LABOR BOARD WARNS UNIONS

Board, today, backed by all the authority the government can place at its disposal, called on the railroads of the country and the "Big Five" railroad unions to appear here next Wednesday at ten o'clock a. m., and at the same time solemnly warned the unions not to strike until the board has heard their grievances and rendered a decision.

The board's action practically means there will be no strike on October 30th, unless the unions choose to openly, defy the government. In the meantime both parties to the dispute are warned to maintain the status quo on properties of the carriers. This action followed a conference which began at ten o'clock this morning.

SAN ANGELO, Oct. 21.-War has been declared on rabbits in Tom Green county, and early in November a series of drives will be made over the county, with ranchmen, farmers, and citizens in general participating in the drive. The various school districts are to be enlisted in the county wide drive, and much interest is being manifested in the effort to rid the county of the

County Agent Brown is perfeeting the plans, which he says will be the means of reducing a loss to small grain crops should it rain in time to bring up winter grain. The plans provide for the building of wire pens in various sections of the county and many drives will take place on the same day and the cabbits rounded up and slaughtered. A fund to pay for the wire has already been raised by the farm-



1000 CHICKS BY PARCEL POST

Some idea of the interest in pouttry production in this county is reflected in parcel post records at the local post office. Postmaster Erwin reports that one thousand baby chicks have been handled thru the local of fice by parcel post during the last thirty days. The chicks represent new stock which the poultry growers are importing, and which they will raise for early spring layers. Most of the baby chicks received are of the White and Brown Leghorn strains.

The poultry crop is good this year, but one local dealer express es the opinion that the crop has been overestimated, and that not as many chickens will be shipped out as was at first expected. 
