

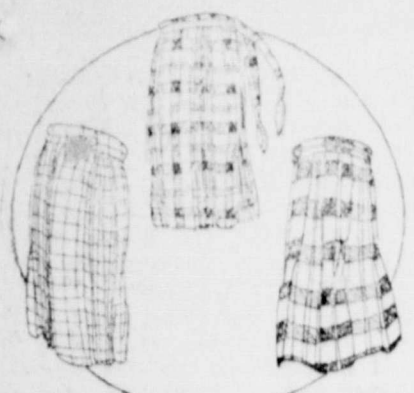

NEFF CALLS ON PRISON BOARD MAN TO RESIGN

AUSTIN, May 17.—Governor Neff has asked W. G. Pryor, member of the prison commission, for his resignation. He did so in a letter sent to Mr. Pryor last Saturday, and which was made public today.

Gov. Neff stated in the letter that "the best interests of the State will be served by your tendering to me your resignation as prison commissioner. The work of the penitentiary can be better carried out by having the prison commission entirely in harmony with my administration. You are not in sympathy with me personally, politically or officially. You are out of harmony with my ideas of public service. Your permitting me to name some well qualified person to your position will place the responsibility where it belongs. Things are happening in the penitentiary which ought not to happen. It is of deep concern to me that the institution controlled in part by those not in sympathy with my plans and who predicted failure of my administration."

U. S. POPULATION NOW 105,710,620

WASHINGTON, May 17.—Final statistics placing the total population of continental United States at 105,710,620, was submitted today to Speaker Gillette by Director Stuart of the Census Bureau.

MAN CHARGED WITH BURGLARY

Frank Morris, age 23, was placed in jail here Sunday on a charge of burglary, and later confessed to robbing a store at Wingate. He will be held pending the action of the grand jury, unless he is able to make bond.

The young man states that his home is San Saba, and he claims in his confession that he was en route home from Oklahoma traveling in a wagon, when he committed the robbery.

About midnight last Saturday night someone entered the store of W. L. Spruiell, at Wingate. Sunday morning Morris was found camped on the creek near Wingate and the officers searched his camp and recovered about \$60.00 worth of goods stolen from the Spruiell store. The goods included groceries, clothing, etc.

In his confession Morris stated that he was broke, and had to have something to eat, but the booty recovered showed that he stole not only things to eat, but eight suits of underwear, a sack of flour, and can goods, and other articles.

Mr. Spruiell recently engaged in the mercantile business at Wingate, buying the bankrupt stock of goods of R. Madera.

GOVERNOR PARDONS MAN TO TESTIFY IN ROWAN CASE

AUSTIN, May 17.—Gov. Neff today granted three full petitions and restoration of citizenship to W. S. Scrivner, the confessed accomplice in the Dallas postoffice robbery and an escaped convict. The pardons were mailed to District Attorney Maury Hughes at Abilene today where Albert L. Rowan, alleged "master mind" in the robbery, is on trial for the murder of G. W. Street, a post office employe, who was killed in the robbery.

The pardons were not signed by the governor until early today when Secretary Walthall carried them to the governor's mansion for his signature. Mr. Walthall then returned with them and exhibited them to newspaper men at the capitol. He also exhibited copies of the governor's reasons for granting the pardons.

Governor Neff is remaining at the bedside of his mother, who is critically ill, and expected to pass out at any time.

Scrivner was at large at the time of the Dallas sub-postal station robbery, and was returned to the penitentiary after being arrested for connection with the robbery. The states attorney petitioned the governor to pardon him in order that he might be used as a witness against Rowan in the murder charge. Scrivner will be held in the Federal court for the post office robbery.

ABILENE, May 17.—After Scrivner had been on the stand two hours, Judge Ely announced that his testimony would be withdrawn from the jury for the present, and he asked the jury not to consider it at this stage of the trial.

AUSTIN, May 17.—W. S. Scrivner's pardon is the first granted by Gov. Neff since he was inaugurated governor of Texas. In granting the pardons Gov. Neff pointed out that Scrivner had been convicted in the Federal court with complicity in the post office robbery, but had not been sentenced. He also said that District Attorney Maury Hughes, of Dallas, had assured him as "one officer to another," that he has a confession from Scrivner that will convict him of another felony which carries a life sentence, and that the district attorney had assured him that Scrivner will plead guilty to this offense with the view of accepting punishment at life imprisonment.

The governor said that he had satisfied himself that Scrivner will not escape confinement by the pardons he had granted him, and he said "to refuse to grant the pardons would be to close the mouth of one who is alleged to know the facts in the noted murder trial."

ABILENE, May 17.—When the second day of the trial of

Albert Rowan opened in district court here today, the first witness placed on the stand was W. S. Scrivner, chief witness for the state and co-defendant of Rowan's in the post office robbery trial.

The defense made a bitter fight in an attempt to prevent Scrivner's testimony from going to the jury, but the objection was overruled by Judge Ely, who said that if later it developed Scrivner was an incompetent witness that his testimony would be withdrawn.

PARTIALLY REMOVE TAX ON GERMAN MADE GOODS

GALVESTON, May 16.—Certificates of origin, designed to permit entry into the United Kingdom of articles manufactured in the United States but partly of German origin, without the payment of the 50 per cent tax levied by the allied governments upon German products, are to be issued exporters by various British consulates throughout the United States. J. E. Bell, British consul here, announced today.

The 50 per cent tax on German products, Mr. Bell said, went into effect March 31, all manufactured articles from Germany being assessed under its far reaching provisions. The certificates of origin, Mr. Bell added, are to be attached to the regular bills of lading.

NO COTTON FOR PINK BOLL WORM

WASHINGTON, May 17.—The establishment of non-cotton zones in the pink boll worm infested areas of West Texas and New Mexico was recommended today to Secretary Wallace by a conference of representatives of the cotton growing states in a meeting here.

It was also recommended that Mexico be asked to co-operate in a campaign for the extermination of the pink worm by establishing similar zones.

GET O. K. BEFORE OPENING YOUR POCKET-BOOK

The authorities in this city are doing their best to keep out grafters and unworthy objects of charity. Mayor Guin stated Monday that the people should not contribute pennilessly to every "grafter" who came along. The public is requested to stop long enough to find out whether their money is going to a good cause, or going towards keeping up some grafter, when they are called on by strangers representing maternity homes, rescue homes, orphanages, etc.

Hereafter the city authorities, or the charity board will investigate any proposition of this character presented to them, and if they find it worthy they will place their O. K. on same and the promoter can then go out and get whatever he can. If transients, or locals, call on you for funds in the interest of any charitable proposition, ask them for their endorsement; if they cannot show it, pass them up.

It will be an easy matter for parties representing any worthy proposition to get an O. K. from the local authorities, and if they cannot convince the authorities that their proposition is worthy they are not entitled to the support of the public.

The Ledger would not say anything that would cause anyone to withhold their support from any worthy object of charity, or benevolent cause, but there are entirely too many grafters drifting over the country, fleecing the sympathetic contributor out of funds which should go to help some unfortunate.

The matter can be handled so that all worthy causes can get a hearing before the Ballinger giving public, and at the same time the grafters given to understand that they cannot operate here. Cooperate with the local authorities in this—find out what you are giving for and to whom you are giving before you give.

Rep. C. R. Stephens Gives His View On Truck Law

Editor Ledger: There was enacted a law at the regular session of the present Legislature, placing a special tax on commercial trucks. This act, which goes into effect June 12th, provides for a registration fee on trucks of: "2001 to 4000 pounds capacity of \$30.00. "4001 to 6000 pounds capacity of \$50.00. "6001 to 8000 pounds capacity of \$80.00. "8001 to 10,000 pounds capacity of \$120.00.

In addition to the above, a mileage tax of 1-2-3 and 5 cents is imposed. This bill passed the Senate without a dissenting vote and passed the House by 69 for to 33 against it. In the passage of this bill the policy of the State is fixed as recognizing that the public roads belong to all of the people and that no individual or particular class of individuals should be permitted to use them in a manner that would cause unusual wear to the roads for their own convenience or profit without being required to make some compensation for damages done.

Many millions of dollars have been spent in Texas the past few years and other millions will be spent each year in the future for building and the upkeep of a system of good roads.

There has been a race on between the public and truck makers, the public striving to construct roads that will hold up the largest trucks; the manufacturer building heavier and still heavier trucks of tonnage capacity limited only to the point where the truck will not actually break through the highest type of road—the results are the trucks are winning the race, and road builders will have to concede defeat, acknowledging no road can be built that will withstand the heavy pounding of the ponderous trucks—abandon the road building and road upkeep programme, turn the people, who have contributed so much toward improving our highways, loose to flounder thru mud, over rocks and gullies, or else spend additional millions of the tax payers money to keep up the constant and increasing repairs, made necessary by the trucks.

The object of the law is first, to fix the tax so high on extra heavy trucks as to discourage their use; second, to require a small tax on the lighter trucks of over one ton capacity to pay for at least a part of the damage to the roads.

Trucks are destructive to public roads, go here in our own county upon any main road and you will see great deep ruts or the scars of ruts made many months before by trucks. We have in Runnels county but few trucks; the damage they do to the roads at present is not great; but in the more populous counties and in the oil fields the damage done to the roads is tremendous, in some instances beyond the ability of the county to repair.

The conscientious legislator in forming laws, loses sight of individuals and looks to the prosperity, happiness and protection of the masses.

No law placed upon the statutes, but that certain individuals or classes feel they have been discriminated against or unjustly treated, this is the humbly selfish interest asserting itself. If we could only put aside self interest and look at public questions from the other fellow's viewpoint, often we would not be so quick to complain and criticize.

A movement has been started in Texas by the citizens of a town in which there is a truck factory and joined in by truck owners to have the coming called session of the Legislature recall this new truck law.

I have endeavored in the past and it shall be my aim in the future to represent in the Legislature, not individuals or any particular group of individuals, but what I think is the wish of the majority of the citizens of my district.

I have heard from the truck owners in thunderous tones, they represent perhaps two or three per cent of our population. I desire very much to hear from the other 97 or 98 per cent of our people—farmers, merchants, bankers, professional men; you are all interested or should be, in this subject, please let me know your views, that I may carry out your wishes, should this subject be submitted by the governor.

HERE TO SHOW POWER FARMING

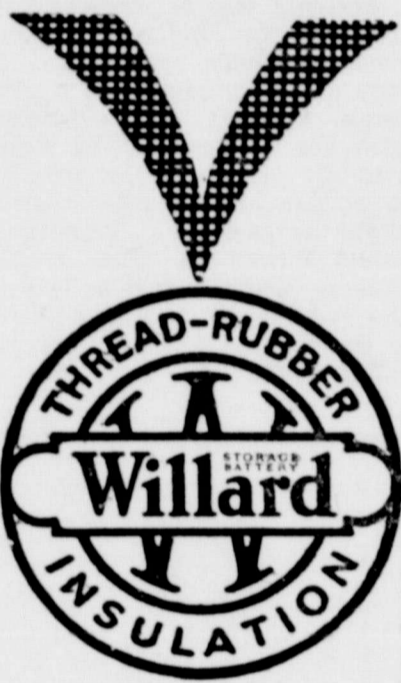

GALVESTON, May 17.—Two 24-foot lifeboats, equipped for sailing, have been placed at the disposal of Galveston's troop of Sea Scouts by the United States Shipping Board. 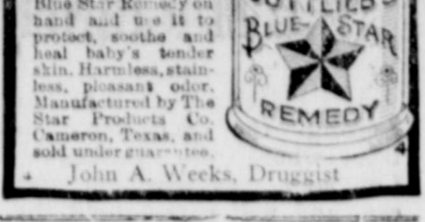
Good work at the bat and on the paths has made work easy for the pitchers, the team averaging almost 7 runs to the game.
