POOL COTTON IS GOVERNMENT

W. W. Farmer left for Dallas Sunday to confer with the exeeau Cotton Association. Mr. Farmer is a member of the board, having recently been appointed to fill the vacancy on the board caused by the death of Phil Property Custodian Miller an-Mason, of Sweetwater.

Before leaving for Dallas Mr. Farmer announced that arrangements had been perfected with the local compress to handle the cotton for the local bureau, and this means that the pooled cot compress direct from the farmers and pressed for shipment to any point the association directs. Mr. Farmer'stated that he had the assistance of local parties in perfecting this arrangement and stated that W. C. Penn was of much help to him in the matter,

Several thousand bales of pooled cotton from Runnels, Coke, Concho and Tom Green counties will be concentrated at Ballinger and pressed at the local press, instead of shipping flat to some other point. After being pressed here the cotton will be concentrated at some point for sale, or sold here under the pool system.
