Farm Show and Merchants Exposition Nov. 24th to 26th

Practically every member of the Y. M. B. L. committees on Agriculture, Celebrations and Athletics, was present at the joint meeting held in the League officers this morning, and the meeting itself was an enthusiastic one.

After a detailed discussion of the proposed three day celebration, the committees made the following recommendations to the Board of Directors: that a Farm Show and Merchants' Exposition be held on November 24th, 25th and 26th, to be participated in by all of Runnels county; prizes to be offered for entries in the poultry show, prizes for live stock, and prizes for individual farm exhibits.

It was suggested that the first day be made American Legion Day, and opened with a monster street parade of decorated autos, floats, etc., with various American Legion Posts, the fire department and other local organizations in line. The feature of the afternoon to be a football game between the Ballinger and Coleman posts.

The second afternoon would be devoted to a rural school field and track meet, competition to be based on school districts thru-

out the county. For the third afternoon, it is planned to arrange a high school football game.

Mrs. J. L. Landrum, of Stamford, will be asked to take charge of the Merchants Exposition. Mrs. Landrum is well known to Ballinger people, having been formerly connected with the Home Economics Department of A. & M. Recently she has staged very successful exhibitions for the merchants of Stamford, Mineral Wells, Weatherford, Corpus Christi and other Texas cities.

Tractor companies will be asked to stage demonstrations during the Show, and it is possible that some producing company will be secured to stage free open-air acrobatic exhibitions during the three days.

It is the opinion of the committeemen that the big show and celebration will meet with general favor throughout the county. Nothing of this kind has been staged in Ballinger in a long time and after it is started it will form the nucleus for a permanent Runnels County Fair Association.

It will serve to bring the people of the town and country closer together and make Runnels county people realize that they have much in common. It will afford the farmer an opportunity to exhibit his prize chickens, hogs, cows, horses, and mules, and his wife a chance to compete for prizes on her canned goods, honey, lard, etc. The school children of the county can compete in athletics, and the merchants exhibit their goods, and advertise co-operatively.

"FATTY" PLEADS "NOT GUILTY"

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 13.—Rescoe ("Fatty") Arbuckle was again arraigned for trial today and entered a plea of "not guilty" to the charge of manslaughter filed against him in connection with the death of Miss Virginia Rappe, pretty film star. The trial was set for November seventh.

NEW OIL TOWN IS BURNED

FT. WORTH, Oct. 13.—Fire which almost wiped out the oil town of Eliasville, in Young county, this morning, had been practically extinguished at eleven o'clock this morning, according to telephone messages received from South Bend, the nearest point of communication on account of the fire destroying the line to Eliasville. The report said that only five buildings remain standing in the business district of the thriving oil town.

Detachments of fire departments from South Bend, Breckenridge, and Graham, were sent to Eliasville, and arrived in time to be of some benefit.

Among the buildings saved are the Guaranty State Bank, Hill Crest Hotel, and three other buildings. Details of the destructive fire and its origin are lacking as after receiving the first report the communications with South Bend were severed.

BIG DIRIGIBLE IS TOTAL LOSS

NEWPORT NEWS, Va., Oct. 13.—A big dirigible from Langley Field was wrecked at Hampton Roads at 10:30 this morning, and will probably be a total loss. Three men were aboard the airship when it left the station.

Spectators reported that two men jumped as the craft descended almost to earth before leaving land. Another man was seen aboard the ship as the wind caught the big bag and dashed it along the surface of the water. A lone man was later reported to have been rescued by the crew from a tug boat.

GOVERNOR NEFF IS IN DALLAS ON BUSINESS

AUSTIN, Oct. 13.—Gov. Neff left today for Dallas, where he goes to attend a semi-annual meeting of the board of trustees of Baylor University, medical department, located at Dallas. The governor is president of the board. He will also witness the football game Saturday between Baylor and Boston College.

SILESIAN MATTER BEFORE LEAGUE

PARIS, Oct. 13.—Recommendations to the League of Nations on the settlement of the Upper Silesian question were received by Premier Briand this morning. They will be communicated in form of a note to the allied governments and by matter of courtesy to the United States. The terms will not be made public until an exchange of views and further procedure has taken place. It is deduced with strong reason that the proposal is a compromise of the French and British views and divides the industrial triangles in Silesia between Germany and Poland.

GIANTS WIN SERIES IN THRILLING 1-0 GAME

SAYS HE SAW BOY CHOKED

GATESVILLE, Tex., Oct. 13.—J. J. Johnson, a guard at the juvenile training school, told the board of control today that he saw Capt. Twyman choke Dell Thames the day before it is alleged that Twyman killed the boy by whipping and choking.

"I saw the choking when Twyman had taken the boy back of the belfry to punish him," said Johnson.

On cross examination Johnson said he did not think the choking should have caused death. The investigation will continue taking testimony, not to be used in prosecuting Twyman, but for the purpose of remedying any evil in the school's discipline.

FEELING STRONG AGAINST NEGRO

GEORGETOWN, Tex., Oct. 13.—Intense feeling against a negro who was arrested yesterday and is alleged to have assaulted a farmer's wife continued today at Liberty Hill, according to reports received here. It is not known here where the negro was jailed when arrested by Sheriff Allen yesterday.

KANSAS MINERS' UNION IS SUSPENDED BY PRESIDENT

PITTSBURG, Kans., Oct. 13.—The Kansas district of the United Mine Workers of America, No. 14, has been suspended by John Lewis, the international president. Alexander Howat and other district officers are summarily removed.

LOYD GEORGE TO VISIT AMERICA

LONDON, Oct. 13.—Premier Lloyd George is preparing to go to Washington to attend the impending conference to be held for the purpose of discussing limitation of armaments.

WACO, Oct. 13.—Forty-six witnesses who had been subpoenaed to appear before the grand jury now investigating the Lorena tragedy, registered with the doorkeeper this morning. Most of these are waiting about the court house for their turn to enter for examination. Owing to absolute secrecy which was enjoined by Judge Monroe upon those officiating in the investigation, information is difficult to obtain, but it is known that more than one hundred persons are expected to appear before the inquisitorial body during the session which may convene into next week and probably longer.

The determination of the county attorney to personally conduct the investigation in the grand jury is approved so far as can be ascertained. General approval has also been given in the matter of declining aid from the state authorities, the general opinion being that the local authorities are capable of thoroughly probing the tragedy. A list of those to be examined includes many citizens of Lorena and several Waco people.

MINERS WANT STATE TROOPS

BAKERSFIELD, Cal., Oct. 13.—Leaders of the striking oil field workers will ask Governor Stephens to send state troops into the regions affected by the walkout, they announced early today as a result of an affair between members of the strikers' "law and order" committee and armed men, who they charge were brought into the district by the Associated Oil Co.

Recommendations and findings of the conference will be reported to congress.

ANGELO WANTS CITY LIGHTS

SAN ANGELO, Oct. 13.—While the Kiwanis Club of this city recently passed a resolution recommending that the city issue \$150,000 street paving bonds, it is probable that a light bond issue will be ordered first.

City Commissioner Wilbur Brown issued a statement yesterday in which he turned considerable light on the workings of the San Angelo Water & Light Company, and in which he made a strong appeal for a municipal plant. The Interstate Electric Corporation, of New York, owns the light and water plants here, and also supplies light to Miles, Rowena, Ballinger and Winters, and Commissioner Brown charges that the company is making the people in these towns pay interest and dividends on a fictitious value of \$570,000, or in other words, they value their plant at \$970,000, when in fact the company only invested \$400,000 in the plant.

In his statement, Mr. Brown says: "The present company, a New York corporation, purchased the present plant in 1912 for \$400,000, and immediately mortgaged it for \$750,000, and sold \$470,000 of 6 per cent bonds, and issued to themselves \$100,000 of preferred guaranteed 8 per cent stock and \$400,000 common stock, making a total capitalization of \$970,000, on which we have been paying interest and dividends."

The sworn statement of the company for last year (1920) shows their expense account as follows:

FALL HURTS BABY OF MR. AND MRS. BERRY

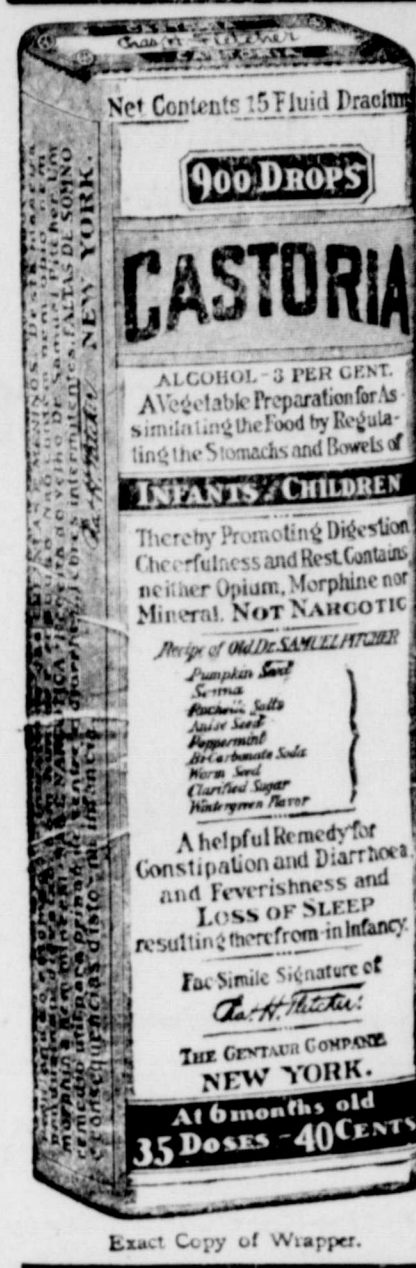
