6,000 ACRES SWEEP BY FIRE

BRADY, Tex., Aug. 17.—One of the biggest prairie fires that has swept this section of the country in years burned off more than 6,000 acres of land along the East line of Concho county late Tuesday.

The fire broke out when a Mexican hauling water for a tanking crew in the mountain pasture of T. F. Bengé dropped a match in the dry grass.

The burned range included about 400 acres in Bengé's pasture, nearly 6,000 acres of the Bryan Bryson land and small

parcels of land on the Will Bryson and Gerald Bryson ranches.

MORE WHEAT RAISED THIS YEAR, REPORTED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17.—Statistics from sixteen countries including the United States, which normally produces about 50 per cent of the total wheat crop of the world indicates that the production this year at approximately 1,953,000,000 bushels or about 7,000,000 bushels more than last year, the department of agriculture announced.

This estimate is based on reports up to August 15th.

NEFF CALL SECOND SPECIAL SESSION

AUSTIN, Aug. 17.—The governor called the second special session of the legislature this morning, the hour set for convening at 10:00 o'clock, August 17th. Ten hours after the legislature adjourned sine die, the governor submitted but one subject and that was to provide funds for the maintenance of state institutions.

The failure of the legislature to agree on the appropriations bill for educational institutions necessitated the call. Altho Gov. Neff submitted but one subject he included in his message other subjects which he might see fit to submit. Assistant Attorney General Keeling participated in the conference with the governor and heads of the State University and A. & M. College.

Notwithstanding that a number of legislators had departed for their homes last night and early today it is thought there will be a quorum of both branches.

AUSTIN, Aug. 17.—Adjutant General Barton announced today that seventeen rangers would be discharged September 1st in accordance with the legislative action reducing the force to fifty officers and men.

AUSTIN, Aug. 17.—Speaker Thomas called the House to order at ten this morning and Lieutenant Governor Davidson rapped for order in the Senate simultaneously in accordance with the governor's proclamation.

AUSTIN, August 17.—After a

conference with the presidents of the Texas University and A. & M. College Governor Neff announced that he would issue a call for a second special session of the 37th Legislature at ten o'clock this morning. Gov. Neff announced that only the educational appropriation bill would be submitted to the second special session.

AUSTIN, August 17.—The refusal of the House to adopt the free conference report on the educational bill came as a surprise to most of the members of the House, a partial poll of the House late last night showed.

AUSTIN, Aug. 17.—Senator Dudley, chairman of the finance committee, announced this afternoon that he would introduce the educational appropriation bill as it was originally prepared. This bill will not carry the salary reductions made by the House and the free conference committee.

It is expected that the legislature will adjourn in two weeks.

IRISH REJECT BRITISH TERMS

DUBLIN, Aug. 17.—Eamonn deValera declared today that Dail Eireann would not accept the terms of the British government extending to Ireland a dominion status. Ireland will hold out for an independent nation.

BELFAST, Aug. 17.—All royal Irish constabulary leaves of absence have been cancelled, dating from today it was announced here this morning.

DUBLIN, Aug. 17.—The public meeting of the Dail Eireann adjourned this afternoon to an indefinite date. Private sessions will be held in the meantime beginning tomorrow.

MILL BURNS; LOSS \$500,000

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 17.—Damage estimated at approximately a half million dollars was caused here early today when the large plant of the Kelly Milling Company on the East Side, in the industrial district, was destroyed by fire. The plant is supposed to have been set on fire by lightning.





AN ORDINANCE

Amending Section 13 of an ordinance passed on the first day of June, 1915, regulating the operation of vehicles upon the public streets and alleys of this City of Ballinger, and declaring an emergency.

Be it ordained by the City Commission of the City of Ballinger, Texas:

That Section 13 of the Traffic Ordinance of the City of Ballinger, which was passed and approved on the first day of June, 1915, and is of record in Book 2, pages 699-700-701 and 702, be amended so that same shall read as follows:

Sec. 1. That automobiles or other motor driven vehicles, and all horse drawn vehicles, used, operated or driven upon or across any of the public streets, alleys, or driveways of the City of Ballinger, shall be turned only at an intersection of one street with another street, and shall make such turn only by passing around the right hand side of the center of the intersection of such streets, and within the area of such intersection.

Sec. 2. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any motor driven or horse drawn vehicle, in emerging from an alley onto a public street, to drive across such street before turning, but such vehicle shall be turned and driven to the right immediately upon emerging from such alley.

Sec. 3. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any motor driven vehicle to approach or drive into any garage building in the City of Ballinger, from the opposite side of the street from that which said building may be situated, or by crossing the center of any such street, but in approaching or entering any such garage building, such motor driven vehicle shall proceed along said street on its right hand side, upon the same side of the street on which such garage is located, and shall enter such garage by making a right hand turn and not otherwise.

Provided that Section 3 of this ordinance shall apply to all public garages, filling stations, or other supply houses in said city.

Sec. 4. Any person or persons, officer, agent or employee of any corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed One Hundred Dollars.

Provided that this ordinance shall not apply to ridden bicycles, horses or other saddle animals.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby expressly repealed.

Owing to the great increase of motor driven vehicles in daily operation upon the public streets of the City of Ballinger, and the resultant danger to life and property, there is a necessity for the immediate passage of this ordinance, therefore, an emergency is declared dispensing with more than one reading of

this ordinance, and this ordinance shall be placed on first reading and final passage and shall become effective from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Passed and approved this 13th day of August, 1921.

BRONCHOS HERE REST OF WEEK 50 MEN BEHIND BIG ATTRACTION

The San Angelo Bronchos will appear here tomorrow, Friday, and Saturday for the last set to with the Bearcats on the local lot for the present season. The Bronchos are going good, and the remaining three days this week promises some real baseball for local fans.

The games won by each club reads as follows: Sweetwater 23, Abilene 22, Ballinger 18, San Angelo 17. The result of the remaining 18 games may show a different standing.

EX-COW BOYS IN ANNUAL MEET

The annual reunion of the open range, or Ex-Cow Pioneers Association is being held in the W. T. Routh pasture near the Runnels crossing today, where the old timers and their families—children and grand children, with friends, are living over the days of '76 to '86.

The pioneer cattlemen began to gather here yesterday and many were around the camp fire last night. Barbecue and stew was served red hot right off the pit, and the cowboys spent the night on the camp grounds.

Today is the big day of the reunion, and the crowd was the largest in the history of the association. Pioneers who came here as far back as 1876 and blazed the trail for the progressive citizenship which inhabits the country now, and who have since moved away, are back here for the reunion, and some of these have been away so long that an introduction is necessary to acquaint them with the men who rode the open range with them thirty-five and forty years ago.

Among those who came here ahead of the barbed wire fences, and who are on the ground relating early day experiences are Garland Odum, the Coffey Brothers, Nath Allen, Luce Wood, Jim Swift, Bill McAuley, George Miliken, while many of the younger boys, some of whom first saw America in Runnels county, are present at the reunion.

The pioneers in their annual reunion keep alive that Western chivalry which predominated here in the early days. They are living types of the sturdy men who made it possible for the present generation to inhabit the country. The hardships of the early days is plainly written on the faces of many of these who came here in "seamers," horse back, or supported only by their pack horses and mules.




