## QUIET JULY 4TH FOR PRESIDENT

SOMERVILLE, N. J., June 24.—President Harding will not speak at any Fourth of July exercises this year but will pass the holiday quietly at the Hill summer home of Senator Joseph S. Frelinghuysen, between here and Raritan. The following announcement was made at the Frelinghuysen home today: "President Harding is coming for rest and recreation and requests that he be allowed to quietly enjoy it. He will play golf on Saturday and Monday and on Sunday will attend church at the Third Reform Church of Raritan. No visitors will be permitted to see the president. There will be no speeches by him July Fourth, and it is requested that all demonstrations be avoided."

## GRAND JURY AT WORK ON CORNELL CASE

DEL RIO, June 23.—All members of the Val Verde county grand jury are in Del Rio and witnesses were being summoned Wednesday and Thursday to appear Friday when the body will be reconvened to probe the fatal shooting here Monday night of W. T. O. Holman, prominent ranchman.

It was considered unlikely last night that Judge James Cornell of Sonora will be brought before the grand jury. He is under a \$5,000 bond for his appearance before the investigators, which was furnished at Brackettville, following the serving of a warrant, issued by Justice J. J. Troop, for his arrest in connection with the shooting. Many men were eager to sign the bond, which is considered a mere formality.

Judge Joseph Jones, of the 63rd judicial district whose home is in Del Rio, will charge the grand jury when it reconvenes. About seventy-five witnesses will likely be called. Some of them saw the shots fired that caused Holman's death.

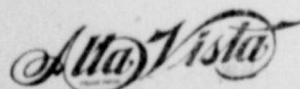

## UNIONS WANT ANOTHER PROBE

DENVER, June 24.—The convention of the American Federation of Labor today adopted a resolution asking President Harding to investigate the strike riots of the Standard Steel Car Co., at Hammond, Indiana, in 1919, and fix the responsibility for the issuing of guns which caused the death of four steel car workers. The resolution charged that the workers were shot down with riot guns furnished by the United States government.

## SANTA FE EMPLOYEE KILLED AT BROWNWOOD

John Bell, an employe of the Santa Fe on the Brownwood section, was ground to pieces Wednesday afternoon about five-thirty o'clock when a hand car on which Bell was returning from his work was run down by a fast freight train. The section crew was going in home from off the road after their day's work, and were traveling at a rapid rate on their handcar, but a heavy freight train was making better time, and with a strong wind blowing in the face of the men on the handcar they did not hear the train coming behind them until it was too late to get out of the way. Three other men on the car escaped by jumping, but Bell slipped in attempting to jump and was thrown in front of the engine and ground to pieces. The tragedy occurred near the city.

## BOLL WEEVIL IS TAKING EVIDENCE EATING UP EAST IN BOUNDARY SUIT

While Runnels and neighboring counties are boll weevil free, no signs of the destructive pests having been reported here, news comes from as near as Brown, Comanche, Eastland, Erath, and other counties in that section of the state, that the weevil is playing havoc with cotton.

Through the black land belt and further East there is considerable complaint, and reports say that in some counties many gins will not be rigged up for work this year, the crop being so short on account of the weevil that a few gins will be able to handle the crop.

In Central Texas and the Red River section of the state the weevil is charged with having practically destroyed the crop in some places. Reports from McLennan, Ellis, Hunt, Williamson, Navarro, and other big cotton counties are very discouraging. In some places the cotton is not blooming, the weevil shooting every square before it can reach the blooming stage.

Similar reports come from Louisiana and the far Eastern part of the state, but the gloomy reports do not seem to have any bullish effect on the market, the market being a weak one with a downward tendency. In good old Runnels county the cotton is growing and putting on faster than the farmers can cultivate it. The crop is reported to be good everywhere with no sign of damage from insects. Grain in most sections of the county is panning out beyond the expectations of the farmers and the feed crops are as good as could be wished for. Prospects were never better here for a corn crop.

Henry Mitchell was in the city Friday from the Winters country. Mr. Mitchell says the cotton crop is running away with itself, and is really growing too fast for the best production. A few weeks dry weather will prove beneficial to the staple.

## TRAIN WRECKED; THREE KILLED MANY MILLIONS IN NAVAL BILL

RELFEST, Ireland, June 24.—A troop train conveying soldiers from Belfast to Dublin was wrecked today near Dundalk by an explosion of a Sinn Fein laid mine. Two soldiers and one train guard were killed, and many wounded.

DUBLIN, June 24.—Eamon de Valera, Irish republican leader, who was arrested Wednesday night near here, was later released, it was definitely established today. There had been earlier denials from the Sinn Fein authorities that he had been apprehended.

## FOUR SENTENCED FOR CONSPIRACY

WASHINGTON, June 24.—Jules Arnstein and four others were sentenced today to two years in the Federal penitentiary by Justice Siddons in the District of Columbia Supreme Court. The men were recently convicted on charges of conspiring to bring stolen securities into the District of Columbia from New York, in October 1919. Arnstein and one of the other parties were also fined \$10,000 each.

## MANY QUERIES SENT HEALTH DEPARTMENT

AUSTIN, June 24.—The state health department is flooded with correspondence regarding the new health laws passed at the regular session of the legislature and which went into effect on June 11th. The greater part of the mail contains applications for licenses to operate beauty parlors and barber shops under the recent law requiring these licenses.

Applications from 27 beauty parlors were received from one city of Texas on one day. That day's mail was the largest in the history of the department, according to Dr. Manton M. Carriek, state health officer. Applications for maternity homes also are received in abundance.

The work of examining restaurant employes, dairy and meat market employes and all other food handlers of Texas, is progressing rapidly, Dr. Carriek said. The law passed requires all such food handlers to have a certificate showing their freedom from contagious or infectious diseases. A number of protests against this law have been received by the department, mostly from employes.

Dr. Carriek said that representatives of his department had found a number of cases of infectious and contagious diseases in the places applicable to the law and that the persons so affected had been offered free treatment in the state clinics.

Texas is one of the four states in the union having a "food handlers" law.

## CROCKETT FUNERAL HELD AT CHURCH

After the friends of deceased had gathered at the home of Mr. and Mrs. L. L. Williams to pay a tribute of respect to the memory of Dave N. Crockett, Thursday afternoon, it was decided to hold the funeral in the Methodist church and the remains were carried to the church, where a large crowd could be accommodated.

Mr. Crockett died at the sanitarium Thursday morning, and the remains were removed to the Williams home on 9th Street, where it was first planned to hold the funeral. Many friends were here, practically every part of the county being represented at the funeral, and a large crowd followed the remains of this good man to the last resting place in Evergreen Cemetery.

Rev. J. L. Speer, of Winters, and Rev. J. D. Kursell, of Norton, Methodist ministers, conducted the funeral services. Deceased was a member of the Methodist church. One who had known Mr. Crockett for many years and had been closely associated with him, in speaking of him said, "Dave Crockett was a good man, and this county has lost one of her best citizens."

HOUSTON, June 24.—Articles of agreement which constitute the first step towards one of the biggest gas marketing propositions the country has seen in several years, was filed in Shreveport today by the Union Power Company and the Fidelity Trust Co., of Houston, according to advices received here.

## TWO DIE IN FALL FROM BUILDING

DALLAS, June 24.—Two men fell today from the Magnolia building, a twenty-nine story structure under construction here and one is dead and the other will die, according to physicians.

A. Hardcastle, an iron worker, fell from the thirteenth story of the building and died while en route to the hospital. M. Hensen, another iron worker, fell from the seventh story of the building, and is still alive, but is fatally injured.

Ed Day is having his home on Broadway painted and otherwise improved. R. E. Lane has just completed reworking his home on Sixth Street throughout inside and out.

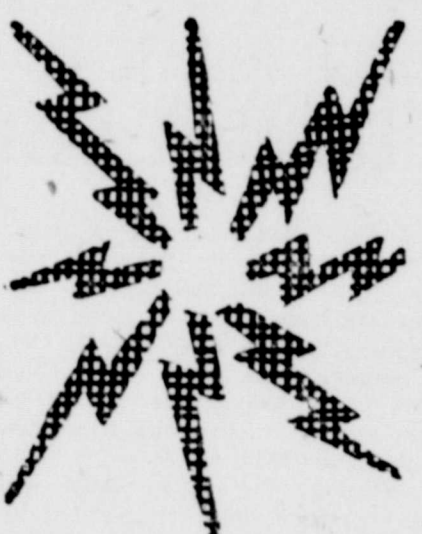

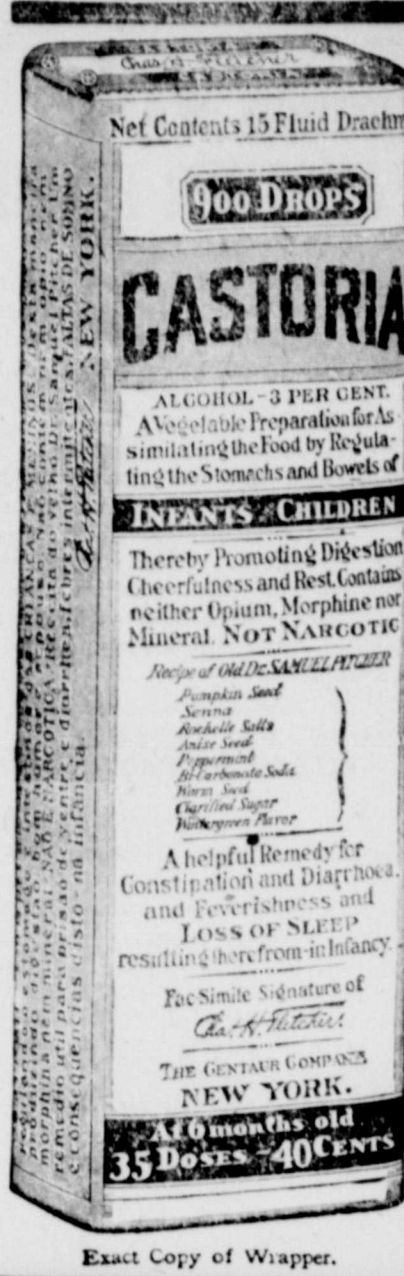
