Presidents and Brotherhood Officials In Critical Meeting

TICKS FOUND IN RUNNELS COUNTY

Jake Stubblefield, of the Norton country, reported to the county officials a few days ago that a number of cattle on Bluff Creek had some species of ticks. The state inspector was called to Runnels and Coleman counties, and after making an investigation stated that in certain regions he found the ticks very bad and that the cattlemen would have to rid their stock of them. Runnels county has no official tick inspector at the present, but the county officials will handle the situation. Following is an article from the Coleman Democrat-Voice which throws more light on the subject of the presence of ticks in this and the adjoining county:

"Cattle ticks have shown up on cattle in the Fred Taylor pasture one mile northwest of Coleman. Ticks also have appeared in the herd of Mrs. Chas. A. Daley on Oak Creek in the northern part of Runnels county, according to Lee Wilson, district inspector of the State Live Stock Sanitary Commission with headquarters at Blanket.

"Both Runnels and Coleman county have been clear of ticks for some time. Runnels has been clean territory for several years and Coleman has been clean for more than a year. Samples of the ticks which have shown up in the two counties unexpectedly have been sent to headquarters for classification and if they prove to be fever ticks quarantine precautions will be taken at once, Inspector Wilson stated Wednesday.

"It is stated that the Taylor cattle which have developed the ticks were shipped from Erath county several months ago to Mc Culloch county and later driven to the Taylor pasture near Coleman.

"In the meantime it is important that precautions be taken in the movement of supposedly inspected cattle. County Judge L. G. Mathews requests that all persons keep watch-out for ticks and, if any are discovered the fact should be reported at once to the proper authority, who is J. S. Gilmore of Santa Anna, or any member of the commissioners' court."

FILTH CAUSES CANCER, CLAIM

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Oct. 14.—So far back as human knowledge and tradition go cancer has been considered an "unclean" or infectious disease the same as leprosy and tuberculosis which have now been proven scientifically to be infectious, Dr. A. J. Ochsner, of Chicago, told the delegates attending the session of the Mississippi Valley Medical Association here today.

"The introduction of filth into the human body seems to have much to do with the production of cancer," Dr. Ochsner said.

"People living in the tropics and the arctic regions where vegetables are not so contaminated are free from stomach cancer. People whose external skin is scrupulously clean like the Japanese who bathe constantly in hot water are practically free while tribes whose skins are covered with filth suffer greatly from skin cancer.

"A knowledge of these facts should stimulate the profession and the public to encourage the research necessary for reducing or removing this scourge from the human family."

CENSUS BUREAU GIVES OUT MANUFACTURING STATISTICS FOR TEXAS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—A preliminary statement of the general results of the 1920 census of manufactures, covering the year 1919, for Texas, was issued this afternoon by the Bureau of Commerce. The figures are preliminary and subject to such change and correction as may be found necessary from a further examination of the reports.

Number of establishments, 5,724; Wage earners (average number, 107,700; Capital invested, \$588,797,000; Cost of materials, \$701,171,000; Value of products, \$999,996,000.

HALF OF ST. LOUIS HOMES MORTGAGED

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Oct. 14.—Almost half of St. Louis homes owned by their occupants, were mortgaged on January 1920, when the census was taken, according to statistics made public here. Approximately 19,000 were mortgaged, the statistics showed.

AIRSHIP TESTS FT. WORTH GAS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—The first use of helium, non-inflammable gas, for the inflation of airships, will be undertaken by the Naval Bureau of Aeronautics in a few days. A non-rigid type of airship will be inflated with helium gas from Ft. Worth, Texas, at Hampton Roads.

First reports yesterday stated that the robbery was the work of a lone masked man who locked Simmons in the vault and escaped with nearly \$3,000.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—William J. Simmons, Imperial Wizard of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, was prevented today by illness from appearing before the House committee in the examination of the activities of the Ku Klux Klan.

TOPEKA, Kans., Oct. 14.—Describing the act of President John Lewis in the deposing of Alexander Howat, as "a treacherous desertion to the ranks of the Industrial Court supporters," President Freeman of the Kansas Federation of Labor today appealed to all local unions in the state to give immediate financial assistance to the striking miners in the Pittsburg region.

"BABE" RUTH GIVEN CROWN

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—George H. ("Babe") Ruth, long known as "King of the Klout," and "Sultan of the Swat" by the baseball fans, was formally crowned at the club house after the final game of the series. Manager Huggins of the New York Yankee, American League club, officiated at the coronation placing on the regal head six hundred dollars worth of silver in a crown presented by his admirers. Inscribed on the crown was "King Ruth."

ANGELO SEC'Y WILL RESIGN

Tom Owen, the oldest secretary in point of service to a commercial organization of any one town in West Texas, resigned from the San Angelo Board of City Development last Wednesday. Mr. Owen has been with that body and at the head of the commercial interests of San Angelo for eleven years as well as being active in this line all over West Texas. His resignation came previously unannounced at a meeting of the board Wednesday, and while the board took no official action Mr. Owen said that his action was final and he expected to be relieved by Nov. 1st. He stated that for some time he had been considering taking up some other kind of work and that it would be necessary for him to be loose by Nov. 1st in order to consider several other propositions which have been offered him. He will then spend some time in California before commencing his new endeavor, and in talking of leaving San Angelo he said that he was "not cutting any bridges behind" him and that some day he might return.

Mr. Owen expressed his appreciation to the people of San Angelo and made a strong appeal that they continue to cooperate and shoulder the wheel together. Tom Owen has not only been a big help to San Angelo, but to all of West Texas, and the entire West will suffer the loss of this man with San Angelo. He has always boosted West Texas and as he was preparing to leave it, said:

"I feel that I have made a world of friends not only here but throughout the state and particularly in Western Texas, and I will always have a warm spot in my heart for the people; there are none nobler and bigger-hearted on the face of God's green earth. Some day West Texas is going to be the greatest empire in the United States. Its resources as yet are undeveloped; it is in its infancy."

BEAUMONT, Oct. 14.—A donation of \$1200.00 by the local Ku Klux Klan to the Beaumont Day Nursery was rejected Friday night when eight of the nine committeemen receiving the funds declined the gift. The money was given thru a prominent attorney of this city.

LORENA VICTIM LEFT \$75,000

WACO, Oct. 14.—The will of Louis Crow, of this city, a victim of the Lorena-Ku Klux Klan tragedy, which was filed in the probate court here this morning, discloses that he left an estate valued at \$75,000.00. Crow's wife is named as his sole beneficiary.

CHICAGO, Oct. 14.—Warren S. Stone, Grand Chief of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, today requested a conference with the railway executives in session here in behalf of the six big railroad employees' unions which voted a strike.

The officers of sixteen railroad unions went into session shortly before noon at a hotel, while more than one hundred railroad presidents were meeting at another. The railroad presidents notified Stone by telephone that his letter would be considered at their meeting.

When the executives met at 11:00 o'clock it was understood that they would vote to ask the United States Railroad Labor Board for a further wage reduction. The crisis was rendered more acute this morning when the labor board handed down a decision paving the way for the restoration of piece work. The railroad presidents were jubilant while the union leaders feared the effect on their men, more than eighty per cent of whom voted for the strike rather than accept further reductions or rules they oppose.

CHICAGO, Oct. 14.—Confronted by a possible railroad strike over wage reductions, and the insistent demands from shippers for lower freight rates, railway executives, meeting here today declared that transportation charges would be decreased in proportion to the future wage reductions.

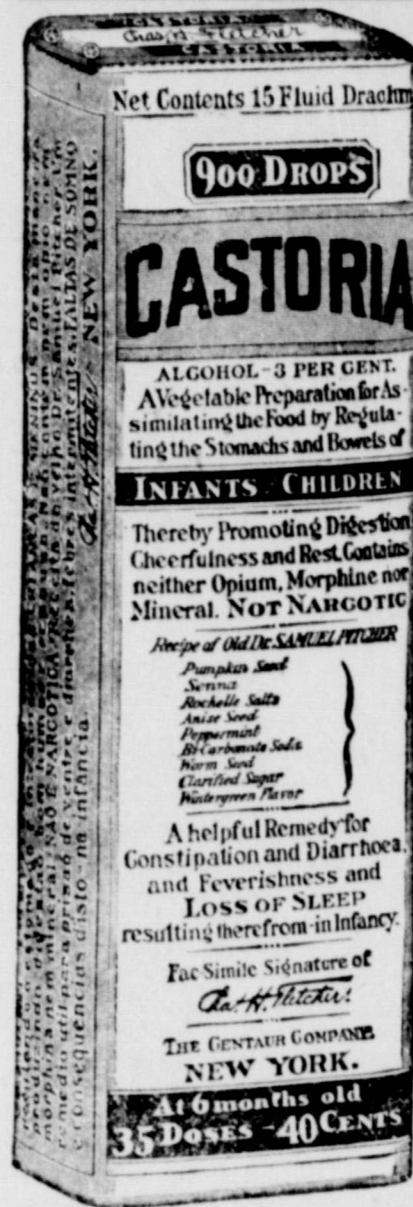
NO LAW FOR 'MERCY SHOT'

Something to Think About

EDISON QUESTIONS

THOMAS A. EDISON, who has a very low opinion of the intellectuality of the average college student, has come out with a new set of questions, historical, political, geographical and scientific.

The Wizard is much too honest a man for anybody to suggest that he deliberately got up those posers for the purpose of humiliating his fellow citizens.

So it may be admitted that the wide ground covered by the queries represents his own interest in all sorts of subjects having to do with human activities.

But it is doubtful whether or not ability to answer correctly all or most of these questions could be any test of the intelligence of anybody, in college or out of it. For intelligence and knowledge are very different things.

It was once said of a distinguished man that he had a larger store of useless knowledge than anybody of his time. Mr. Edison would not admit that any knowledge could be useless.

In fact he seems to take the attitude of the late Lord Macaulay who was in the habit of qualifying a statement as to something that nobody knew anything about but himself, by saying "as every schoolboy knows." As a result "Macaulay's Schoolboy" became the proper definition of an infant prodigy.

Lord Kelvin was one of the most distinguished men of science of his time. Addressing his students at Glasgow University on one occasion he said that the great thing about the higher mathematics was that it could be of no possible use to anybody.

Yet the fact that Kelvin and a couple of his friends, one in America and another in Europe, used to amuse themselves with these useless investigations, is, in a way, an argument in favor of Mr. Edison. It goes to show that certain things are worth while even if no direct advantage is to be derived from them.

Old-fashioned schoolmasters were great believers in the importance of facts, and a great part of their time was passed in getting them into the minds of the young.

But the modern schoolmaster goes about his business in a different way. He does not try to teach facts. He does try to teach general principles.

It is like the difference between the old geography and the new. The old dealt with the names of places, rivers, mountains and so on. The new deals with the effect of the physical shape of the earth's surface on the races scattered over it.

A well-trained lawyer is not one who carries all the cases around with him in his head. But he does know how to put his hand on anything he wants.

In the same way it is more important to be able to get at your facts than to know them.

Use for Exhaust Gas.

At its point of issue from the cylinder the exhaust has a temperature of from 800 degrees to 1,000 degrees F., and consists almost entirely of carbon dioxide—a colorless and odorless gas. These properties make it suitable for carbonizing wood, that is to say, making charcoal, and it is now being utilized for that purpose in France. The hot gases are caused to traverse a specially constructed oven, in which the wood is suitably arranged, by which means the temperature of the wood is raised to about 500 degrees, which carbonizes without burning or igniting it. Many ovens of this type were installed during the war, in Algeria and Tunis, with the object of furnishing a substitute for anthracite coal, which was very scarce and dear, for use in enriching low-grade gas for motor purposes.—Popular Mechanics Magazine.

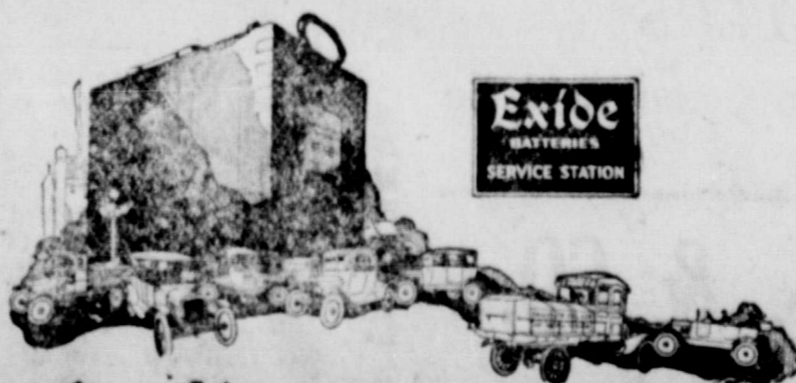
