

Clarence Ransbarger, the eleven year old son of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Ransbarger, was bitted by a rattlesnake at ten o'clock Monday morning, and died at eleventhirty, one hour and a half later, while en route to Bal-

Clarence, with an older brother, was out in the pasture about a half mile from the Ransbarger home in the Concho country, when the snake did its deadly work. The boys were hunting, and the boy walked up on the snake without warning. Simultaneously with its danger signal the poisonous serpent sent its fangs into the unfortunate boy's ankle.

Realizing the seriousness of the atuation the boy was hurriedly carried to the house by his brother, and the race against death was started when the father attempted to reach Ballinger with his dying boy, where he hoped to get medical aid.

In no case did the farmer rehis cotton loose. He only re- 13-itd-* ceived a promise to deliver-a contract for bonds to the amount of certain value, and so far no banker, financier, or anybody else, has been found who can determine the value of the bonds.

In almost every case where a deal was made, the bond peddler lost no time in getting possession of the cotton, and generally informed the farmer that he would save him the trouble and expense of making delivery of the cotton and would send a

truck for it. Two deals, one aggregating about twenty bales of cotton and another about twenty-four bales of cotton had been put over, but before full possession of the cotton had passed into the hands of the bond peddler, the farmers falling for the trade, acted upon advice of friends and refused to deliver the cotton.

It seems that the man with the German bonds to trade for cotton selects as his probable customers, farmers of German descent, realizing no doubt, that possible sympathy for the Fatherland will aid in floating the se curities. While headquarter was established in Ballinger, the field selected for the work was in the Rowena country.

There is an organization Ballinger known as the Y. M. B L. which makes it its business to look into such proposition which present themselves here from time to time, and any prop osition which smacks of graft is promptly and unceremoniously outlawed.

The eards were declared to be stacked when the above proposition was placed on the table here Saturday afternoon, and farmers who now trade their cotton for German bonds will have no one to kick but themselves when the final summing up of the receipts from the cotton crop






