WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—Formal invitations will be sent today to Great Britain, France, Italy, Japan and China, to attend the conference called for discussing disarmament and the Far Eastern questions in Washington on November 11th. The invitations are understood to be identical in form and very brief. They will be sent directly to the American foreign office and copies handed to diplomatic representatives of the powers here.

## DALLAS "BLOODS" FREED OF CHARGE

DALLAS, Aug. 11.—A capacity crowd filled corporation court room here today when the cases of Gus King, center football star and his brother, and six other youths, members of prominent families charged with obstructing sidewalks and disturbing the peace by resisting officers Monday evening, were called for trial.

After a brief hearing King and his co-defendants were freed of charges of disturbing the peace. Several witnesses testified at the hearing and Judge Robertson declared that there was no case against the eight parties for disturbing the peace. They will be tried next Monday for resisting an officer.

## PRIEST'S BODY BURIED IN SAND

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 11.—The body of Father Patrick E. Heslin, Colma Priest, who disappeared from his parish of Holy Angels Catholic church on the night of August 2nd, was found buried at the bottom of Sand Cliff near Salada Beach on the Pacific ocean, about twenty miles south of San Francisco last night. A party consisting of the chief of police, O'Brien, of San Francisco constable of Colma, a newspaper reporter and William Hightower discovered the grave. The searching party left San Francisco last night on a tip given them by Hightower that the body could be found at the point where it was buried. The body was exhumed by the light of a lantern.

The officers have no clue upon which to unravel the mystery surrounding the priest's disappearance and his burial in the sand.

## LAWMAKERS ARE PLAYING POLITICS

AUSTIN, Aug. 11.—The senate free conference committee on eleemosynary appropriation bill refused to confer with the House committee today, in forming the lower branch committee to advise the House that the senate committee can not confer with the House committee which has instructions not to confer. The action taken by the committee further necessitates a second called session at the conclusion of the present one.

Representative West, in a letter to Speaker Thomas resigned as a member of the House free conference committee on eleemosynary institutions appropriations bill. West said that he would not follow instructions of the House to adhere to the Pope amendment to the bill, and therefore he tendered his resignation.

The senate committee on internal improvements today deferred action until Monday on the House concurrent resolution proposing an investigation of certain oil corporations in the Mid-Continent oil fields.

## INJURES WIFE AND KILLS SELF

HOUSTON, Aug. 11.—C. Bard, age fifty-eight, a storekeeper, attacked his wife early today, inflicting severe injuries on her and then in her sight, slashed his own throat with a razor and died within a few minutes.

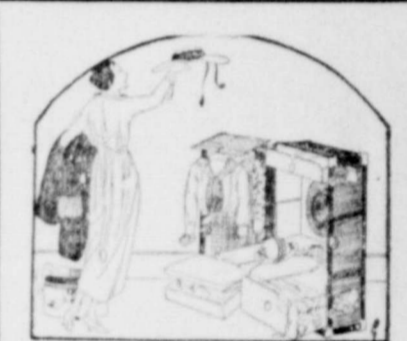
## BRITISH RECEIVE AN IRISH REPLY

**CUTS COUNTIES IN NEW DISTRICTS**

The redistricting bill which has passed the senate, and which if it finally becomes a law, will place Runnels county in the Twenty-fifth senatorial district instead of the twenty-sixth as at present. A few of the eastern counties will be cut out of the 26th and a few of the counties west will be thrown in with counties now making up the 26th in creating the 25th. The new district will comprise the counties of Mills, Brown, Coleman, Comanche, McCulloch, Menard, Mason, Concho, Runnels, Coke, Tom Green, Schleicher, Iron and Sterling. Judge J. H. Baugh is now representing a majority of the counties which comprise the new district.

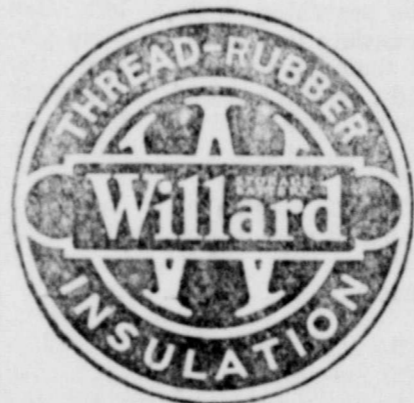

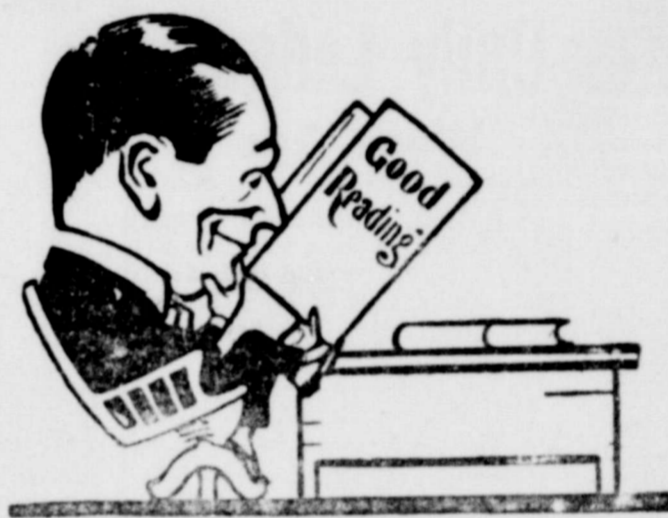
