## HARDING VIEWS ATLANTIC FLEET

OLD POINT COMFORT, Va., April 28.—The Atlantic Fleet, bringing back a new record of accomplishment from its Southern drill grounds, passed in ceremonial review before President Harding today as it entered home waters in Hampton Roads. More than sixty ships were led by the flagship Pennsylvania in the column that filed by to pay the commander-in-chief's honors to President Harding as he stood with Secretary Denby and party of officials on the bridge of the president's yacht Mayflower.

A low cloud curtain screened the sunlight from the pageant, softening the grim lines of deck turret, adding a tint of dusk's sombre picture.

The crews of the big vessels lined the rails in living walls of blue as the fighting crafts passed. Marine guards quarter-decked on each vessel when opposite the Mayflower and snapped to "present arms," while the bands played the opening bars of the Star Spangled Banner.

This was Mr. Harding's first review of any part of the nation's sea power since he assumed office and it was the navy's first opportunity to salute him.

ABOARD THE MAYFLOWER, April 28.—In a little more than an hour after the flagship passed the Mayflower, the last submarine in line slipped by and the big fleet anchored in the Roads. The Mayflower lifted anchor and joined the armada, President and Mrs. Harding going aboard the flagship Pennsylvania, where they held a reception for officers of the fleet.

## RABBIT DRIVE AND BIG PICNIC

Citizens North of Ballinger will form a line for a big rabbit drive Thursday, May 5th, according to Clarence Routh, who phoned The Ledger to advertise the event, and to extend to all the citizens—men and women—an invitation to help make the day the big event of the rabbit extermination season.

The program provides for the men to meet at the Clarence Routh farm just East of the city Thursday morning, and in the forenoon the drive will be made up the creek to the picnic grounds in the bend of Elm Creek on the W. T. Routh place just below the Runnels crossing.

The women are requested to meet at the picnic grounds with their lunch baskets loaded in time to have dinner ready for the hungry hunters, and Clarence Routh will supplement the basket lunches with the fatted calf. There will be barbecue to mix with the good things the women bring in the baskets.

After noon the men will make another rabbit drive North of the A. & S. railroad. Rabbits are declared to be thick in this territory. In fact they are too thick for the best interests of crops, and the men are expected to be on hand with their guns, and a few hundred hares will be slaughtered before the picnic feature of the day is put on. Remember the day, Thursday, May 5th, and send the women to the picnic grounds and get in the drive with your gun. There will be sport in shooting rabbits and a good picnic dinner.

RICHMOND, April 28.—Fred Absolon was found guilty of the murder of Cashier Kirby of the Blue Ridge Bank, and his punishment fixed at life imprisonment. Absolon is alleged to have murdered the cashier when attempting to rob the bank in the daytime, beating him to death with the safe crank.

## HUN METHODS EVASIVE; WON'T BE TOLERATED

LONDON, April 28.—Lloyd George told the House of Commons today that the British government was committed to action so far the Westphalian coal fields are concerned, if the German reparations proposals are unsatisfactory, and adding "it is not for me to say whether another opportunity will be given Germany or not."

LONDON, April 28.—Prime Minister Lloyd George, in speaking before the House of Commons today on Germany's reparations proposals, said, "I very much regret to say they are thoroughly unsatisfactory, and I wish it had been possible for me to say that they alter the situation."

BERLIN, April 29.—A semi-official statement issued here today offered the suggestion that Germany was willing to modify her reparations proposals, if asked to do so by Washington, and that by such action a basis of agreement be reached.

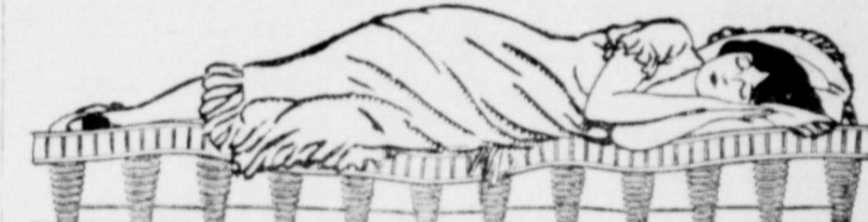

**FANS SEE BEST GAME OF SEASON**

Jack Roach's three bag punch in the ninth inning, followed by good stick work by S. Seroggins and Willeye Wooden saved the record of the Bear Cats for a one thousand per cent standing in the game with the Lometa American Legion boys on the local diamond Wednesday afternoon. It was the best game of the season out of four games played, and was the fourth won by the locals.

Only two errors were charged against the players up to the eighth inning, and neither club had been able to send a man across home plate up to that time. A big goose egg score was looking both contestants in the face for seven innings, which were played fast and furious.

In the eighth, Murray for the Lometa boys was first up, and connected with the horse hide apple for a two bag chase. A. Greer followed with a hit. Pipkin came next, scoring Murray, and breaking the visitors' goose egg. Greer who had reached second while Murray scored, was thrown out by the pitcher while trying to steal third, and Pipkin went out when third passed the ball on to second, the double play cutting the chances for further scoring at this stage of the game, and a pop up by the next man at the bat retired the side.

The Bear Cats worked hard to get around, but the outs and ins alternated by drops by Lively, who was in the box for the Legionnaires, backed by almost perfect fielding, held the Bear Cats back for eight innings. It was the ninth before the locals found Lively's bullets.

With the game looking like a one to nothing for the visitors, the Bear Cats filed in from the field to get their last chance in the ninth. Roach reached for the first one Lively sent over the plate, but failed to connect. The second ball was flattened out with a heavy jolt from the big stick, and Roach paced to third base while the left fielder chased the ball to deep left field.

Stits Seroggins got a pretty hit to first, while Roach came in home for the tie score. Seroggins was stealing second in the meantime, and had a close call when he plunged into the second baseman who dropped the ball, after making a perfect fielding. The ump's decision in calling Seroggins safe brought a howl from the Lometa visitors. Wooden stepped up and made first on an error and Seroggins leaped home while second baseman was playing for Wooden on first, and the fans gave the victory yell, and the game ended with the most enthusiastic shout of the season.

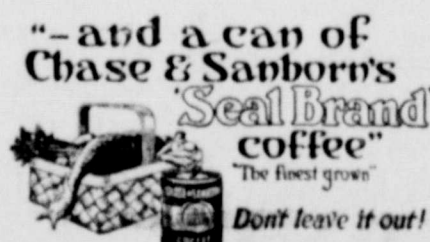

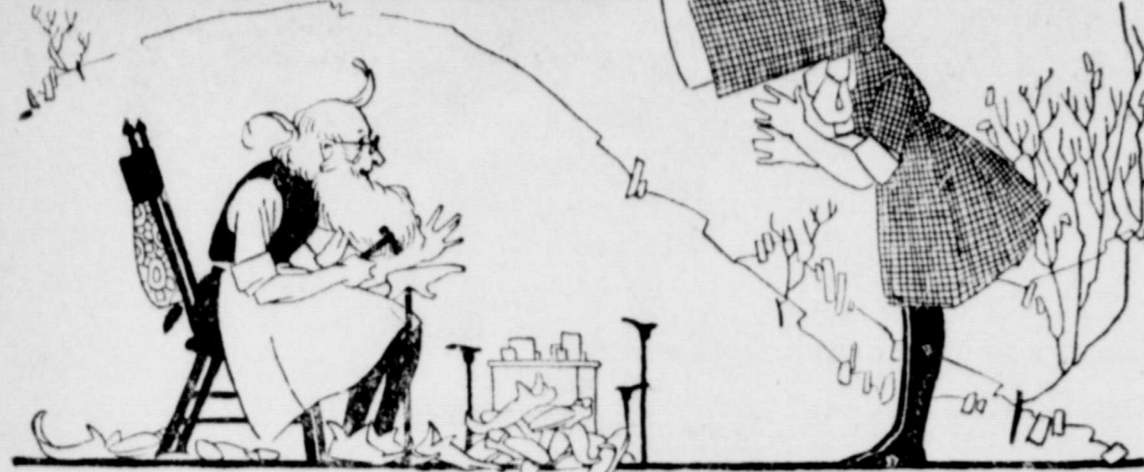

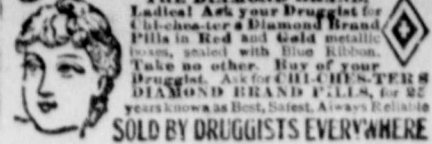
