The officials of the Ballinger Club have generously donated the use of their rooms for the day for these meetings.

The Young Men's Business League will entertain the visitors at noon with a luncheon, at which a large number of local boosters will be present to "hand-shake" the city's guests, and make their closer acquaintance.

### LEGION DELEGATE IS OFF TO CONVENTION

### LEGION DEFEATS B. H. S. 6 TO 0

The American Legion and the Ballinger High School played an almost scoreless game yesterday afternoon in one of the worst dust storms of the season. It was thought for awhile that the contest would be postponed until Monday, but a good sized crowd braved the storm and was on the side lines early so the boys went ahead with the game as scheduled. It was almost impossible to use anything but straight line plunges, forward passes being almost impossible to judge in the high wind that was blowing and trying to kick against the wind was a ground loser.

The Legion boys showed a lack of training, only having two days practice before the game, but their weight told in critical times and they managed to push one touchdown over in the third quarter. Simmons for the Legion was a good ground gainer and twice came near getting loose for a touchdown. In the third quarter the Legion got the ball on their own 40 yard line and with line plays and end runs worked the ball to the BHS 30 yard line. Green, playing full-back for the Legion, carried the ball through the line to within a few yards of the goal line, and Flynt playing right-half, carried it over the line for the only touchdown of the game. Penn missed goal by only a few inches. Booth was probably the star for the Legion, being in almost every play, tackling hard and opening a hole in the line every time he was called upon. All the boys did remarkably well for "old decrepids" as they are and some said that it was their first game in over five years.

The High School eleven was far better trained and did the most of their gaining on long end runs. Only one pass was completed during the game, however the aerial route was tried often. No particular one featured on the High School but the team played together as a unit and had it not been for the extra weight against them it would have been a different story.

### Woman Says Short Skirts, Etc, are Causing Boys to Go Wrong

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—New interest in the juvenile court among club women was aroused today following the statement of Mrs. Anna Davern, who was for eleven years a juvenile court officer, before the West End Woman's Club.

"I'm in favor of punishing the girls for contributing to

the boys' delinquency," said Mrs. Davern.

The speaker said "It is often the girls' fault these days. Short skirts and flimsy waists have increased the number of cases in court. Why? Because girls thus use them flamboyantly for sex attractions and men make a special effort to 'pursue' them."

### HELEN KIRBY OF AUSTIN DEAD

AUSTIN, Oct. 29.—Helen Marr Kirby, former dean of women at the University of Texas, died this morning after an illness of several days. She was dean of women for thirty-five years, retiring two years ago with the title of Dean Emeritus. She was 84 years old. Mrs. Kirby was born in Mobile, Alabama, and moved to Chapel Hill, Texas, with her parents in 1839. She moved to Austin in 1875, and opened a private school which she operated until she entered the service of the university. Her husband, James E. Kirby, died in 1865. Her son, R. Harper, is widely known in Texas as a temperance worker.

### LABOR BOARD MAKES DECISION

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—The United States Railroad Labor Board today issued a decision on Wednesday's hearings to determine the responsibility of the threatened strike. The findings were:

First: All such disputes must be referred to the board before action is taken.

Second: Any interruption of traffic will be a blow aimed at the peace, prosperity and safety of the entire nation.

Third: Any union going into a strike will forfeit its right and the rights of its members in all existing contracts and lose all benefits according by the transportation act.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—Republican Senate leaders conceded today that there was no possibility of passing the tax revision bill this week. They also indicated that there was little prospect of maintaining a quorum at the night session tonight.

### FOCH RECEIVED AT WHITE HOUSE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—President Harding, acting for the people of the United States, formally welcomed Marshal Foch of France, to the United States today. The leader of the allied armies in the final victorious phase of the struggle against the forces of the central powers, began a busy day at the nation's capital, with a call at the White House to pay his respects to the president. Escorted by a squadron of cavalry and accompanied by Ambassador Jusserand, the French general arrived at the White House at ten o'clock. Great crowds gathered on the driveway through the White House grounds and gave him a vociferous greeting. The president, attended by military and naval aides, received Foch in the blue room. The marshal's program for the day included a call on former President Wilson.

When the marshal arrived at the home of former President Wilson, the aide told him that the ex-president's physician had given orders that it would be inadvisable to receive any visitors. The marshal left his card.

### MEN WILLING TO STAY OUT

HOUSTON, Oct. 29.—A meeting of the general committee of striking trainmen of the International & Great Northern Railroad is called for Monday morning at Houston.

The call was issued by J. D. Frame, the general chairman of the trainmen's brotherhood, who is enroute from the Chicago labor conference to Houston. The message received by the vice-chairman and the local chairman did not state the object of the meeting, but trainmen are of the opinion that it is for the purpose of discussing some settlement of the strike on this road.

Until the strike is officially called off the striking trainmen will remain out. Vice-Chairman Shepperd, of Palestine, said this morning over the telephone to local chairmen here. Shepperd said that the men that are out are still 100 per cent willing to remain out until some satisfactory settlement is reached.

**BOOZE VIOLATIONS**  
 Some of the newspapers are carrying a series of articles on the liquor situation in the United States. The articles are prepared by the N. E. A. Service, and copyrighted by the papers publishing them.

The San Angelo Standard published under a two column scare head one of these booze articles in its Wednesday's issue, saying in the heading of the story: "Rum deluges nation, expose supply source. United States is dry by legislation, but flooded with liquor. Enforcement is a national joke. You can buy booze anywhere in the United States. It is on sale everywhere—and varies from 'Bottle in Bond,' to 'Bottled in Barn' concoctions."

The prohibition law is being violated. There is no question about that. But there is not a law on the statute books that is not being violated—some more than others.

Considering the booze on hand when the law went into effect, and considering the appetite which some people had for booze, and considering the fact that many law enforcement officers were boozers themselves and not in sympathy with this law, and considering the extremes to which a booze fiend will go to appease his appetite, the government has made wonderful progress in banishing booze and booze peddlers and makers.

As answer to her, the boy had run ahead and gotten a rifle at home and said, "I'm going to shoot you." Pointing the gun in the direction of the girls he pulled the trigger, Helen being hit. She ran outside and to the home of a neighbor and medical aid was summoned.

On Monday morning, Oct. 24, pupils and teachers met and decided to subscribe to the Ballinger Daily Ledger, as a means of keeping in touch with what is being done in other schools.

On Tuesday morning, Oct. 25, the trustees announced that school would be closed for the day, out of respect for Mrs. F. M. Wood, who passed away Sunday night, Oct. 23rd.

Under the direction of our able superintendent, R. B. Ingle, great progress is being made in Blanton's Sunday school work. Practically all of the community was in attendance Sunday and much good is expected from this organization.
