WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.-A POLO GROUNDS, New York, speaking for the American government on questions to be discussed at the conference.

The American delegates will go into the conference well posted on every question to come before the conference and will know beforehand what is the best stand for the United States to

take on such questions. It was made known that the formulation of policies begun today by the American delegation would be pursued. Some hint of President Harding's hopes of the conference was given as the delegates were assembling this morning by the publication of a letter which he had written in reply to prayer that he work for Yankees 'universal disarmament." 




