## Bearcats Lose Double Header to the Eagles

Bechtold, the center field operator for the Abilene Eagles, broke up what promised to be a good game in the first matinee of a double header here Friday, when he hit the apple for a full circuit clout with all the bases drunk. The death blow came in the fifth inning, and after the hard hitter had given the Eagles their only run on a four bagger, the score up to this time being 1 to 0. The Eagles' left fielder was up four times, got two singles and two home runs. "Pop-boy" Smith had just gone in the box to relieve Crockett, who had filled the sacks by yielding two hits and two walks with one man out. The second man was thrown out and it began to look like "Popboy" was going to pull out of the hole, having put over two strikes on Bechtold, but the jinx was still at work for the locals and Bechtold hit the pill with a blow which counted for four runs for the Eagles. Three hits and three errors in the seventh netted the visitors three more runs while the Bearcats could not get away from the jinx and were forced to content themselves with only two scratch runs for the first game.

The second game was as heart rending to the local fans as the first. The Eagles chalked up three runs in the first session on three hits and one error. Whitehead hit for four bases in the fourth and in the fifth the Eagles converted the diamond into a race track, making three hits, aided by an error, count for five runs.

## FEARS INCREASE MOONSHINERS IN LOCAL JAIL

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Warning of the danger of a tremendous increase in "white slave" traffic was issued today by Major Bascom, attorney for the American Social Hygenic Association. He has just returned from Geneva, Switzerland, where he represented the association at an international meeting called by the League of Nations for the purpose of devising ways and means for checking traffic in women and children.

## LITTLE CHANCE CHANGE PRO LAW

AUSTIN, Aug. 13.—The Senate committee in criminal jurisprudence reported favorably today the Morris bill amending the Dean law. However the Hall Senate bill was substituted for the Morris bill by the committee. The Hall bill proposes an outright repeal of the Dean law and the enacting of a law duplicating the Volstead act of the federal government. Later it was announced that the proposition to amend the Dean law had been recommended to the Senate. According to members this means the death of the bill.

AUSTIN, August 13.—The House by a vote of 77 to 41 adopted the report of the free conference committee on eleemosynary institutions appropriations bill this morning. There was little opposition to the report shown. The report of the free conference committee on educational appropriations bill will not be completed until Sunday afternoon and it will be presented to the legislature early Monday morning, it was announced by Chairman Satterwhite of the appropriations committee and member of the free conference committee, today.

## WHITE HOUSE TALKS TAXES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13.—An official statement explaining the administration tax revision program was issued today from the White House. The statement declares the "aim was to establish methods that would raise the needed revenue within a reasonable certainty, to make collections sure and inexpensive and properly adjust the burden among all classes in the country."

WASHINGTON, August 13.—A repeal of the excess tax of one cent on every twenty cents value was decided upon today by the ways and means committee. The committee voted to levy a flat license of ten dollars on all retailers of soft drinks and to fix a manufacturers' tax on cereal beverages at twelve cents per gallon, instead of the present fifteen per cent sale price.

WASHINGTON, August 13.—The House passed today the Senate bill carrying forty-eight million and five hundred thousand dollars for the expenses of the United States Shipping Board, until January the first.

## ACCEPTS U. S. PEACE TERMS

BUDAPEST, Aug. 13.—Unanimous approval of the peace resolution adopted by the United States congress early in June has been voted by the Hungarian national assembly.

The Hungarian government has been authorized to negotiate a treaty of peace with the Washington government on the basis as set down in the American peace resolution.

## MURDER TRIAL 29 YEARS OLD

EAGLE PASS, Tex., Aug. 13.—Twenty-nine years after the alleged commission of the crime, Estevan Tovar went to trial in the district court here today, charged with wife murder.

In the preliminary examination of witnesses it was brought out that Tovar's wife had been completely forgotten until last summer when the accused quarreled with friends. Soon after the quarrel it was said that persons with whom he disagreed furnished the authorities with information which led to his arrest last June.

## MAN HELD FOR PRIEST MURDER

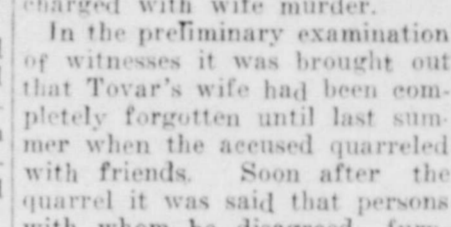

CARTOONING THE MAYOR

The Ft. Worth Star-Telegram Saturday carried a cartoon of Mayor Carl S. Guin, in which Ballinger's chief executive is pictured in the attitude of soliloquizing on the importance of the activities of his office, and he hands out some good publicity for Ballinger.

Patrick, the Telegram's cartoonist, pictures the Ballinger mayor in eight poses at his desk and quotes his soliloquy as follows: "This business of being President of the Ballinger Chamber of Commerce involves some bigger responsibilities than the size of our town would indicate. For instance, there's that Colorado river irrigation project, on which so much of our future depends. It's about time the engineers were tellin' us what they think about it. Every other section is building lakes—Cisco is working on one and Eastland has completed hers—not to mention what Ft. Worth's got and what Dallas is talkin' about. But we're not after a lake so much as we are determined to irrigate the Colorado valley. No country has more fertile lands than we have when there is plenty of rain—not even California. Ballinger is called 'The Biggest Little City in Texas,' and irrigation is the one thing we need to knock the 'little' out. Pat Neff did a big thing when he stood up for the water engineer board, and the legislature helped mightily by perfecting the Tillotson bill—now we've gotta get a wriggle on us." Patrick's duck is standing on the arm of the mayor's chair in the picture, and quacks out, "I've jes' been tellin' him he can count on Ft. Worth for any help he needs."

The duck's right, Ft. Worth, or at least the Star-Telegram, has given Ballinger much valuable publicity during the past few months and is continuing to do so, as indicated by the cartoon of the Ballinger mayor.
