WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—Based on statistics compiled from thirty-two cities, the cost of living in the United States decreased one and seven-tenths per cent from last May to September, and 18.1 per cent from June 1920 to September 1921, according to the Bureau of Labor which compiled the statistics.

AUSTIN, Oct. 19.—Replying to a telegram from Senator Hertzberg, suggesting that the Board of Control examine witnesses in San Antonio, or Austin, as to the alleged brutalities in the State Juvenile Training School at Gatesville, A. R. Johnson, member of the board, advised Mr. Hertzberg that he send ex-inmates' affidavits to the board, if they deemed it advisable that testimony be taken. This opens the way for former inmates of the training school to submit affidavits regarding conditions in the institution during their stay there without being called before the board in person. Ex-inmates of the institution can make affidavit to facts as they existed and the board will receive the statements.

THE WAR ALMOST LEGALLY CLOSED
WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—Exchange of ratifications at Berlin of the "Treaty of Berlin," finally establishing peace between the United States and Germany, will be the next step for ending the nation's legal war status with Germany.

Revivals Attract Large Crowds; Many Converted

Dr. F. M. Hall was greeted by a crowd which filled the auditorium and crowded out into the Sunday school room at the Methodist church Tuesday evening. The evangelist held the closest attention of the large audience and delivered an able message and an inspiring sermon appropriate for the revival in its early stage.

The message was along the lines of personal work, the evangelist appealing to the Christian people not to let anything stand in the way of winning souls to Christ.

Taking as his text from the 26th verse of the fifth chapter of Luke, following the reading of the chapter, the evangelist illustrated how the people who witnessed the healing of the man with the palsy were amazed, and his subject was "Some Strange Things in Capernaum and in Ballinger."

Dr. Hall pointed out how the four men brought one man to Christ that he might be healed of his sin, and he appealed to his hearers not to wait until our friend is low in death before we bring him to Christ, saying that death bed repentance is taking a long chance. He told of the cost—the sacrifice of property—the men made to get their friend to Christ, and emphasized the fact that Jesus Christ paid the greatest cost to save a lost soul, and the evangelist ridiculed the man who complained about the cost of missionary work and the work being carried on to save the world.

The third strange thing referred to was the man's condition. He had the palsy, knew he had it, was willing to come to Jesus Christ, didn't resist when his friends went to the great trouble of lifting him to the house-top and lowering him in the presence of the Master. The man was convicted of his sin and had faith and was saved. "What Ballinger needs today is old-fashioned conviction of sin," said the evangelist. He appealed to the Christians to speak to their friends about their soul salvation. If necessary, he said, let four men go to one friend as did the friends of the man with the palsy.

The choir for the Tuesday evening service was composed of about thirty people and the singing was an inspiring part of the service. The revival is being held under the direction of the Presbyterian and Methodist churches, and those who have heard Dr. Hall are deeply impressed with his sincere messages and the practical manner in which they are delivered. Two services are being held each day—at ten o'clock in the morning and seven-thirty at night. The evangelist has been discussing at the morning service the subject of "Personal Work in Winning Souls for God." He announced as his subject for tonight "Brimful." You are cordially invited to attend these services.

PREPARING TO RUN TRAINS DESPITE STRIKE

CHICAGO, Oct. 19.—"In the event of the threatened railroad strike and the employes called, walk out, the roads are prepared to do our utmost to move the necessities, utilizing to the fullest extent possible all the man power available." Charles H. Markham, president of the Illinois Central Railroad, declared today in an address before the American Mining Congress.

"The railroads," Markham said, "have taken their share of the losses in the present period of readjustment, despite the fact that they have not been permitted to profit as other industries did during the period of high prices, because their earnings are fixed by the government."

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Oct. 19.—The national headquarters of the Railroad Yardmasters' Association of America, with a membership of 8,000 throughout the country, today sent notices to all members to remain at work in performing their usual duties in the event the railroad strike takes place.

GALVESTON, Oct. 19.—Re-

ceivers of the International & Great Northern Railway issued a statement today to their patrons declaring that should the threatened railroad strike take place the road will endeavor to secure such men as are necessary to operate trains. Notices to this effect were sent to all agents of the I. & G. N. company.

STEALS EVIDENCE BERGDOLL CASE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—A box containing the private papers of the Bergdoll investigation, which were stolen from the office of Representative Johnson Monday night, were found early today on the fifth floor of the House office building.

KU KLUX PROBE WORKS AT WACO

WACO, Oct. 19.—The grand jury reassembled here today to continue the probe into the Lorena tragedy. The work has been greatly simplified by the somewhat steady improvement of the parties who were injured in the affray when the Ku Klux Klan attempted to parade on the streets of Lorena against warning of the sheriff.

Sheriff Bob Buchanan, the more seriously injured of the victims, is steadily improving. There is no fear now of other fatalities. Carl West, the young man who was shot in the neck, was before the grand jury shortly after it assembled. West resides at Lorena and was a bystander during the trouble. He is rapidly recovering from his wounds.

During the past summer four rattlesnakes have been killed in Ballinger within three blocks of the public school buildings. This naturally leads one to believe that there is a rattlesnake den somewhere nearby, and if such is true it is only a question of time until some child, or grown person, will become the victim of one of these deadly reptiles.

We have been hearing a great deal about sanitary clean-up campaigns, and the city's civic organizations and the city government have expended some money in carrying on this work very successfully, but it is high time that a clean-up campaign is launched which will remove some of the wilderness from the heart of the city.

There are vacant lots in Ballinger which are not only unsightly, but which are ideal breeding places for snakes, and the fact that the snakes killed were found near vacant lots covered by a heavy undergrowth is cause sufficient for the launching of a snake killing campaign in Ballinger. No vacant lot should be permitted to become a wilderness.

MUST PAY YOUR WIFE'S POLL TAX

Men who go to pay their property tax had as well take along \$1.75 to pay for their wife also. Under the present rule and way of doing things around the tax collector's office either the wife or husband can pay the poll tax of the other without an order, and it has heretofore been the law that a man can not pay his property tax without paying his poll tax, and now he can not pay his property tax without paying both his and his wife's poll tax—provided she is not too old to pay a poll tax, and most men had rather pay their wife's poll tax than to let it be known that she was too old to own a poll tax receipt.

"They are coming mighty slow, running from one to a half dozen per day," said Collector Brown, and he has a tax roll before him containing 5600 names which he must issue poll tax receipts to, if they all pay up before January 31st. Better get yours before the rush. The tax rolls are the heaviest in the history of the county, showing an increase in property values, and with women coming for poll renditions it has doubled that part of the tax rolls.

W. T. Padgett is busy writing school tax receipts, and your school tax is due, and is also coming in slow. The deadline on school taxes is the same as the county and state, and Mr. Padgett is getting the receipts ready to hand out when the tax payers take a notion to dig up.

Oscar Williams, who recently accepted a position with the city and will have charge of the city's clerical work, is busy making up the city's source of revenue, and will make haste to get city tax receipts ready.

Mrs. Zula Powell, public health nurse for the Texas Public Health Association, was here Tuesday conferring with County Superintendent Bugg regarding the annual sale of health seals. Mr. Bugg handled the campaign a year ago most successfully, despite the depressing conditions, and naturally the association comes to him again with the request that he accept the chairmanship.

This is one benevolent cause which merits the support of the public and will no doubt get a loyal support in the county this year. The Texas Public Health Association works independently of the State Health Department, and devotes all its energies to preventing "t. b." and educating the people how to take care of themselves and guard against the deadly disease.

The association maintains a half dozen or more different departments or branches of work, including school inspection, where trained nurses visit the schools and inspect the children, and where they find defects recommend attention. Also infant welfare work, modern health crusade, Mexican and colored health work, publicity department, organization department, etc.—all these departments work for the prevention of the white plague.

HARDING SAYS TIES BINDING

YORKTOWN, Va., Oct. 19.—A doctrine of enduring friendship between the United States and Great Britain was pronounced by President Harding today in an address at the commemorating ceremony of the final surrender of the British expeditionary forces here to the revolutionary army of George Washington.

Surrounded by high officials of the administration and standing on the site of the spot where Lord Cornwallis laid down the sword in 1781, the president declared in deliberately chosen words of sentiment the peaceful relationship between the two great English speaking nations for all time to come. That either would ever again lift sword against the other, Mr. Harding said must be "unthinkable."

Continuing, he said, "In the trusteeship of preserving civilization there were naturally arrayed together and convictions of a civilization worthy of that costly preservation will exalt peace and warn against further conflict for all time to come."

WILLIAMSBURG, Va., Oct. 19.—Making a short talk here today while en route to attend the ceremonies at Yorktown commemorating the surrender of the British in the Revolutionary War, President Harding declared that the nation confronts an educational crisis through a lack of efficient teachers in public schools and in lack of school facilities.

Mr. Harding appealed for patriotic support of the educational system, asking the public to support the system commensurate with the national resources.

Next Tuesday's meeting of the Kiwanis Club will be known as Owen and Williams Day, it was decided at the regular meeting today of the club in the St. Angelo Hotel. Mr. Owen has for eleven years been the principal booster of the city, and Mr. Williams is the secretary of the Young Men's Business League at Ballinger, and the leading force in the formation and projection of the Colorado Valley Irrigation Association, which is endeavoring to put a dam across the Colorado River at Bronte, which will irrigate 200,000 acres of fertile West Texas soil.—San Angelo Standard.

Mr. Williams returned from San Angelo Tuesday night where he had been to meet with the Board of City Development and Kiwanis Club of that city, in an effort to get San Angelo to put up \$500 to help defray the expense of making the survey of the irrigation project. It will be remembered that a short time ago it became known that the state funds had become exhausted and that it was necessary to raise \$4,000 to match a federal appropriation of a like amount to complete the work. The Y. M. B. L. of Ballinger undertook to

raise the \$4,000, and assigned a quota of \$500 to San Angelo. "We will get it," said Mr. Williams. He stated that the Board of City Development had a full quorum present Tuesday at a meeting held to hear the proposition and that the members voted unanimously in supporting the project to the full amount of its quota.

Mr. Williams is to be a guest of the Kiwanis Club in San Angelo next Tuesday, and the occasion will not only be one of signal honor to Mr. Williams, but an honor to Ballinger, and his friends here will be glad to note that our neighbor city stands ready to co-operate, and is co-operating in development which is of such vast importance to this country.

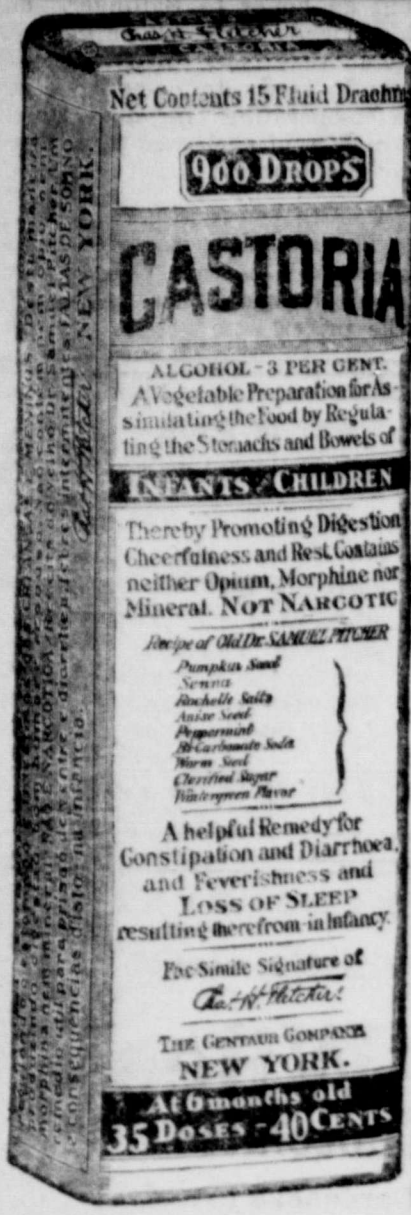
