CARNEGIE HERO MEDALS AWARDED

PITTSBURGH, Pa., April 30.—Twenty-three acts of heroism were recognized by the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission in awards announced here today. In two cases silver medals were awarded in twenty-one cases bronze medals. Five of the heroes lost their lives and to the dependents of three of them pensions aggregating \$1,920 a year were granted while to the dependents of one of these and of one other whose life was lost the sum of \$2,500 was granted to be applied as the Commission may sanction.

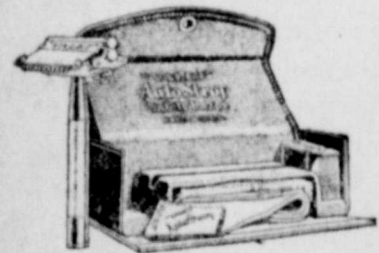
In addition to these money grants in nine cases, awards aggregating \$14,400 were appropriated for educational purposes, and in six cases awards aggregating \$5,500 were made for other worthy purposes.

GERMAN TREATY TO FOLLOW PEACE

WASHINGTON, April 30.—Senator Lodge told the Senate today that a treaty with Germany would probably follow the enactment of the Knox peace resolution. Speaking in support of the peace measure the Republican leader declared that the president and state department had made it clear that the United States does not intend to "abandon the allies."

ADVISES BERLIN TO ACCEPT TERMS

LONDON, April 30.—The French delegation in the meeting of the supreme allied council received information that unofficial American advisors in Berlin are urging the members of the German cabinet to accept the allied terms as laid down in the agreement which reached Paris last January. In this agreement the allies demanded two hundred and twenty-six billion gold marks, and in addition also demanded the right to collect 12 per cent export tax on German goods.

LONDON, April 30.—The allied supreme council met here at four o'clock this afternoon to begin the consideration of measures to be applied in connection with the German reparations situation. The meeting is being held at the official residence of Premier Lloyd George.

MAKING EFFORT TO AVERT STRIKE

WASHINGTON, April 30.—Under agreement with the marine workers' representatives, Secretary Davis this afternoon urged President Harding to appoint a committee of three to mediate the dispute between ship owners and workers. President Harding declined to act at present and is reserving judgment in the case.

WASHINGTON, April 30.—Representatives of the Marine Workers Union were told today at the White House that President Harding would take up with his cabinet the matter of mediation in the wage dispute with a view of preventing the threatened strike tomorrow on American ships on Atlantic, Pacific, and Gulf coasts.

The department of labor interested itself in the controversy today and it is understood that Secretary Davis is prepared to ask that the department be authorized to use its good office in the event the executive decided not to appoint a special board of mediation.

MACSWINEY'S BROTHER MAKES HIS ESCAPE

CORK, Ireland, April 30.—Sean MacSwiney, brother of the late Lord Mayor of Cork, with two other Sinn Feiners, escaped today from the Spike Island internment camp. The three men overpowered the guards while working outside the fort and seized a motor boat on shore and made their escape.

DALLAS LOSES IN PHONE RATE CASE

DALLAS, April 30.—The recent order of Federal Judge Wilson, restraining the city of Dallas from interfering with the increased telephone rates in this city, was affirmed yesterday by the Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans.

MACON, Ga., April 30.—Thirteen of the men convicted in Federal court here for participation in a conspiracy to rob the American Railway Express Company of goods valued at one mil-

lion dollars, were sentenced to serve terms in the penitentiary today by Federal Judge Evans. In the case of twenty-eight other men connected with the conspiracy, fines amounting to from \$300 to \$3000 were assessed.

71 INDICTED FOR CONSPIRACY

CHICAGO, April 30.—Seventy-one indictments charging corporations, contractors, unions, and individuals, with conspiracy to restrain building operations in Chicago, were returned here today by the Federal grand jury.

The Parent-Teachers' associations of El Paso, Texas, have started movement to serve hot lunches in all the city's schools, and obtain an ordinance prohibiting sales of confections near the school grounds.

B. F. Forbes, of Chillicothe, Texas, has donated to that city a tourist park on the Colorado-to-Gulf Highway, to be known as Forbes Park. The park is equipped with braziers and wood piles and will have fresh water, roasting pits, tables, benches and tent sites.

Altho grapes are little grown in Texas, few states have vineyards bearing as prolifically as those near Ft. Worth, according to H. W. Means, agricultural agent for Tarrant county. In showing the value of growing grapes in Texas, the farm agent pointed out that one grower in Tarrant county, in 1917, sold the crop from one acre for \$1,000.

TEXAS NEWS BRIEFS

DENISON—Construction of an automobile tourists' camp here has begun. Buildings and equipment will be completed within ten days, the chamber of commerce announced.

BROWNSVILLE—Two large engines have been leased from the M. K. & T. railroad by the Mexican National system and will be used on the Matamoros-Monterey division. The engines passed thru the Brownsville customs house.

DALLAS—C. O. Moser, secretary of the Texas Farm Bureau Federation, outlined the federation's cotton marketing plan at the national cotton marketing conference at Memphis, Tenn., recently.

LAREDO—Upon receipt of the news that an oil "strike" had been made about 50 miles from Laredo, the county commissioners have decided to grade and clear the road leading to the field and to make it passable for traffic.

MORAN—Moran, thru its chamber of commerce, is seeking oats to replace those that have died recently. Nearly all of the Moran oats, used in exterminating rats, have died and more are needed, the chamber announced.

CLEBURNE—Cato Sells, former Indian commissioner, is now a citizen of Texas, where he will "pitch his tent." Mr. Sells announced, when he returned to his home here, that he was "a citizen-at-large of Texas, looking for a place to pitch my tent." He said he had not decided where he would resume his business as a banker.

GALVESTON—The release of Maurice Archdeacon by the Boston Braves to the Rochester club of the International league, caused surprise to Galveston fans. Archdeacon, while in training here, was thought to have won a safe berth with Mitchell's team.

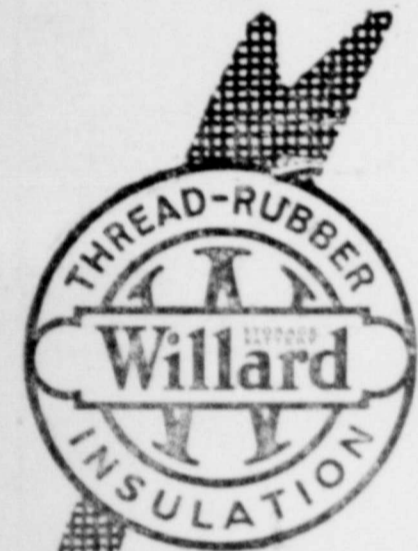

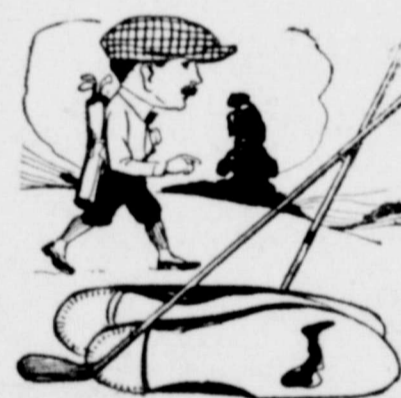
KILLED WHILE PLAYING BANDIT

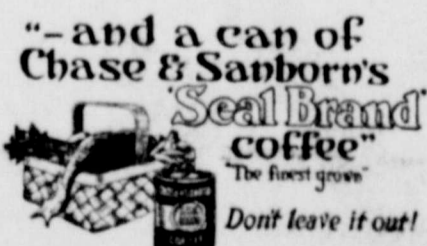

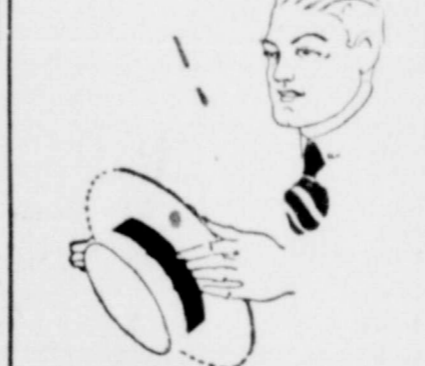

MERCHANTS FOR BIRTHDAY PICNIC

At its meeting Friday evening the Retail Merchants Association passed a resolution endorsing the move to observe the Thirty-fifth anniversary of this city on June 29th, and pledged their financial and moral support to the undertaking.

This action came when Secretary Williams of the Y. M. B. L., asked the Association to take some action on the matter, as the question had been up for discussion before the business league and also before the American Legion, and each organization had "passed the buck" to the Retail Merchants Association.
