

**SHORN HEADS PLACATED GODS**

The Bergensfjord arrived here with almost a hairless crew.

**LATIN IS FOUNDATION OF ALL**

**Although a Dead Language, Oregon Professor Asserts You Find It Wherever You Turn.**

"Latin is a living force in daily life and all other studies are in overwhelming debt to it," says Prof. F. S. Dunn, dean of the department of Latin in the University of Oregon, in a bulletin which he has written for the Latin teachers in the high schools and colleges of Oregon.

"The teacher," he says, "must read English from out the Latin and Latin from out the English; must see geometry, biology and physics in Caesar; must conjure legal phrases and doctor's prescriptions from Cicero's orations; must flash the 'Idyls of the King' and 'Paradise Lost' and 'The Faery Queen' across the pages of Virgil; must brand every paragraph with the Romance languages and Latin America and the Philippines; must see Rome in the clock dial, in the 10-cent piece, in a decimal fraction, in the almanac, in the days of the week, in the Sunday liturgy, in Oregon's seal, in the omnibus bill, in the ultimatum to Turkey, in an aeronaut or a submarine; in Montana or in Arizona; in Cincinnati or in Olympia; in Lucy or in Gus; in matrimony or matrimony or alimony, it matters not which, for it is all Latin, anyway, and everywhere you turn."

**Canada to Develop Mussel.**

Canada is about to make capital out of a substitute for the oyster which is found along the Atlantic coast, chiefly in New Brunswick. It is a mussel which is by no means a new article of diet to the people of Canada. Its delicacy of flavor and high food value have been much advertised since the establishment of government investigation and experiment. A survey of the mussel beds of the St. Croix river, which constitutes the boundary between New Brunswick and Maine, has occupied the attention of a scientist of the council for three years, and it is expected that this year will see the satisfactory conclusion of the research. The sea mussel cannot be produced in fresh water, so that there is no possibility of developing an industry in the Great Lakes. It is believed that there are possibilities, however, of the development of fresh-water clams there in the near future.

**Inner Tubes as Ice Bags.**

Ice-bags relieve the feverish patient, but they are not large enough to cool his entire body. An old inner tube will do a much better job, says the Popular Science Monthly.

You cut the tube at the place where the valve is, remove the valve, the one end of the tube tightly and fill the tube with ice. Then tie the other end and you will have a long narrow ice-bag that may be placed at the side of the patient or even wrapped around him.

**SWATTERS TAKE FIRST GAME HERE**

After winning ten out of twelve games the Bearcats came home for a defeat at the hands of the Sweetwater Swatters Monday. It was Ballinger's day to lose and she lost, and perhaps it was for the best, for all winnings and no losings would cause interest in the great game to lag. That's our abibi.

And again there was too much Word for the locals. Word is the Swatter's ace, and they were entitled to win behind him when not a bobble was charged against them and when the star twirler allowed only three bingles, and two of them in the scratch class.

While the game was lacking in thrills, and aside from Word's pitching might be said was a featureless game, the lines were drawn pretty tight on both sides, and the Swatters only had eight hits to their credit, and only two of the five runs stacked up by them were honest to goodness earned tallies.

The Bearcats permitted the Swatters to cross the platter 3 times on errors and bone head plays, coupled with walks Bunger did the mound work for the kittens up to the sixth, when he allowed a hit, walked a man putting two on with no outs. Popboya called him out and sent Buscha to the box. "Bush" suffered at the beginning, as he went in with only a short warm up. Whitney, the first man to face him hit for a two banger, tried to make third and lost in the effort, Brown's throw from left field to Knight cutting him out, but the hit and walk which

Bunger had just allowed, scored. Byers, the second to face Buscha also got a hit, but the next two men went out and the Swatters did not hit in the seventh, eighth or ninth.

It might be said that the feature of the game was the continual "beefing" of the Bearcat players and local fans at the ump's rulings. The umpire did not arrive, and Bearcat Catcher White and Swatter Pitcher Rieburg were called on to officiate. Rieburg jumped his job early in the game when his team "kicked" because he called a Swatter out on second. White was "cussed" and discussed from all stations in the field and from the grandstand and bleachers, but he grinded and endured it. While some of his decisions probably showed bad judgement, an inspection of the box score shows that it was not Ballinger's day to win.

**WICHITA FALLS THINKS IT HAS 'A FIRE BUG'**

WICHITA FALLS, Aug. 9.—Police are hunting for a "fire bug" thought to be responsible for the firing Sunday night of the home of M. H. Chenault, on Filmore Street, which was discovered in flames while two other fires were engaging the attention of all but one of the fire companies of the city.

A bottle of kerosene and a pile of kindling found in a closet led to the incendiary theory. The Chenault family was away at the time. Two valuable fur neck pieces are said to be missing. The fire losses were about \$3,000.
