### COTTON WORKERS STRIKE

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 1.—At least fifteen hundred men engaged in handling cotton here went on a strike today. The cotton commerce of the port is at a standstill, all work being tied up on account of the walkout. The strike came following an announcement of a reduction in wages by the employers.

### REDUCED RATES MADE ON GRAIN

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—Authority has been granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission to Western and Southwestern railroads to reduce five and one-half cents per hundred pounds the rates on all grain and grain products for export from Missouri and Mississippi river points, and on all grain from the territory between the rivers and from Illinois to the Gulf ports, Mobile and Galveston, inclusive.

The commission also authorized the railroads to publish a notice of reductions on grain ranging from one cent to five and a half cents per hundred pounds, from the territory West of the Missouri river in Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado, Oklahoma and Gulf ports.

### PLANES SENT TO QUELL STRIKE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—The first step preparatory to federal intervention in the West Virginia mine strike disorder came today when thirteen airplanes were ordered by Secretary Weeks to proceed from Langley Field to the coal fields. The planes will be called into action when martial law is declared and the massed strikers are ordered to disperse.

LOGAN, W. Va., Sept. 1.—The approach of noon today found thousands of men still gathered across the Logan county line at Crooked Creek. The firing which began yesterday morning continued today, but reports from other sections said that quiet prevailed. There are no indications, however, that the armed men at other places have dispersed or paid any attention to the proclamation issued by President Harding yesterday.

Border patrols, deputy sheriffs, state police, volunteers, and other peace officers are on the alert, guarding against a general outbreak as much as possible. The authorities definitely established the fact that three Logan county men were killed yesterday in Balir Mountain, where there was a clash between the strikers and the authorities.

STALBANS, W. Va., Sept. 1.—All trains on the Coal River branch of the Chesapeake & Ohio railroad from Stalbans to Madison and other points where armed bands have been collecting have stopped. Railroad men said today that no even mail trains are being moved. Travelers report all roads between here and those points are being patrolled, and armed men are stopping all motor cars within five miles of Stalbans.

### ARMED FORCES A NECESSITY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—President Harding, speaking today at the opening of the fall term of the army war college declared that armed forces would always be necessary. "No matter where our best aspirations lead us," said Mr. Harding, "there may never be a time without the necessity of armed forces."

### ALL NATIONS HAVE NOW ACCEPTED INVITATION

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—The Italian government has formally accepted President Harding's invitation to participate in the disarmament conference. All nations invited have accepted the invitation to send representatives to the conference.

### U. S. BATTLESHIP IS LAUNCHED TODAY

CAMDEN, N. J., Sept. 1.—The superdreadnaught, Washington, one of the four largest and most powerful battleships in the navy was launched today at the Gloucester plant of the New York Shipbuilding Corporation.

Gaining 130 points in a few hours, cotton on the local market reached 17.25 today, following the release of the government report, which shows the shortest crop in the record of the cotton industry in this country, acreage considered.

New York October closed Wednesday at 16.05 and the close today was 17.34-38, making a net gain of about 130 points. Buyers anticipated a bullish report and sharp advance, but did not anticipate as rapid advance as was recorded.

The crop is not only short, but is moving rapidly, especially in West Texas, as compared with previous years. Up to noon today more than 600 bales had been received at the local yard. This is a record breaking receipt for August, the August receipts heretofore amounting to only a few bales.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—The Texas cotton forecast announced by the government today places the crop in Texas at 1,938,000 bales. The condition of the crop on August 25th was 42 per cent, the lowest for any month in the history of the cotton industry in Texas. This is 240,000 bales lower than the last report for Texas.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—The decline in the condition of

the cotton crop in the United States during the month of August caused a reduction of 1,162,000 bales as compared with one month ago. The condition of the total crop is given at 49.3, and the total production forecast is fixed at 7,037,000 bales. This is the lowest on record, compared with the acreage.

### FOREIGN COUNTRIES SETTLE DISPUTES

GENEVA, Sept. 1.—The dispute between Poland and Lithuania regarding Vilna, was settled here today by representatives of the two countries. They agreed that there would be two Lithuanian and one district of Kovno, which would be independent. The other Vilna will be supervised by the Polish administration.

### TAX BILL TO INCLUDE ALL REVENUE LAWS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—A decision was reached today by the Senate finance committee to write into the House tax bill as one document, every internal revenue law on the statute books.

**OLDER HEADS TO BE PUNISHED**

While the efforts of those opposed to the suspended sentence law did not bring about a complete repeal of the law, amendments made, cut out some loopholes, and hardened criminals cannot slip thru so easily as heretofore.

The press of the state was practically unanimous in either advocating the repeal of this law, or amending it, and while some of the newspapers were extremists on the question, the amendments made to the law seem to meet with the approval of a majority of the press. The sentiment of the newspapers on the question is pretty well summarized in the following from the Denton Chronicle.

"The Amarillo News notes that 'under the suspended sentence law no person over 25 years of age may have the benefit of the statute,' and asserts that this amendment is 'better than a repeal of the law that was demanded by some.' We have followed all along that amendment of the suspended sentence law, to re-

move some of the admittedly very serious objections, were better than its outright repeal—believing at the same time, however, that outright repeal were better than to let the law stand as it has stood—being neither more nor less than a big loophole through which too many guilty persons deserving punishment escaped. The amended law pre-supposes that persons over 25 should be held strictly to account for their offenses, albeit there are more mature offenders who should come under some conditions have the benefit of the law. But it also was amended to remove a number of offenses from the list in which the suspended sentence law's benefits could be pleaded. The amendments tacked on to it at the recent session may not be sufficient to cure all the evils about it; but others can be guarded against as they develop."



## ODDS AGAINST 'CATS' WINNING

With five games to play, and Abilene one game ahead of the Bearcats, odds are against the locals, and only by outplaying the Eagles to a distance sufficient to overcome the disadvantages can the Bearcats win out.

Three of the remaining five games are to be played on the Abilene lot, today, tomorrow and Saturday. The remaining two are to be played in a double-header at San Angelo Monday, while the Eagles go to Sweetwater for a double-header Monday.

There are two games under protest now pending before the league authorities. One is a game in which Abilene had sixteen men in uniform when they defeated the Bearcats at Abilene last week, and which is in violation of the rules. Manager Smith protested. No decision has been rendered. The other protest grew out of the umpire calling the game at San Angelo Tuesday on account of rain at the close of the first half of the fifth inning with the score 5 to 2 in favor of San Angelo. Abilene protested. No decision has been rendered in this case.

To win the first place in the present struggle, the Bearcats will have to get two out of the three games with Abilene, and then break even on the double-headers. Two out of three with Abilene will place the Bearcats one game ahead in the league, and the final result will then depend on what Sweetwater does with Abilene and what San Angelo does with Ballinger in the closing games Monday.

Ballinger crawled up a game closer to the top Wednesday when the Bearcats defeated the Swatters 9 to 3 and San Angelo defeated the Eagles 3 to 2 in the first game of a double-header. Abilene won the second game with the Brones by a 2 to 1 score. Following is the standing today:

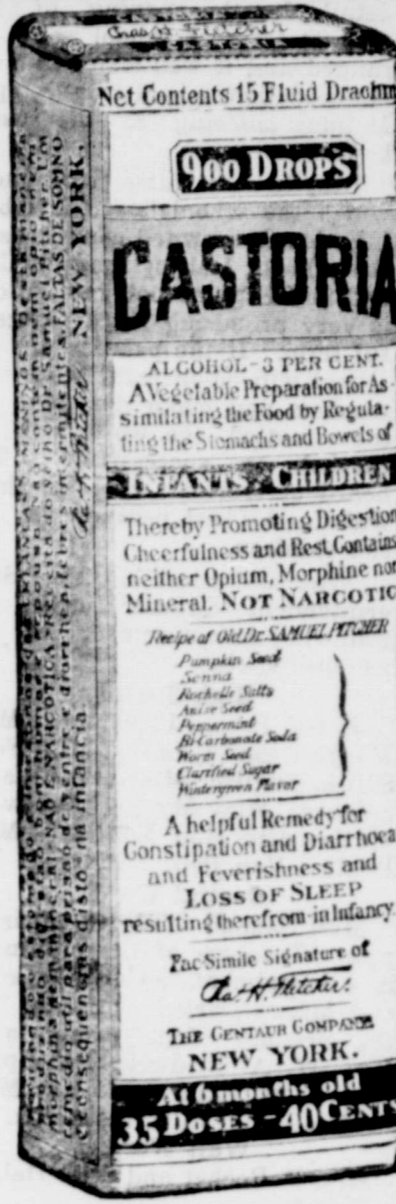

## BOOTLEGGERS TO FEDERAL COURT

Deputy United States Marshall Bailey Crawford was here from Abilene Wednesday and removed from the Ballinger jail to the jail at Abilene, Bob and Otho Crisp and Oscar Benson, charged with operating a still.

The Crisp brothers and Benson were arrested near Eola on Aug. 11th by Sheriff Bob Miller of Concho county and his deputies. Two fifty-six gallon barrels of sour corn mash were confiscated and destroyed and eleven quarts of finished liquor and a pretty well equipped still broken up, and the paraphernalia confiscated by the officers.

The three men were brought to Ballinger and complaints filed against them and they have been in the Ballinger jail in default of \$1,000 bond in each case. Monday afternoon, R. D. Shumate, federal prohibition officer for the Northern District of Texas, came to Ballinger, accompanied by Sheriff Miller of Concho county, and carried the confiscated booze and other physical evidence in the case to San Angelo, where a charge of violating the Volstead act was filed in the federal court, and the men were carried to Abilene as above stated.

The three men will be returned to this county after the federal court is through with them, and on Oct. 10th the grand jury of Concho county will take up the case.

The officers of Concho county located the still when the family of a man living near the house where the still was located reported that the man was making repeated trips to the home of the parties and returning drunk. An investigation resulted in the confiscation of the booze and the arrest of the Crisp brothers and Benson.

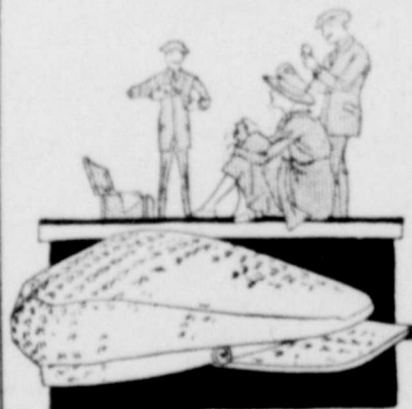
