No Plans Proposed to Prevent Big R. R. Strike

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—The railroad transportation organization chiefs, directing the progressive strike intended to tie up the nation's transportation system, beginning on Oct. 31st, today expressed doubt as to the feasibility of the plan proposed by the public group of the United States Railroad Labor Board, announced last night. So far no plan has been offered which will prevent a general tie-up, and the railroad unions are making every arrangement for putting into effect the nation wide walk-out.

CLEVELAND, Oct. 17.—The Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen of the International & Great Northern Railroad of Texas, was authorized today by the president of the brotherhood to walk out on October 22nd.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—The government through its various departments began today to survey the situation developed by the call of the railroad union leaders for a general strike beginning on October 30. All officials from the president down to the departmental chiefs and secret service agents are known to be watching the situation closely. The whole range of possibilities is regarded by officials as so nebulous at the present time as to make it practical to await developments.

The hope is generally expressed by officials that some suggestion by the public group of the United States Railroad Labor Board which is in conference with the Interstate Commerce Commission might solve the problem. The public group proposed to the railroads that they immediately put into effect a freight reduction, equivalent to the wage decreases authorized by the board last July and that the railroads withdraw further requests for wage reductions.

NEW YORK, Oct. 17.—A fleet of 70,000 motor trucks, or as many of them as is found necessary, will be mobilized if the railroad strike takes place, and used for bringing to New York its daily quota of 1500 car loads of food stuffs, Health Commissioner Copeland announced today.

Trucks will be operated in preventing a shortage of food supplies in all thickly congested centers, and it is expected that through this plan suffering will be prevented.

CHICAGO, Oct. 17.—The railroad brotherhoods have a strike fund of \$2,000,000, which is sufficient for a general strike at this time, John Grenau, President of the United States Railway Employees of North America and leader of the so-called "outlaw" strike last year, declared today.

SENATE REJECTS PEACE AMENDT.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—The first Senate roll call vote on the German peace treaty was taken today and resulted in 71 to 7 for the rejection of the first amendment proposal of Senator Walsh. The Walsh amendment would have the United States to join other powers in protecting Germany against unwarranted invasion. All Republican and most of the Democratic members opposed the amendment.

TAYLOR RESIGNS AS ASST. ATTY. GENERAL AUSTIN, Oct. 17.—C. W. Taylor announced his resignation today as Assistant Attorney General, to become effective on November 1st. He will resume the practice of law at Corsicana.

TWO DIE IN HOTEL FIRE

DALLAS, Oct. 17.—Two persons burned to death and at least seven were injured, three of whom will probably die, as the result of a fire which destroyed a boarding house here early today.

There were thirty persons in the house and a number escaped by jumping from the second story windows.

The dead are: Mrs. Lola Montgomery, age forty-five, waitress; F. W. Felch, mining engineer, whose parents live at Buckeye, Washington.

The boarding house was conducted by Mrs. Mary J. Kincaid on Bryan street. The origin of the fire is not known.

T. S. Carter, age sixty years, a clerk, who was injured internally and badly burned, died at eight o'clock today.

After questioning a number of persons living in the house, the city fire chief said he believed the fire started overhead from a gas stove in a bathroom.

BIG CONGREGATIONS GREET DR. HALL

The opening of the Presbyterian-Methodist revival yesterday had one of the biggest congregations attending a Ballinger church service this year, and Dr. Hall held the attention of all from the beginning to the end of the service. The services are being held in the Methodist church and that auditorium was packed to its capacity at both services Sunday, with many extra chairs added in the aisles. The singers of both churches are co-operating under the leadership of Stuart L. Williams, and the choir last night was large, filling the entire platform, and the chorus was a big feature of the service. All singers of the town are urged to take a part in this portion of the service is intended to be made a feature.

Dr. Hall is not a stranger to Ballinger church-goers, having been a pastor here several years ago. He is a strong preacher and yesterday brought two wonderful sermons to the big congregations. He dwelled at length on the importance of Christian people being ready for a revival and announced that his sermons for the first part of the week would be directed at the church members, but would be good for everyone. Both sermons yesterday showed the church member his duty and the work to be done if a revival of the unsaved is to be expected. He impressed the necessity of the Christian people lining up with some

church and becoming settled, having a church home and a place to work. In the late religious census taken here it was shown by the returns that there are many people in Ballinger who profess to be Christians and who state a church preference, but as yet have never lined up with any church. A strong effort will be made during this meeting to get these people to place their letters in the church and line up with the forces at work.

All committees were appointed at the morning service and the meeting will get underway without further delay.

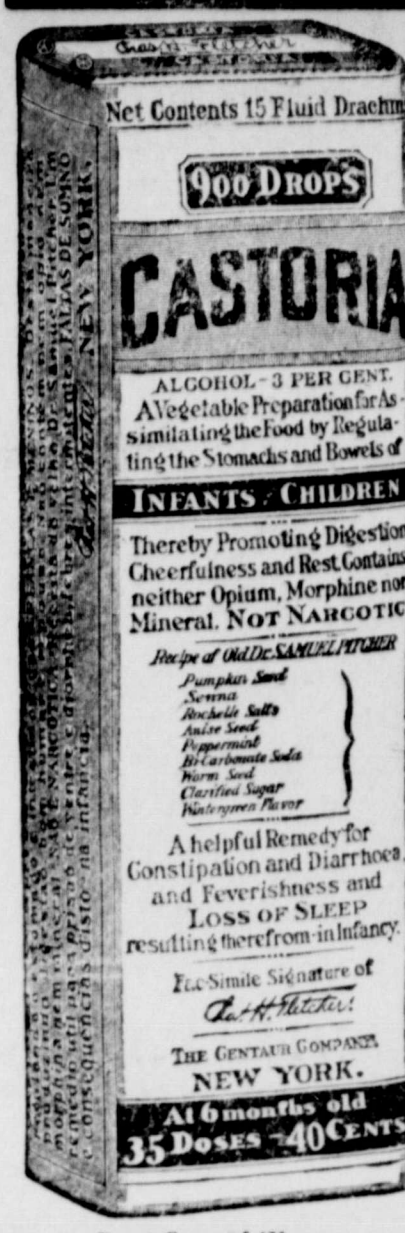

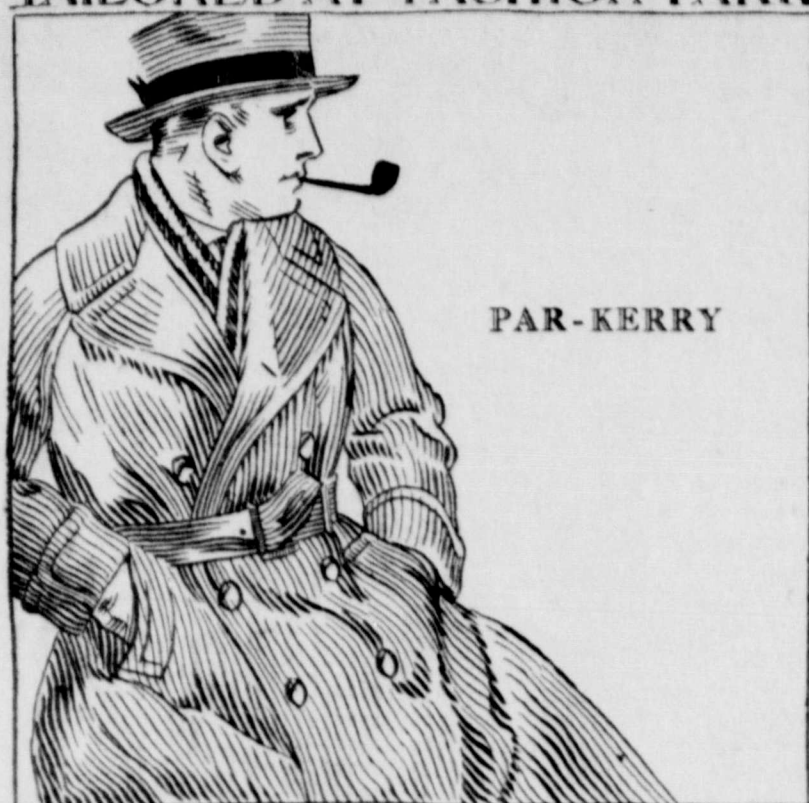

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—A sharp clash between William J. Simmons, the Imperial Wizard of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, and Chairman Campbell, of the House rules committee, marked the re-opening today of the wizard's examination, when the head of the Klan touched on the question of his physical collapse last week.
