LONDON CUTS DISCOUNT RATE

LONDON, Nov. 3.—The Bank of England has reduced the rate of discount to five per cent, bringing it down from five and a half per cent, it was announced today. The fluctuations in the rate established by the Bank of England has been of great interest to the United States, being an indication of the financial situation in Great Britain.

DALLAS, Nov. 3.—A reduction on rediscounts rate by the Dallas Federal Reserve Bank from six per cent to five and one half per cent, was announced today by the reserve board.

MEATS SLUMP ON LONDON MARKET

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—Reports received by the American agricultural commission today from London, state that the London markets are overstocked with meat, and that prices made a slump. This comes at a time when the American cattle market is in a bad shape.

LANKFORD WILL OPEN FACTORY

T. S. Lankford, who recently lost heavily when fire destroyed his mattress factory, is launching out on a larger scale than before, and the old saying that "you can't keep a good man down," is again to be verified.

Mr. Lankford lost seven or eight thousand dollars in the mattress factory fire, and did not have one cent of insurance on the property. He was somewhat knocked out for a time, but got his wits together and is recuperating already.

Mr. Lankford closed a deal Wednesday for the Cady building facing the court house square buying the property from the Cady estate. Before he received a deed to the property he began to make repairs and get ready to install new machinery for another mattress factory, and expects to be operating again as soon as the railroads can bring the equipment and he can get it installed.

Chicago Newspaper Man On a Long Walk Wage

DENISON, Tex., Nov. 3.—Experiences during his jaunt across the country to settle a wager and gain membership in the Adventurers Club of Chicago were told by J. K. Christian, Chicago newspaperman and writer, when he passed thru Denison on his return journey from San Antonio. Christian slept in a Denison hotel one night as the guest of a local newspaperman. The previous night he had slept in a box car in the Hillsboro, Texas, yards.

A jaunt across the country, "bumming" rides with motorists, sometimes sleeping in hotels other times wooing slumber in box cars and barns, begging meals from housewives, or talking them out of men, is the way to see any section of the country, according to Christian.

The Chicago man started on his unique journey Sept. 29, after a wager between Holbrook Blinn, the actor, and Captain Franklin, a writer and adventurer, he said. Christian, according to the terms of the wager, was to cover 3,000 miles in 30 days. He was permitted to accept rides with motorists or on trains. He was to leave Chicago without any money and obtain his lodgings and meals through the generosity of persons with whom he became acquainted. As a reward for his efforts Christian was to become a member of the Adventurers Club.

SONORA RANCHER SHERIFF PUGH IN TAKES OWN LIFE BAD CONDITION

SONORA, Nov. 3.—The body of James G. Barton, age 42, a prominent ranchman of Sutton county and a resident of Sonora for 24 years, was found on the front gallery of his ranch home, eight miles Northwest of Sonora, Wednesday morning. A .45 calibre U. S. automatic revolver near the body and a bullet wound in the man's head told the story of his death.

Barton left nothing to show why he committed suicide, but friends believe that financial difficulties are responsible for his act. Carr Leffel, a young man who was making his home with the Barton family on the ranch, found the body. Mrs. Barton and two sons and daughter spent the night in Sonora, where they were visiting Mrs. Barton's sister.

Young Leffel was the only one at the ranch home with Barton. He stated that Barton retired about nine o'clock, making his bed on the front porch. My Leffel retired about an hour later, to his room in the rear of the house and three rooms removed from where Barton was sleeping. He says that he heard no noise during the night and did not know that Barton shot himself until he walked out on the porch the next morning and found the body.

The latest news from Sheriff Pugh, who was injured when he leaped from a second story window of a hotel Tuesday night, after he had been painfully burned, states that the Brown county officer is in a critical condition, with very little hope for his recovery.

Sheriff Pugh was occupying a room in the Harper Hotel, which was destroyed by fire, and came near burning to death before he escaped by jumping, and it is believed he jumped even to his death, and the injuries sustained in the leap threaten to prove fatal. The Brownwood Bulletin says in the first account of the tragedy:

"The condition of Sheriff R. B. Pugh, who was injured in the Harper fire this morning, was regarded as critical at 3:00 o'clock this afternoon. At about 2:30 he was conscious and appeared to be rallying splendidly, but thirty minutes later attending surgeons were alarmed by an apparent relapse and much anxiety is now felt for him."

"Mr. Pugh suffered concussion of the brain, with the possibility of a slight fracture of the skull; is badly burned about the face, neck and head; has a fracture of the left wrist, and miscellaneous bruises about the body. He is in a local surgical institution."

"Sheriff Bob Pugh occupied the northeast room on the second floor. He has occupied that room for quite a while and it is probable that when he was awakened either by the alarm or smoke entering his room he made a dash for the hall door only to be met by fire and smoke in such volume he could not get out that way. He then attacked the window fastenings as they appear to have been torn and dislocated and plunged thru the wire screen to the ground, a distance of something like fifteen feet, landing on his shoulder in such way as to be knocked unconscious. He was taken to a local surgical institution in an unconscious condition, where it was found that in addition to injuries probably to the spine, he had also suffered a slight fracture of one arm and one leg."

MOTHER AND 4 CHILDREN BURN GETTING READY PROVE HANGING

TOLEDO, Nov. 3.—A mother and four children, three girls and a boy, were burned to death here this morning in a fire which destroyed an apartment house. The dead are: Mrs. Greenburg, mother, Eva, age fifteen; Anna, age thirteen; Leah, age nine; and David, age six.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—Letters and telegrams from persons offering to submit proof of charges that American soldiers overseas were hanged without a trial, were presented in the Senate today by Senator Tom Watson of Georgia, who recently made charges that soldiers were executed by hanging without being given any kind of a hearing or trial.

OIL STRIKERS RETURN TO WORK FIGURES CUT IN GOV. EXPENSE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The Southern California oil field workers who have been out on a strike for several weeks, voted practically unanimously today to accept the recommendations of the district council and return to work, Secretary of Labor Davis was informed today in a telegram from President Yarrow of the oil workers council.

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio, Nov. 3.—More than a thousand coal miners in the Carlinville and Staunton fields went out on a strike this morning before they received work from state headquarters ordering them to remain at work.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The estimated expenditures of the government for the fiscal year 1922 were placed at \$3,940,000,000, or a reduction of \$4,000,000 below the estimate made on Aug. 10th, President Harding informed congress today.

TAX BILL TO PASS BY SATURDAY

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The tax revision fight narrowed down today to three principal issues, soldiers bonus, excess profits, amendments to sales tax and corporation and income tax. The senators in charge of the measure thought that these issues would be disposed of in two days and the bill would be passed by Saturday night at the latest.

The Senate finance committee ordered a report today favorable to the House resolution extending the emergency tariff to Feb. 1st, or until such time as permanent tariff schedules are enacted into law.

ARABS MAKE ATTACK ON JEWS

JERUSALEM, Nov. 3.—The second five persons were killed and thirteen wounded in disorders here today. The disorders included the throwing of a bomb into a thickly settled district.

The police report that the trouble originated in an attempt to attack by the Arabs, the Jewish quarter. The police frustrated the Arab attack and later the principal of the Moslem notables walked through the streets and restored order.

UNDERTAKER RECEIVES A ST. MIHEL SOUVENIR

C. R. Crews is in receipt of a souvenir in the form of a gas tank used by the Germans in the war. The tank holds a gallon of liquid and as the legend goes, the tank was used by the German soldiers in carrying explosive, and every soldier was equipped with one of the little heavy metal tanks, which is constructed in such a way as to be perfectly safe except when the soldier desired to bring it into play. The Americans are said to have captured thousands of these little tanks, and in some way an undertaking supply house got hold of a lot of them and is sending them out to their customers as souvenirs. The little tank comes in handy for the undertaker as he can use it for carrying embalming fluid. An inscription on the tank says, "War Souvenir of the Battle of St. Mihiel, Sept. 12-16, 1918."

EXILE SOVEREIGNS GO TO MADERIA ISLAND

LISBON, Portugal, Nov. 3.—Arrangements have been completed to receive former Emperor and Empress, Charles and Zita, of Austria-Hungary, on the Island of Maderia, according to a telegram received here today from Funchal, chief city of the island.
