He has about thirty thousand pounds under contract to gather and will employ help to get them as fast as they are ready. He states that the grades vary, and he will be able to supply the market with pecans ranging from 15 to 25 cents. The crop is not as heavy as was at first expected, the trees shedding throughout the summer.


