LIGHT CO. SUES CITY OFFICIALS

Attorneys for plaintiff filed their first amended original petition in the injunction suit filed by the Interstate Electric Corporation against the city of Ballinger, last Saturday afternoon, and which will be called for hearing here by Judge J. O. Woodward Thursday of this week at ten o'clock.

The original petition filed seeks to injoin the city from selling the light and water bonds, in case sale of same are held illegal as prayed for in another suit previously filed by the light com-

The amended petition alleges that the defendants, the city of Ballinger, C. S. Guin, mayor; R. T. Williams and C. A. Doose, commissioners, violated the statutes, and violated the obligation of their oaths, and in fraud of the rights of the tax payers and secretly and illegally sold said bonds for \$10,000 less than par value and accrued interest.



It is estimated on close observation and from general reports, that the cotton crop in Runnels county has deteriorated fifty per cent within the last ten days or two weeks, and unless sufficient rain falls soon the shortage will be greater.

A good feed crop has been made. Late maize and other feed crops will be short, but the best corn ever grown in this county matured early. The eattle range is good and livestock fat, and taking the country as a whole conditions are what

might be termed as fairly good. Some are inclined to treat the deterioration in the cotton crop as a blessing in disguise, and the loss of little consequence. The loss, as we see it, will be heavy to this country, regardless of marketing conditions. While farmers last year booked a loss on their cotton crop, the loss was due to a sudden slump in the market on cotton raised with high priced labor. 
