HORRIBLE ACCIDENT ON SANTA FE CUT OFF

SWEETWATER, June 20 .- A. W. Hartzog, a farmer 34 years old, who was killed Thursday afternoon by a special train on the SEAPLANE WRECK Santa Fe near Herndon, was buried here yesterday. The train, an engine and a passenger coach, running extra to Sweetwater to take a load of Chinese colonists en route from the West coast to Cuba under bond, was running between 50 and 60 miles an hour, trainmen say.

Mr. Hartzog was returning his home from Sweetwater in his car after obtaining some medicine for a sick member of his family. The train struck his auto squarely as he drove on the track, hurling it 200 yards from the crossing. The man's body was thrown over 100 feet, it falling face downward on the track.
