





# AT BLACKWELL

AGED LADY BURIED

Mrs. Zack Boozer, age 81 years and 7 days, died at the home of her nephew, Joe Lindley, Southwest of Ballinger, at eight o' clock Wednesday evening. Mrs. Boozer had been feeble for some time, and death did not come as a surprise to those who had been watching after her.

Deceased was making her home with her nephew, where she has been for many years. She was a sister to the mother of Mr. Lindley, who died a few months ago. Born in Kentucky Nov. 2, 1840, she came to Texas in 1870, and lived at different points before coming to West Texas. Mrs. Boozer made her home at Blackwell up to the time her husband died. She was familiarly known as "Aunt Sookie" Boozer, and had many friends who knew her in the shut in life she had been forced to live for several years on account of her physical infirmities. 


