Before me, the undersigned authority in and for Runnels county, Texas, on this day personally appeared Edwin Day, J. J. Goode, J. M. Jennings, Elmer Batts, E. M. Setser, W. B. Cobb, and George Dean, known to me to be credible persons, who, being each duly sworn according to law depose and say:

We accompanied Ed J. O'Kelly on a visit to the plant of the Mebane Long Staple Cotton Co., Robstown, Texas, on October 12th, 1921. We went thoroughly into all the claims made about the handling of Mebane Long Staple cotton seed by the said plant. We found that the gins of the said company ginned the said seed exclusively; that the seed were turned several times in the seed houses and the seed houses were ventilated to properly protect all seed from heating.
