POLES IN FIGHT WITH GERMANS

WARSAW, Poland, May 4.—The insurrectionary movement in upper Silesia, which began Monday night, spread rapidly in the districts of Beuthen, Pless, Bybnik and Tarnowitz, according to newspaper reports today.

Polish civilian fighting organizations occupied Katwitz and other towns after machine gun encounters with Germans, but the French troops finally controlled the situation, according to the latest reports.

Newspaper extras last evening reported eight Poles killed and sixteen wounded, in the Katwitz region, in clashes with Germans.

OPPELN, Upper Silesia, May 4.—Organized Polish forces estimated to number twenty thousand, occupied all of upper Silesia South of the line from Kosel to Tarnowitz, with the exception of a few large towns, and are moving Northward, according to information supplied by a member of the inter-allied representation here.

LONDON, May 4.—Reports that new propositions relative to reparations had been received here from the Germans, and which were current last night, are denied today by Louis Loucheur, French Minister of the Liberated Regions.

GRANTS CHARTER TO MOTHERS

AUSTIN, May 4.—The Mothers' Memorial Association to Texas Boys in the World War was granted a charter by the Secretary of State today. The purpose of the association is to build and equip a soldiers' and sailors' memorial hall at the University of Texas, to be used as a boarding house and lodging place for male students. Headquarters of the association is at San Antonio. Funds will be solicited for the erection of the building.

EXPRESS CO. CUTS WAGES JUNE 1

NEW YORK, May 4.—The American Railway Express Company announced here today that it had notified its eighty thousand employees that a wage revision was being worked out and that the new scale would become effective June first.

KNOCKS OUT TEETH; GETS THREE YEARS

AUSTIN, May 4.—Knocking out three of W. K. Choate's front teeth and dancing his head up and down on the sidewalk, cost Horace Keith, of Kaufman county dearly. Keith was tried in the district court of Kaufman county and given a five year sentence, and the Court of Criminal Appeals here today affirmed the lower court's decision.

FRENCH OBSERVE DEATH NAPOLEON

PARIS, May 4.—France today began a two day observance of the centenary of the death of Napoleon Bonaparte. At five-thirty Thursday afternoon, a salvo of artillery at the Invalides will mark the passing of the century since the death of the great warrior, and will close the exercises which are being carried out in observing the event.

Memorial services, are being held today at the Notre Dame cathedral. Cardinal Dubois, archbishop of Paris, presided, and a great throng heard the famous requiem mass of Berlioz with more than five hundred voices taking part.

MAY CALL FOR DISARMAMENT MEETING

WASHINGTON, May 4.—An impending fight in the Senate against the administration's desire to defer consideration of naval disarmament proposals was forecasted today by the re-introduction by Senator Borah, Republican from Idaho, of his resolution to authorize and request the president to call the representatives of Great Britain and Japan into a disarmament conference.

Willingham, chief justice of Precinct No. 1, will make headquarters in the sheriff's office at the court house, and is already comfortably located and ready to accept pleas of guilty and mete out justice to the transgressors. Judge Willingham declines to office alone, saying it is too lonely, but the J. P.'s big court room will be open for the trial of all cases coming up in that court.

WASHINGTON, May 4.—The Interstate Commerce Commission today ordered that the Texas state rate case be reopened, for the purpose of considering the priority rates on cotton and lint in Texas. The date of the hearing was fixed for May 9th before Examiner Healy at Austin.

UNCLE SAM WANTS POSTOFFICE SITE

Postmaster Erwin is compiling the necessary information for the authorities of the postoffice department who will have in hand the building of a government building here for a post-office. This is being done at the request of the postoffice department, as a bill is pending in Congress providing for a \$50,000 appropriation for the construction of such a building. Such bill has been offered from time to time for several sessions of the national congress, but the amount asked for by Congressman Blanton is more in keeping with the needs of this city, and it seems that prospects are better than ever before for the passage of such a measure.

A site on the South corner of the court house square seems to be the most popular location for the new building, and comes nearer meeting the requirements than any other available site. This site could probably be furnished without cost to the government.

Other sites mentioned include the old White City lot on Seventh Street, the Miller corner near the Santa Fe passenger station, the vacant lot across the street from Lankford's furniture store on Eighth Street, the Ike Woodson corner on Eighth Street, and lots have been offered North of the Santa Fe.

Most all these sites come within the limit of distance from the stations, and any of them would be acceptable perhaps, and if the bill passes, it will be up to the inspector to select a site from those offered.

SHIRLEY SHIELDS IN HOSPITAL HERE

Mr. and Mrs. Shirley Shields arrived here from Abilene Tuesday at noon, and at five o'clock Tuesday afternoon Mr. Shields went on the table at the Halley & Love sanitarium for an appendicitis operation. The operation was successfully performed, and the last reports from the hospital stated that Mr. Shields was getting along as well as could be expected, so far having suffered no unusual effects from the operation. It was the second attack of this trouble he had experienced, having suffered an attack about two weeks ago.

HUNG JURY FOR YOUNG BOND THIEF

CHICAGO, May 4.—The jury in the case of William Dalton, the sixteen year old bank clerk who stole \$772,000 worth of Liberty bonds from the bank where he was employed recently, failed to reach an agreement and was discharged today after deliberating nearly twenty-four hours.

It is said that about half of the jurors were in favor of acquittal of the self-confessed thief. Dalton escaped with the bonds, but was arrested in a nearby city a day or two after he stole the bonds, and the bank paid a reward of \$25,000 for his arrest and recovery of the bonds.

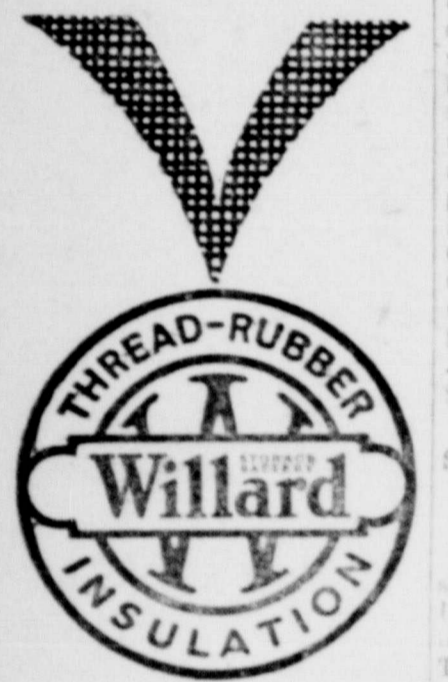

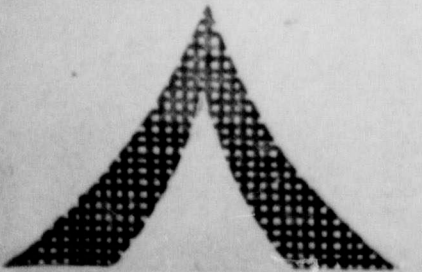

FERGUSON BANK CLOSES DOOR

TEMPLE, Tex., May 4.—Much to the surprise of the public the Temple State Bank closed its doors at noon yesterday. Jas. E. Ferguson, president of the institution immediately issued a statement declaring that all depositors will be paid off in full.

Mr. Ferguson alleges that a lack of co-operation on the part of the State Banking and Insurance Commission at Austin in failing to approve financial assistance was responsible for the breakdown. This coupled with the unexpected heavy drain on the bank is said to have forced the bank to close its doors.

Other Temple banks offered to aid the Temple State Bank to the amount of \$45,000 for a short period on approved securities. Before the arrangement was closed, however, notice of the proposed help was made known to the banking commissioner at Austin, who expressed his disapproval of this course, and the bank closed.

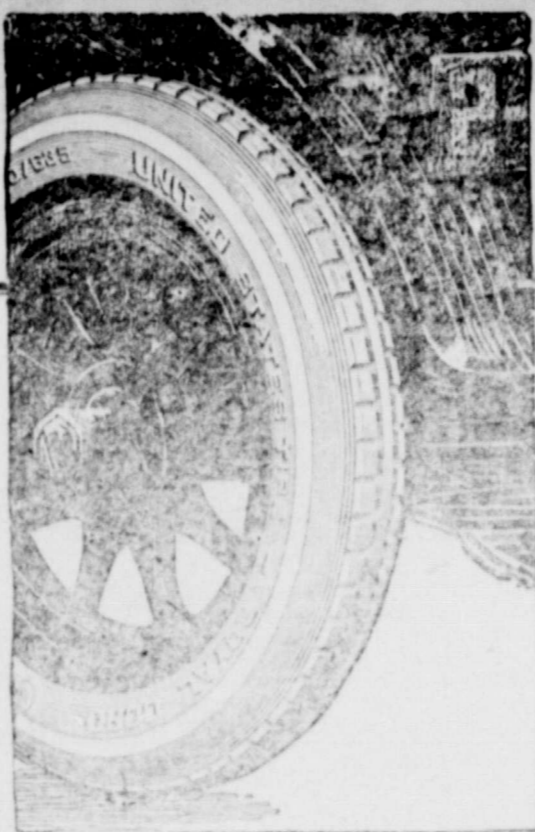

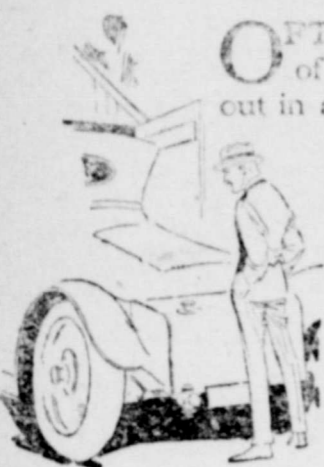

CHARGES FILED AGAINST 2 HERE

Jim Price and Paul Best were placed in jail here Wednesday morning by Rowena officers following the filing of both felony and misdemeanor charges against the two young men, and after they had spent the greater part of the night in the calaboose at Rowena.

Constable Ed Lehr and Justice of the Peace C. R. Roesler, of Rowena, brought the two young men to Ballinger early Wednesday morning, and they were placed in the Ballinger jail pending the adjustment of complaints filed against them.

Both Price and Best were charged in the justice court with disturbing the peace at Rowena. Best plead guilty to the charges and paid his fine, and he was again placed in jail charged with transporting and possessing intoxicating liquor in violation of the Dean prohibition act. The charges of disturbing the peace of Rowena are still pending against Price, and he was also held in jail charged with possessing and transporting liquor.

It is alleged in the complaint that Price and Best were in the possession of intoxicants when placed under arrest in Rowena Wednesday night. It is not charged that they were trying to dispose of the booze, but the charges allege possessing and transporting.

Bonds in the sum of \$500 in each case was fixed, and Best made bond and was released, while up to a late hour Wednesday Price had not made bond.

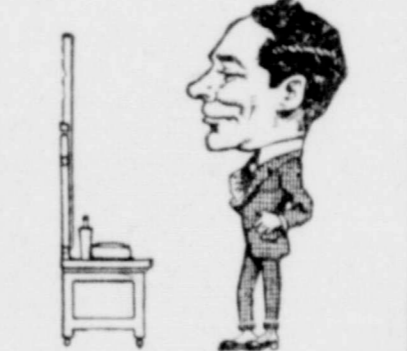
