The cat died a day or two after biting the boy, and it was feared that it had hydrophobia.

Mr. Pape carried the cat's head to Austin and an examination of the animal's brain showed that it did not have hydrophobia and it was not necessary to give the child treatment. Their friends will be glad to know that the boy escaped the danger which might have resulted from the cat bite.

BIG CROWD FROM TRAINMEN WON'T HANDLE COAL

Fifteen or twenty cars, carrying sixty or seventy-five people from this city left during the early hours Tuesday morning for Bronte, where they went to attend the meeting of the Colorado Valley Irrigation Association and barbeque given by the Coke county citizens.

The meeting was scheduled for ten-thirty, with reports from the secretary, and committees and speakers making up the program.

Following the irrigation meeting the picnic feature of the program was scheduled, and a baseball game between the Coke County Rabbit Twisters and the Ballinger Bear Cats occupied a place on the program.

The attendance at the meeting will be the largest of any meeting held since the association was organized at Miles last winter.

GOVERNOR'S SON IS VISITOR HERE

Pat Neff Jr., was a visitor to Ballinger Monday. Mr. Neff has been spending several days on the ranch of his uncle, Sam Neff, near Tennyson, and accompanied by his uncle, they came to Ballinger Monday to spend a few hours.

NEFF PROUD OF HIS CHARACTER

AUSTIN, April 26.—Governor Pat Neff said today, "I would not exchange an untarnished character for the governor's office."

This statement was embraced in a reply to a telegram from Frank B. Tiley, county attorney of McLennan county, notifying the governor that Morr M. Scholl had been fined \$500 for criminal libel of Pat M. Neff during the gubernatorial campaign last year. Scholl is editor of the Cooper Courier, and a complaint was filed against him charging that his paper libelled Neff, and when the case was called for trial yesterday Editor Scholl pleaded guilty and paid the fine of \$500 which was assessed against him.

GERMANY PLEADS FOR NEW TERMS TO ALLIES

PARIS, April 26.—Germany's new reparations propositions as announced today, are considered here as unacceptable. The terms

will not be accepted even as a basis for discussion, according to well informed opinion close to the French foreign office.

PARIS, April 26.—Premier Briand told the Chamber of Deputies today that "if on May 1st, satisfactory proposals, with acceptable guarantees, had not been made by the German government, that the Ruhr region would be occupied by the allies, and forced collections would be made."

WASHINGTON, April 26.—German counter proposals regarding reparations were received today by the State Department, and it is understood were immediately laid before the cabinet at a regular meeting.

PARIS, April 26.—The possibility of applying penalties to Germany immediately after May first, despite whatever propositions Germany may make regarding reparations in general, is being seriously considered, according to well informed French circles today.

BERLIN, April 26.—The reparations note forwarded to Washington from Berlin contains an arbitration proposal for determining the total amount due the allies. This clause of the note says: "Germany suggests the appointment of an unbiased commission to fix the total sum of her war reparations, which she pledges to accept as binding and carry out the terms fixed by such commission in good faith."

The note adds that Germany would welcome any suggestions from the United States for further negotiations, or changes to the present proposals.

Germany offers to pay fifty billion gold marks at their present value, which converted into annuities would total two hundred billion gold marks.

Reparations proposals made by Germany declare that the present proposals are the only ones capable of execution, if the system of penalties now in force is discontinued immediately. Germany also asks for freedom of trade.

BERLIN, April 26.—Germany is willing to assume the allied obligations to the United States, in the event the United States, and the allies so desire, to the extent of her ability to pay.

A clause in Germany's counter proposals on the reparations question proposes that Germany take care of the debt which the allies owe the United States, if

such arrangement can be agreed upon between the United States and the allies. This was learned definitely today from the German note forwarded to Washington.

SOLDIERS AT FT. MCINTOSH ENGAGE IN SPORT EVENTS

LAREDO, April 26.—The soldiers of the Seventeenth Infantry stationed at Fort McIntosh, have a swimming pool and have announced several swimming events, including a 50 yard dash, a 100 yard dash, and a 200 yard relay race.

Other sports are announced at the fort, including the occasional cross country hikes, target practice for both rifle and pistol and games in the gymnasium. Football teams will be organized in the fall.

SLIGHT DIPHTHERIA SCARE IN SCHOOLS

The first grade rooms in the local schools were dismissed Monday when it developed that a child sent home sick from school last Thursday had diphtheria. The child of Mr. and Mrs. L. Williams was taken ill at school last Thursday, and later the trouble was pronounced diphtheria. The rooms were thoroughly disinfected, and the parents notified to keep watch for symptoms of the disease and school resumed in the primary Tuesday. The sick child is reported to be getting along nicely.

Ollie Steele went to San Angelo Monday to attend Federal court, returning on the afternoon train.

GOV. HOBBY'S MOTHER DEAD

DALLAS, April 26.—Mrs. Dora Hobby, mother of former Governor Hobby, died here at her home this afternoon. All members of the family were with her when she died. She will be buried in Dallas, but funeral arrangements have not been announced.

MELON GROWERS TO MEET HERE THURSDAY

Farm Agent Eaton has called a meeting of the melon growers of this county to convene at the court house in Ballinger next Thursday afternoon. The meeting will deal chiefly with the marketing problem.

In view of the fact that cotton is a drug on the market, and the farmers are casting about for something to raise for which there will be a good demand, it is expected that a large acreage will be planted in melons this year, if the seasons are favorable.

There is such a thing as glutting the market with melons, but the famous Ballinger melons have always found an outlet where the production was large enough to attract buyers from the larger cities.

The Ballinger melon crop matures late in the season and after the crop in other sections is out of the way, and this creates a greater demand for the Ballinger melon.

All those who are interested in raising watermelons are urged to be present at the meeting next Thursday.

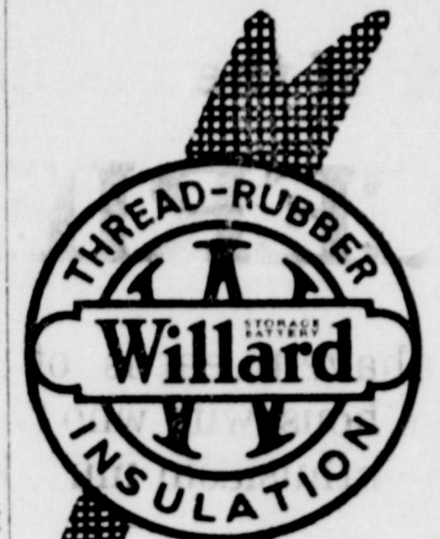

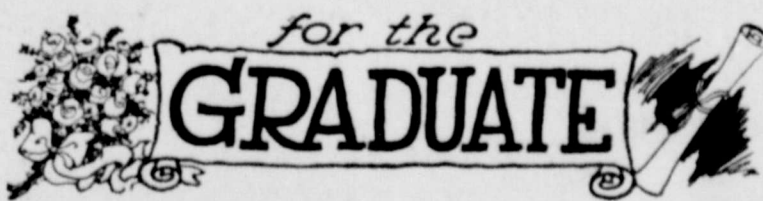

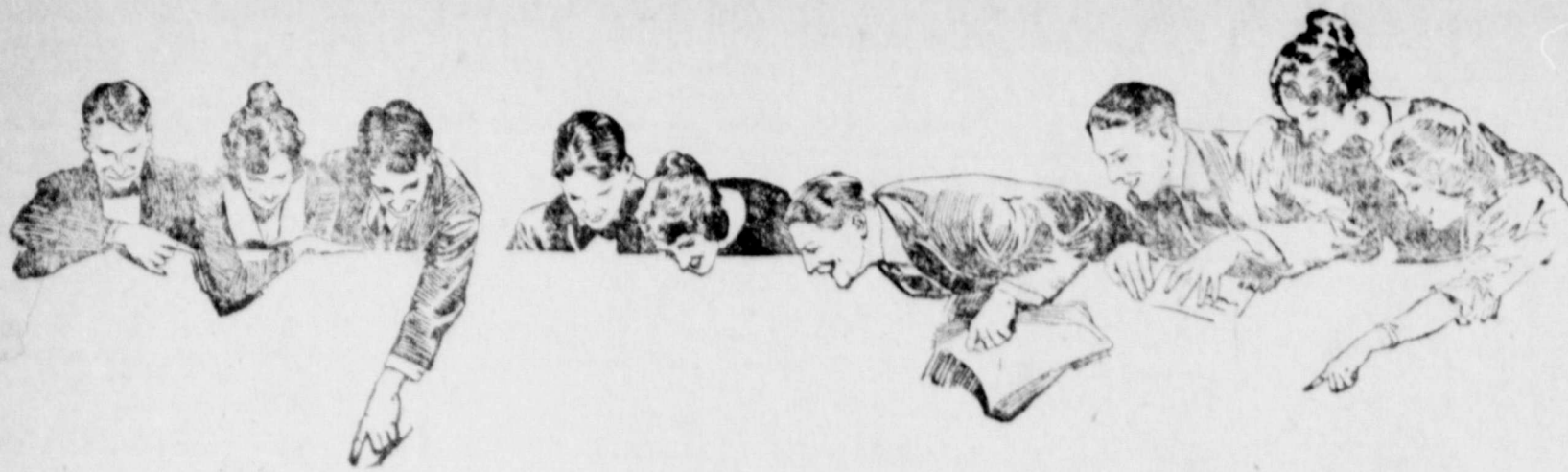
