The railroad is to cross the Alaska Mountains and connect Seward and Anchorage, on the seacoast, with Nenana and Fairbanks, towns on the territory's interior river system.

Governor Bone went to the "end of the steel" on the southern division of the road and then walked for a distance over the route to be followed. At that time the "end of the steel" was at Mile 306 and only 40 miles separated the "ocean end" from the sections of track being laid at the rate of one and one-third are searched for weapons.

"Unless something unexpected and unforeseen intervenes or weather of unusual severity interferes, the rails will be connected linking Alaska to the interior by the end of the year," the governor said.

Governor Bone praised the work of the Alaska Engineering Commission, which is building the road, and its chairman, Col. Frederick Mears.
