The three men were returning to the city from the Country Club in a car belonging to Henry J. Ryan, of Indianapolis, the national director of the Legion's Americanism Commissi on. Rvan and Milton J. Foreman of Chicago, who were also in the car, were both injured

The shooting took place at the front gate of the Benge place on the ranch.
